Southern Tasmania Bush Fires -South Arm + Sandford Brigades Joined the Fight

The recent Huon fires emergency and subsequent management campaign ran for over 74 days. South Arm and Sandford volunteer fire fighters played a valuable role alongside volunteer and career fire fighters from across Tasmania, ACT, NSW, SA, and even New Zealand.

South Arm Brigade -

For 35 of those days, South Arm brigade volunteers travelled to Huonville and Maydena to fight the emergency, and subsequent spot fires, working from the Landcruiser Unit in teams of two.

Tasks undertaken included back burning, supporting dozers constructing fire breaks, assessing dangerous trees, patrolling fire ground perimeters, identifying, describing and extinguishing hot spots.

Members also formed strike teams at Cambridge for 2 days, and up to 10 members patrolled the local area during two High Fire Danger days. The South

Arm Brigade Chief worked at the Regional Operations Centre, Cambridge for 14 days.

The work on the fireground was hard, hot, dirty and often sticky, but rewarding. Members who were able to attend gained valuable skills and experience, improving the capacity of the brigade to respond to local fire emergencies when they occur.

For a small group of available firefighters from the South Arm Brigade, it was a commendable support effort and a valuable opportunity for team building.

ANZAC Day 11 am Service Change of Venue

On Sunday 17 March, 2019 the South Arm RSL Sub-Branch held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) where the Sub-Branch Committee proposed a motion to move the ANZAC Day 11 am Service from the South Arm Cenotaph to the Memorial Park/Honour Wall in the South Arm RSL & Community Club precinct.

The proposal to move the Service from the Cenotaph was primarily based on safety concerns, but other important factors were also considered. Over the past two years the Sub-Branch has struggled with State Government bureaucracy to approve road closure for the duration of the Service, causing disruption to the Service and potential danger to the public. Other important factors discussed at the AGM included the use of the magnificent Memorial Park/ Honour Wall at the South Arm RSL and Community Club including its facilities which include improved parking, flat ground, better seating, toilets and a safer environment to conduct the Service. As noted at the AGM both the Dawn and the Remembrance Day Services have of more recent times been moved from the Cenotaph.

The Sub-Branch advised the AGM it had no plans to seek relocation of the Cenotaph, only to move the 11 am Service.

The motion to move the 11 am Service to the Memorial Park / Honour Wall at the South Arm RSL and Community Club was, with the exception of one member, unanimously carried.

The Sub-Branch Committee looks forward to seeing many residents at its Dawn and 11am Services.

Easter Camping Safety

Campfire restrictions in national parks and reserves state-wide will continue for an indefinite period.

What is NOT permitted:

- Campfires
- Pot stoves and any fuel stove that burn coal, wood or plant material

What is permitted:

Provided the ground is cleared for 3m around the stove, and there is a water source of at least 10 litres for firefighting – then the following are permitted to be used with caution:

- · Gas stoves and gas barbecues
- Liquid fuel stoves shellite and methylated spirits

Arm End - Project Update

Unfortunately, we are again headed back to the planning tribunal, despite an 8-3 vote in favour of our irrigation water solution by the Clarence City Council.

Our pipeline has now been approved by the Clarence and Kingborough City Councils and we are waiting on final approvals from Parks & Wildlife and the Crown.

The high-grade Class B irrigation water currently proposed is very safe and used widely around the State (eg Cornelian Bay sports ground). However, our engineers are looking at the feasibility of treating the water further, by means of a UV process and microfiltration to significantly increase the quality of the water from Class B to Class A, opening up further opportunities for agricultural and residential users.

The use and application of the water is very strictly managed by State, Federal and individual user plans.

The pipeline should provide scope for increased economic, environmental and social benefit throughout the South Arm Peninsula, with no costs or impact to those who choose not to connect to it.

Currently, this water is pumped into the Derwent River, where it may be negatively impacting the river.

Influenza - some basic facts

Influenza, commonly known as the flu, is caused by a virus which spreads easily through infected droplets in the air and by hands carrying the virus. In some cases severe illness and complications can develop.

Because the flu virus is constantly changing, it is necessary to get vaccinated every year. Each year, the flu vaccine will protect against the strains of flu virus which are most likely to circulate over the winter period. Vaccination in autumn allows time for immunity to develop before the flu season starts.

People at high risk

The flu vaccine is free for people at high risk:

- People aged 65 years and over have the highest risk of complications associated with seasonal flu.
- All Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People from 15 years of age as respiratory diseases are major causes of preventable sickness and death in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Pregnant women

The flu vaccine is recommended for pregnant women and can be safely given during any stage of pregnancy. Pregnant women are at higher risk of severe complications associated with the flu virus.

Medically at risk

People with some existing medical conditions are at increased risk of complications from flu. These include: heart disease, severe asthma, chronic lung condition, chronic illness requiring medical follow-up in the past year, impaired immunity, or diabetes.

Approximately 2,800 Australians die every year either directly from the seasonal flu, complications due to the flu, or pneumonia. Flu vaccinations are the single most effective action to help fight the spread of flu.

Sandford Fire Brigade -

Sandford Fire Brigade Fire Fighters were required to be part of a Strike Team based at Cambridge on two occasions. The Strike Teams are placed on high alert with another 5 Strike Teams and their appliances. Strike Teams are sent to any new outbreaks on those high fire danger days and their aim was to tackle the fire outbreak hard and fast. Backup for Strike Teams comes from the local Brigades in the areas of the fire outbreak and, if available, aerial support.


Geeveston / Upper Huon / Dover Fires - 2 fire fighting crews, made up of 5 crew members each, travelled south to work 12 hour shifts - 8am to 8pm.

Access for our big fire truck was limited in the terrain we were assigned to, so we were water carting and filling up smaller fire trucks in addition to putting out hot spots, asset protection and monitoring fire behaviour.

Our 3rd officer, Steve, also teamed up with the South Arm Brigade in their light tanker to continue assistance on 2 additional days.

Easter and Food Safety

Part of the fun of the Easter long weekend is catching up with family and friends and helping out by sharing dishes at celebratory events. But preparing food for a lot of people can be risky especially at this time of the year when several generations get together. Here are some tips to avoid giving a gift your friends and family don't want!

Avoid temperature abuse:

Temperature abuse is the major cause of food-borne illness at parties and functions. Remember to minimise the time food stays in the temperature danger zone (5°C to 60°C).

Keep hot food hot – use the top of the stove or an oven turned down to just below 100°C.

Keep cold food cold – make sure the fridge is still operating at or below 5°C even though you've loaded it with extra food.

Cool food quickly – once the steam stops rising, cover the food and put it in the fridge. You can hasten the cooling process by pre-cooling the hot food in its container in a sink of iced or cold water or putting it into shallow containers.

The following foods can stay out of the fridge for up to 4 hours in total but must be thrown out after that:

- cooked meats, deli meats, patés etc. should be left in the fridge until you are ready to eat them
- salads especially cooked vegetable, pasta or rice salads (whether they contain meat or not)
- · ready to eat seafood
- · dips and other ready to eat foods
- · cream, egg and custard based desserts


















Mythbusting Bushfires

Myth - There'll be plenty of warning before I'm in danger.

Fact - The rate of fire spread depends on a number of factors including wind speed, fuel load, fuel type, fuel moisture, air temperature, humidity, terrain.

The rate of fire spread in undisturbed, flat to undulating grasslands can reach more than 20 km/hr in certain conditions and up to about 12 km/hr in forest areas. Burning bark, twigs and leaves carried upwards in convection columns can cause new fires that are also known as spot fires. kilometres ahead of the main fire.

Fires travel faster uphill, as flames can more easily reach new fuel, and this effect is increased if the slope is aligned with the wind direction. For every 10 degrees of uphill slope, fires travel twice as quickly.



BONESEED BLITZ - North and east of Denn Hill, Opossum Bay continues - this year we want to complete the eradication of this Boneseed infestation. This is a big task and we need many volunteers.
