2021 South Arm RSL & Community Club Scholarship awarded

First year carpentry apprentice, Ben Steinbouer, was awarded the 2021 South Arm RSL Community Club Scholarship. Ben is the second apprentice to be awarded the scholarship in seven years,

The \$2,000 scholarship is intended to help young locals purchase text books, tools and other aids to kickstart their further education.

The scholarship has recently been renamed, and now extends beyond first year students. The next round of applications open in November and closes early March 2022. To be eligible, a student's parent / guardian must have been a Club member for a minimum of 12 months.

Karen and Jacqui hit upon a simple idea to help and got straight to work. In their own time and at their own expense they started preparing food parcels. Delivering the parcels fortnightly also enabled them to conduct a simple, but invaluable, welfare check.

Men's Shed update

State Government funds: leading up to the election, local MP, Hon. Jacquie Petrusma, secured a commitment from the Liberal Party for \$53,000 towards our Shed project if they won majority Government. The Premier advised in writing this will be in the next State budget.

This pledge was also matched by the Labor Party, through the work of our local MLC, Sarah Lovell.

A big thank you to Jacquie and all Franklin elected members who have shown strong support and continued interest from the beginning of this project, confirming its value to our community.

Grant applications have been lodged with the Stronger Communities and Building Better Regions Federal programs with results hopefully coming through in the next few months.

Council voted 6/5 to approve our Development Application (DA). Whilst all Aldermen expressed support for a Men's Shed, some voiced apprehension about the site and some local residents also raised concerns.

Therefore, whilst we await the final grant funding results, we'll be exploring other potential sites not previously identified or offered. The DA does still provide a good locatoin if this is unsuccessful.

A BIG thank you to Gai Bath, Joe Pasanen and Touch of the Mo for their fantastic contribution of \$2,000 after the Open Mic night. A wonderful community event AND a great fundraiser! (Check out the April Eastern Shore Sun article featuring our own South Arm Songsters!) Another thank you to the always supportive Laura Aylett and her team at MJ's Hair Design for hosting a fund-raising day.

Harmony support. The Shed continues to receive great financial (and moral) support from Harmony Market as we organise their car park. Thanks to our volunteers, funds are paid to the Shed each month!

Swimrun Wild at Arm End made another thank-you contribution for marshalling their competitors in their second event.

And yet another season is upon us - anyone figured out where the first six months of the year have disappeared to?!


As always our Committee has been busy on a number of fronts and frankly it's awesome when work pays off - like the great news of a Peninsulabased Community Bus and other local projects.

Get on board the **Community Bus!**

We love our Iron Plot Community Garden but this time it's produced big time - it's pollinated \$67,000 for a local bust

Last July, Franklin MP Nic Street met with SAPRA and the Men's Shed to get an update on all our activities. As Nic and I sat chatting in the garden, the topic of a local community bus was discussed.

Whilst work has been done behind the scenes for many months by bus and SAPRA volunteers, it was looking impossible with no community transport funding avenues readily available.

Fast forward to April 2021 and Nic confirmed that if the Liberals were returned to government, \$67,000 would be provided in the State Government's next budget, with no impediment to Men's Shed funding secured by Jacquie Petrusma MP (see page 3).

This is fantastic news for our community. We'll be working on a business model that could involve partnerships with other local groups. There's already discussion across the Peninsula about how a bus could be used by even more groups initially envisaged - which is inspiring to hear.

South Arm Fire **Brigade Update**

The Fire Station at South Arm has gone through some renovations over the last year with all members chipping in to help. We've been lucky enough to update some operational equipment. Our members have been training regularly, participating in local hazard reductions and exercises.

We are lucky to have two new members, and our recent training has focused on skilling them up. This includes a thorough induction into the TFS, basic training on all our equipment, radios, rural navigation, fire behavior plus local risks and hazards. We now have 7 fresh faced highly skilled volunteers to compliment our full crew. Its worth noting that most of our volunteers have seperate full time jobs and it's impressive how much time they also give up to assist the fire service as volunteers.

As we head back into the colder months, its time to think about your home fire safety plan. This may mean changing batteries and testing/vacuuming smoke alarms. Checking electric blankets for any damage before use. Getting chimneys cleaned. Ensuring power-points aren't overloaded. Cleaning filters in dryers and heaters. Basic safety around candles and cigarettes. Perhaps it is as simple as thinking about your escape plan. Can you easily reach your exit in the dark/smoke? Do you have a second exit? Do you have easy access to keys for any window/door that is deadlocked? Have you checked that your home insurance is up to date?

Rather than being fearful of house fires, it is far more useful to be prepared. A working smoke alarm will save your life in a fire. The TFS website has plenty of info on where to install your alarm, as well as simple tips to reduce fire risks in and around your home. Visit http://www.fire.tas.gov.au and their home fire safety page.

Remember to call 1800 000 699 before lighting any outside fire. They will advise if a permit is needed, if the weather forecast is unfavorable, and register the burn to ensure we don't get called out by mistake.

2021 Flu Vaccines -Don't forget!

With all of the focus being placed on COVID vaccines this year, it can be easy to let the annual flu vaccine slip our minds.

Milli and Kim are both Authorised Immunisers and can give you your flu vaccination. No appointment necessary on weekdays between 9am-2pm. Available outside these times by appointment.

This flu vaccine is people aged 10-64 years ONLY.

If you are aged over 65 years, have diabetes, are pregnant, have cardiovascular disease or identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, you are entitled to a free, Federally funded flu vaccine. This can ONLY be supplied by your GP.

The only other thing to remember is that your flu vaccine must be spaced at least two weeks away from your COVID vaccines. As always, if you have any questions please come in and speak to us.

Planning application to extend an 'Urban Growth Boundary'

Clarence City Council has asked the Minister for Planning to approve an application to extend the Urban Growth Boundary at Lauderdale / Sandford.

If granted, this will enable the residential development of the land between the top of Bayview Road and Richardsons Road, raising questions about what effect this will have on traffic volumes in the area and at the major South Arm Highway intersection. There are also likely impacts on capacity of local infrastructure and services such as education.
