A little history -Convicts in South Arm

James Hatherall, a labourer from Bath was only twenty when he was sentenced to life and was transported to Van Diemen's Land in 1834 for Highway Robbery alongside his older brother William, a skilled painter and glazier. James was described as a man of bad character and stood 5 foot 4 inches tall. His behaviour must have improved as he was recorded as being a diligent scholar. In November 1837 he received 36 lashes for brutally ill-treating a calf belonging to his master. The calf subsequently died and James was ordered not to be let out for service. By 1842 his prospects improved and James was allowed a ticket of leave and within 4 months was given a conditional pardon as a reward for his praiseworthy conduct in endeavouring to save the life of a person from drowning. At the time James was in service to Harbour Master, James Kelly. Now a hero, the convict James was rewarded for his actions with a position of paid employment as a farm labourer and Whaleboat man. James' job as a fisherman is probably what brought him to live at South Arm as he was recorded as a resident with his wife Ann Martin (sources - the electoral, valuation and jury rolls between 1856-61).

Though James and Ann were considered free settlers when they came to South Arm, both had arrived in Van Diemen's Land as convicts. Ann Martin was sentenced to seven years for Assault and Robbery. She arrived from Scotland in 1838 aged just 21, a housemaid and nursemaid who could wash and iron. Ann's record refers to frequent absconding, disorderly conduct and once taking her master's child without leave. In the first 15 months Ann had been before the magistrates on ten charges.

Ann Martin married James Hatherall in 1846. It is not known when Ann and James Hatherall first came to South Arm, although it appears that James had purchased a farm around the late 1850's, which seems to be at the eastern end of the Peninsula, which was later to be farmed by John Potter.

The October 28, 1858 edition of the Courier carried a Notice of the upcoming sale by public auction of a property due to default of payments to a William Linday. The property was described as ' situated and being in the Parish of Ralph's Bay in Tasmania, aforesaid containing about three hundred and fifty acres being part of three thousand nine hundred acres of land heretofore granted to George Henry Blake Gellibrand and bounded as follows that is to say on the south west by a line of eight chains and fifty links south easterly along other part of the said three thousand nine hundred acres of land now or lately occupied by Thomas Foreman thence on the south east by Storm Bay to Goat's Bluff thence on the north-east by a log fence extending: north westerly along another part of the said three thousand nine hundred acres of land and lately sold to George Hickling to Collins Springs thence on the north by a continuation of the said log fence extending, westerly to Ralph's Bay and thence along Ralph's Bay aforesaid to the point of commencement'

Brown Quail Feature[.] at Arm End Reserve



There is a wide range of birds observed by BirdLife Tasmania members at Arm End Reserve. While the reserve is important for a number of shorebird species - Pacific Goldern Plover, Pied Oystercatcher and Sooty Oystercatcher -I think the Brown Quail are perhaps the most fascinating and beautiful of the birds that are regularly seen on a walk. RITE is working to develop a plan to protect and enhance birdlife at Arm End Reserve.

According to BirdLife Tasmania, Brown Quail almost certainly breed at Arm End, but there hasn't been any study of the population size, breeding success or habitat quality.

In late summer, Brown Quail begin to exhibit the characteristic night roosting habits of forming a circle on the ground with tails together and heads pointing out. The exact reason for this behaviour is unknown.

Nests are incubated by both the cock and hen bird, but quail rarely alternate incubation duties. After 22-23 days of incubation, the eggs hatch walnut-sized chicks covered in a natal down, weighing 8 grams.

The peak period for chicks to hatch is late December to early January and chicks are flightless for the first 13 days. At this time it is most important that visitors do what they can to avoid disturbing the chicks by keeping dogs on a leash and not sticking to the walking tracks.

Betty's Story 100



Corbetta (Betty) Eliza Coppin nee Calvert turned 100 on 7th June 2020.

The great granddaughter of Christopher Calvert and Hannah Watson. Her parents Roy and Daisy Calvert lived at 'Carinya' Sandford and Betty along with her two sisters and two brothers helped on their orchard located opposite the tennis courts and Sandford Hall. She attended the local Sandford School growing up.

She was a keen sports-woman (like many a Calvert) and learned to play cricket with her brothers. The tennis courts (still there) were constructed from funds raised by Betty and her friends. She enjoyed tennis. but cricket was her first love. "We never trained nor were we coached - we just turned up on Saturday mornings and played."

Betty would ride her bicycle 16 kms to Bellerive on the gravel road where she'd stay overnight with an aunt before catching the ferry across the Derwent and then by tram from the city to Glenorchy where she'd walk to the Royal Showgrounds to play cricket for the Hobart Women's Cricket Club on Saturday mornings.

Betty has very fond memories as a fast bowler wearing a buttoned shirt to the collar and knee long skirts. In those times-modesty was always important. She played in the only Intra-state Women's Cricket Match in 1940, however, World War 11 stopped any further games. Instead Betty took up nursing duties.

At 25, she married Cliff Coppin and settled on the North West Coast where he worked on a cattle station. Later they moved to Hobart and lived in Lenah Valley. Betty worked as a cook for many years at a number of hotels around Hobart.

Betty and Cliff didn't have any children but she says 'it was a good life with no regrets'. Football, as well as cricket are still a large part of her life - barracking for the Hobart Tigers and also for Essendon.

Due to COVID-19 the planned celebrations have been postponed for a while, however she was able to share her June 7 birthday with her two nieces Ann Bayles and Gaile Calvert as well as residents and staff at Barrington Lodge. She received numerous phone calls, flowers and gifts as well as congratulations from the Queen, Prime Minister and Governor General.
