Bushfire Threat Remains

Extreme conditions across the country have contributed to the recent severe fires in areas that have not experienced this for many years. Lives, homes and properties have been lost and forest and farmland destruction has been extensive. Many fires still continue to burn despite considerable recent rains. Tasmania has not escaped, with several major fires burning close to towns and properties - and there is still a long way to go before the risk eases.

A significant factor in these fires has been the quantity of fuel load. Fuel load is a term for the amount of undergrowth present - including leaf litter, bark and fallen branches. After a fire starts, it requires fuel to feed itself. A heavy fuel load can see a fire rapidly escalate in intensity - even generating its own weather - and become uncontrollable.

Clearing away flammable materials, even in your garden and around the home, will reduce the available fuel & limit a fire's chance to develop into a larger fire.

Taking the following steps can assist to reduce the chance that a fire will start and develop:

- · removal of hazards.
- · clearing of flammable materials,
- · safe use of ignition sources; and
- · general awareness of the risks on your property.

Always have a Home Fire Escape Plan and a Bushfire Survival Plan prepared so that your family know what to do in the event of fire.

Fire Permit Period is in force - seek a permit by calling 1800 000 699.

Total Fire Bans will be declared in high risk conditions.

Always report any fire to the Tasmania Fire Service by dialling 000 so that the nearest available fire brigade will be notified to respond.



TasFire Crews Deployed to Help in NSW and QLD Fires

During November and December volunteer firefighting crews from across Tasmania were deployed as "Strike Teams" to help manage the devastating fires in NSW and Qld.

Three Sandford Volunteer Brigade members, Paul Lawler, Brock Males and Aaron Shaw, joined crews in Queensland for 7 days working in areas of Boonah (Mt Barney areas), Warwick (Maryvale, Hell Hole and Swanfels State Forest) and Grafton.

Our first morning - fire crews were assigned yellow Queensland fire trucks to head out to work. Unlike here in Tasmania, where TFS Engineering Services build most of our trucks to a common specification, no Queensland fire truck is the same.

The landscape was terribly dry. Landowners said they had never experienced such a drought in all their long years on the land. Cattle and horses that were still alive were very undernourished their ribs were showing. Most dams and creeks were empty.

Water for firefighting was very scarce and sometimes we needed to travel 20kms to refill the fire trucks with water.

After our first day of fire management in 39+ degree heat, which included ensuring a thirsty tortoise had enough water and keeping an eye on a family of huge goannas, the day crew returned to base to brief the night shift crew. When they completed their 12 hour stint in the slightly cooler conditions and easing winds, the night crew would return about 7am each morning to brief day crew, have breakfast and jump into the "hot beds" the day crew had just got out of. (We changed the sheets!).

Despite the challenges, working with other Tassie volunteers as well as volunteers & professionals from Qld, NT & New Zealand was a fantastic experience and a chance to put our training into practice. It was a privilege to help these communities and to reciprocate for the times they have helped us in Tassie.

The Fire fighters worked alongside the incredible Salvation Army volunteers who also work all through the day and night at the staging areas and in the field, keeping us fed and watered.

Arm End Public Recreational Area Update

The next few months will see activity increasing to progress the Arm End Public Recreation Reserve project, with all final approvals and permits in place.

Invasive boxthorn is the target of a rigorous removal program in late January with a significant area being cleared. Weed management will continue to be a focus alongside the rehabilitation efforts.

The site office will be installed in early February. Updates will be publicly displayed on site as the project progresses. Our website will also be updated and will closely follow Arm End's transformation.

The first iteration of our onsite nursery is on the priority construction list and we look forward to working with locals, including school students, on this important part of the overall rehabilitation program.

Drilling tests for the water pipeline from Blackmans Bay to Half Moon Bay have been done and final arrangements are being made for drilling to commence at a time outside the Spotted Handfish's breeding season in accordance with our conditions and permits. Consultation and information sharing with local residents is our priority for early February.

We're excited to be custodians of this fantastic part of the Peninsula, making a significant investment in an environmental and community legacy as well as a world class recreational facility.

Being a valued member of the local community is very important to the Arm End project team. Our vision is to be responsible, friendly and supportive of the South Arm community. We will endeavour, where practical, to provide resources and our capabilities to promote and facilitate joint community projects.

We also believe in creating a robust Fire Management Plan for the area, and will work closely with the South Arm Fire Brigade to help bring this to fruition.


Grant funding successes



Some say Club, some say RSL, some say Sub-Branch and then there's the Golf Club... which can all be confusing, so let's sort it out!

A BRIFF HISTORY

19553 A group of local ex-servicemen officially formed the South Arm RSL Sub-Branch in affiliation with the Clarence RSL. Meetings were held at Calverton Hall and membership grew.

 $955 \, \text{A}$ liquor license was approved to the newly named South Arm RSL & Community Club which invited membership from people with no military connection to enjoy the facilities. Land was then bought for purpose-built Club rooms which opened in 1962. This building, with its magnificent outdoor mural, is now known by locals as 'the old RSL' and is home to a café, beauty salon, gym and pharmacy.

The affiliated South Arm RSL Sub-Branch continued its Association and is often referred to as the RSLA.

 $89 \\ \text{With the Club trading strongly, land was} \\ \text{purchased and a golf course built by a} \\$ volunteer work force. New and expanded Club premises were finished in 1995 completing the move.

In the early 2000's the new, independent *Iron* Pot Golf Club was formed. The golf course has been maintained by volunteers from this Club ever since.

TODAY THE PROPERTY IS SHARED BY:

The South Arm RSL and Community Club Inc, (known **as The Club)** which is a social facility offering bar services, meals and entertainment to members and guests with Tony Sproule Catering managing the dinning/bar facilities.

The Iron Pot Golf Club, which provides competition golf and social golf days to members and guests plus maintains the course. This Club has a particularly strong history of volunteering on and around the course.

The South Arm RSL Sub- Branch Inc, which is a Sub-Branch of the Returned and Services League of Australia (Tasmania Branch) Incorporated, offers membership and support to returned service people and their families. It has also built the magnificent Memorial Park.

The 19-hectare site is owned by the South Arm RSL and Community Club Inc which also holds the liquor license for the venue.

A nine strong volunteer committee plus representatives from the Iron Pot Golf Club and South Arm RSL Sub Branch oversees the precinct.
