
Sewing skills, whilst useful are not necessary. Ironing is very helpful, or trimming, or pinning. What's important is that we just do the tasks we enjoy!

2019 ANZAC Day



As in previous years, the South Arm RSL Sub-Branch conducted two services on ANZAC Day - a Dawn Service at Lone Pine. Fort Direction and an 1

Dawn Service at Lone Pine, Fort Direction and an 11 am Service, for the first time, at the Sub-Branch Memorial Wall of Honour.

The Dawn Service was well patronised with well over 800 people arriving in over 350 cars. The morning was fine but very cool with a light but cold wind blowing off the Derwent River. In some ways similar to the conditions the first ANZAC'S encountered in rowing to shore. Following the Dawn Service a number of patrons returned to the South Arm RSL and Community Club for breakfast and toddies. Well done to all the breakfast workers.

The 11am Service at the Memorial Wall of Honour was a first for the Sub-Branch and the well patronised Service ran smoothly. The safety of attendees was paramount in deciding to move the Service from the Cenotaph. With ample parking and other facilities, the move to the Memorial Wall of Honour proved a success. Retired Squadron Leader Tony Lea's ANZAC Day address was outstanding. Tony's recounting of his own real-life experiences in Vietnam and what followed afterwards, providing a solemn reminder of how cruel and unforgiving war can be.

Following the 11am Service, a significant number adjurned to the RSL and Community Club for refreshments and a delicious meal where many stories were embellished. Licensee Tony Sproule and staff are to be commended for their efforts.

The South Arm RSL Sub-Branch Committee especially thank the Venerable Helen Phillips, Tony Lea, the Clarence City Band, 29 Squadron RAAF, 502 SQN Australian Air Force Cadets and Sandford Scouts for their valuable support and contributions.





Opossum Bay & South Arm Coastcare



Coastcare and Fire brigade volunteers combine efforts to remove of Boxthorn Patch at Arm End Nature Recreation Reserve

Our Coastcare group is focusing on the removal of two weed species, Boneseed and African Boxthorn. OBSAC has developed management maps for both weeds and this gives our eradication of these weeds focus and sensible strategic targets.

Towards the end of last year Coastcare successfully removed a large patch of boxthorn at Arm End Nature Recreation Reserve near Shelley Beach.

The Boxthorn plants in the patch had regrown from an older Boxthorn plant which had not been correctly removed, subsequently it was very difficult to remove. Boxthorn seeds are spread by birds and this patch was growing under a large *Viminalis* (white gum) stump, making removal very difficult - slow, prickly and tough going. Coastcare piled the removed Boxthorn material into large stacks. Volunteers from South Arm Fire Brigade and the Tasmanian Fire Service were responsible for burning the boxthorn. Thankyou to Fire Brigade Captain Mark Smith and Val Ansett from the Tasmania Fire service. We currently have stacked large piles of mainly historic Boxthorn at the Glenvar property in Opossum Bay and will be burning them sometime in the next few months.

RITE Win for Spotted Handfish at Planning Tribunal

The Tasmanian Conservation Trust (TCT) and Re Imagine The End (RITE) appealed to the Resource Management and Planning Appeal Tribunal (RMPAT) against Clarence City Council's pipeline approval of the proposed pipeline to supply treated water for the Arm End golf course. During the mediation we negotiated numerous very important conditions which save the Spotted Handfish population at Halfmoon Bay - the pipeline is to be installed:

- at a distance of more than 500m from shore instead of 200m as approved by Council;
- at least 3.5m under the sea bed and into bed rock instead of 1.5m (where the drilling equipment could damage habitat and handfishes);
- all works must be done outside the breeding season of the spotted handfish.

The TCT and I expended significant financial and personal resources to protect one of only ten known populations of the spotted handfish in the world. Most disappointing was that the original approval would have allowed the pipeline to penetrate the seabed in the middle of the handfish population.

Spotted handfish is a rare species due to ecological fragmentation. The population at Halfmoon Bay is now a lot safer.

While the pipeline has received Council approval the State Government has not yet approved the use of the treated water at Arm End Reserve. RITE opposes the use of treated effluent in this public reserve because, in our view, it would mean severe restrictions on public access.

Pipeline Fully Approved

Arm End is pleased to announce that the ten year approval process for the recycled water pipeline form Blackmans Bay to South Arm has concluded and the water pipeline is now fully approved. Construction for the pipeline and the Arm End site should now begin within 3 to 4 months.

The appeal to the Clarence City Council planning permit has been resolved by mediation and Parks & Wildlife has issued their approvals. Arm End Project Manager Craig Ferguson acknowledged appellants Robyn McNicol and Peter McGlone (Tas Conservation Trust) - "Both Robyn & Peter are passionate about the environment at Arm End, as are we."

"This consent agreement gives further clarity as to the depth at which horizontal directional drilling (HDD) will take place within the Handfish habitat areas. Our original pipeline alignment has not changed, rather we have provided expert evidence to support the HDD methodology. Put more simply, the habitat of the Spotted Handfish will, as we have always stated, be 100% protected."

Mr Ferguson said Arm End is continuing to negotiate for a solution to upgrade the water coming via the pipeline from Class B to Class A. "We think the social environmental and economic benefits the shared use water scheme will provide is worthy of support."

"We have a permit to manage the known Aboriginal heritage sites. As we move towards a construction start, we would also like to work with the Aboriginal community to celebrate the site's cultural heritage and landscape ... we are hoping everyone can benefit from the Arm End sites' rehabilitation."



PIPE CLAY coastcare group



500!

500 – that's the number of plants given away at our recent BIG Plant Give Away Working Bee funded by a Clarence Council Coastcare grant. These natives are destined for local gardens but also many along Pipe Clay Lagoon, Cremorne beach dunes and nature strips. Thanks for everyone's efforts, especially the hardworking Cremorne Kids and Wildseed Nursery, Sorell.

One of our top enemies is Marram Grass (*Ammophila arenaria*) - a perennial grass that was introduced into Tasmania from Europe to stabilise coastal dunes.

Why is it a problem? Coastal processes are radically and permanently altered by its presence. Marram grass produces coastal landforms which have completely different shapes to dunes produced by native plants. Large steep faced dunes are characteristic of invaded areas. These steep faced dunes are susceptible to wave erosion which leads to coastal recession. The build up of dunes by marram grass removes sand from the beach, surf and near shore zone and so has serious consequences for the natural dynamics of the coastal environment.

What can we do? Plant local species such as Coastal Wattle, Bower Spinach, Saltbush and Dune Spinifex. These plants, over time, will reduce Marram Grass by smothering it out. Come talk to us at Pipe Clay Coastcare and we can help you out.


