During my teens my parents acquired a house which had a boat shed - handsome charred vertical board with white trim. My parents had little interest in the shed, or the sea in general. This was fortunate. The boat shed became a hangout for my brother and I, and our friends. The boat shed was neither visible or audible to the house - perfect!

In later life I never had the good fortune to own a boat shed, even now when I live close to a beach. Motivated part by envy, but also a wish to preserve these often temporary structures for local history I decided to photograph various local boat sheds, starting with Glenvar Beach.

This project revealed a range of structures, some

authentic and well-kept, others in ruin. Some have received creative attention, but a few are a tad plain to the point of looking like a local council creation. And some are just astonishing.

Some are loved, others need love. All no doubt have a history.

For those that have discovered the upgraded walking track along the Calverts Hill Nature Reserve between Cremorne and Mays Beach, Lauderdale, you may have observed a recently constructed work of art just before you enter the Calverts Hill Nature Reserve, on the Cremorne side. The work of art, in the form of a seating arrangement, appears to have magically appeared into the existing landscape just off the track. Andrew Patten (Pattex – Patten Excavation & Development) has donated this piece to the community, which rests into the gradient of the hill and looks out, south east, towards Slopen Main and the greater Tasman Peninsula.

Andrew has used local dolerite to produce an area that can be enjoyed by the public to take a rest along the track and take in the spectacular views that the walking track has to offer.

Andrew's/Patten Excavation's philosophy is to work with the existing environment to compliment it and celebrate such spaces.




On Good Friday we commemorate that Jesus loved us enough to die for us, so there's a lot to think about at Easter apart from bunnies and chocolate.




After many years of use at various events the group's marquees have been getting a little worn. Fortunately, replacement has been achieved through a most appreciated Clarence Council Covid



Help save this iconic eucalypt species

A group of plant scientists, eucalypt experts and land managers is working to conserve one of Australia's most endangered eucalypts and they're asking South Arm locals for help.



Morrisby's gum (Eucalyptus morrisbyi) is found at only two sites on Hobart's eastern shore and is iconic in the Cremorne area. Numbers have dwindled to fewer than 50 trees.

The future was looking grim for Morrisby's gum. But from seed orchards across the state the group has collected and stored large quantities of seed at the Tasmanian Seed Conservation Centre. The new seeds offer greater genetic diversity than those used in planting trials previously, with one provenance shown to be less palatable to browsing wildlife. The chances of successfully rearing trees are greater than they used to be.

Project field workers will plant new trees in the tree's known range and in areas predicted to be suitable as the climate changes. They'll also be installing protection for existing plants in wild stands.

The group is looking for landholders in the Cremorne and Lumeah Point areas - but also in the broader peninsula area - willing to help grow this iconic species. They're also looking for helpers to plant and nurture the seedlings as they become established.
