End of an era at Calverton Hall

After a combined 45+years of community service, Joan Griffiths & Noela Foxcroft have stepped down from the executive management of Calverton Hall.

Our Peninsula community is indebted to these two amazing women, for the many decades of volunteering contributed. Ensuring the Hall was well managed, well maintained, financially viable, and available for use by the greater community.



In 1951 Joan arrive in South Arm directly from the UK, later marrying 'the boy next door' and has lived in Opossum Bay ever since.

In those days, cricket was very popular on the oval (the toilet area of Calverton Hall was the original cricket pavilion) and Joan fondly recalls how Calverton Hall was the hub for everything of social significance, there being no RSL Club or Community Centre. Dance nights were a regular fixture on the social calendar attended by well over 100 people every time. She remembers soldiers from Fort Direction enjoying the fun with local townsfolk.

Joan's involvement with the informal running of the Hall began back in the 1970's. "Everyone just pitched in and things just got done, without the need for meetings or debate", Joan said. "If ever there was a need to gather people to have a discussion about the Hall it was done at someone's house over a dinner party."

A committee of management was formed in 1993 and was incorporated in 1996. Sadly that same year Mr Alma Calvert, who donated the oval and Hall land, passed away. Joan Griffiths became the President - a role she held until stepping down at the AGM on 28th May 2021.

I thought it was amazing and fun. It was exciting that my Dad was there and I felt happy when he played the guitar. I like nature so I liked being outside (Niina).

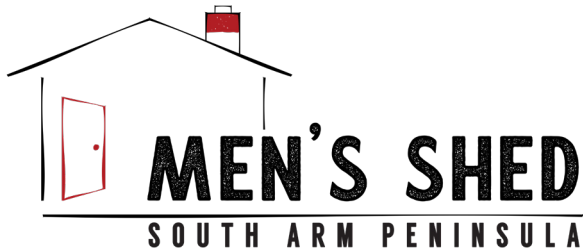
I thought it was awesome. I liked all of the sounds and making music outside. The frost had gone away & it was sunny (Milton).

In July we hosted Darren Clark from Rural Alive & Well (RAW) for an insightful Mental Health First Aid presentation.

FUNDING: the girth of our piggy bank is still increasing, now with \$30K inside. We also have the written commitment from the State Government of a further \$53K and three other funding options are on the table:

- Building Better Regions grant application currently being considered.
- Awaiting response from Clarence Council for an allowance in their 2021-22 budget

End of an era cont'd

Noela arrived in South Arm in 1972. Originally from WA she first took a teaching job with her husband in Smithton in 1955, later "falling in love" with Hobart.

A keen tennis player, Noela's first recollection of her involvement with Calverton Hall was at a gathering to discuss the tennis court use, held not long after her arrival.

In 2000 Noela became the Treasurer for Calverton Hall, around the time "THAT CALENDAR" was created as a fundraiser for the hall. Noela laughingly reminisced she had asked "Who would spend \$10 on a calendar of women in the buff?!" She told the Committee she wouldn't vote against the idea and hoped she'd be proved wrong. Which she was not long after collecting the mail and faced with over 800 letters (including payments) for calendars! The calendar's incredible success and media coverage is now etched in our local history.*

In stepping down from their decades of service as President and Secretary/Treasurer, Joan will now have more time to do her craft, and Noela will have more time to read, spend time with family and generally take it easy. They won't miss ensuring the Hall was stocked and clean ready for use or the late night calls or early morning emails to attend to!

Dignified women that they are, with the community's best interests always at heart, Noela summarises it best - she was heard to say "My interest is that the Hall continues to run well & I'll offer to help with whatever is needed to see that happen."

Thank you, Joan Griffiths and Noela Foxcroft, for your significant service to our community and its many visitors. Your efforts and legacy will be remembered and respected by us.

Changes at South Arm Fire Brigade



After a long and exciting career as a firefighter (professional and volunteer) Mark Smith has handed over the reins (and the red Chief's helmet) so he can spend more time enjoying the finer things in life.

Mark has been the Chief at South Arm for the last five years and during this time has helped grow the Brigade and provide stability for all involved. Mark is still a volunteer at the Fire Station, and we intend to keep him busy. Similarly, Matt Easter has also stepped down from his Officers role, enabling Cliff Munday to step up into the Second Officers position. We thank Mark and Matt sincerely for the huge effort they have put into the South Arm Brigade, and trust that will continue for as long as possible.

Parking at the Fire Station. You may have seen the car park next to the Fire Station has been closed due to Council works. This has led to a shortage of available parking for the boat ramp, and for us when we get a fire call which may lead to congestion come summer. Obviously the fire station driveway is in use 24/7 and we remind people not to park there.

You may have seen some of the **TFS water supply** signs on a few local properties. This is normally a requirement when building in a bushfire-prone area, or you can volunteer. The red W shows us where we can hook up and collect water in an emergency to protect the immediate property. Whilst we do carry 1500 litres of water on our truck, this can be depleted in minutes. It definitely takes more than that to extinguish a house fire. If you display a water supply sign, please ensure your tank has water!

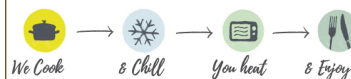

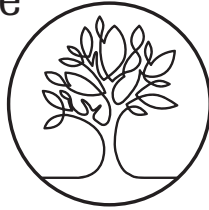
