FROM THE HARVEST MARKET And the winner was ...

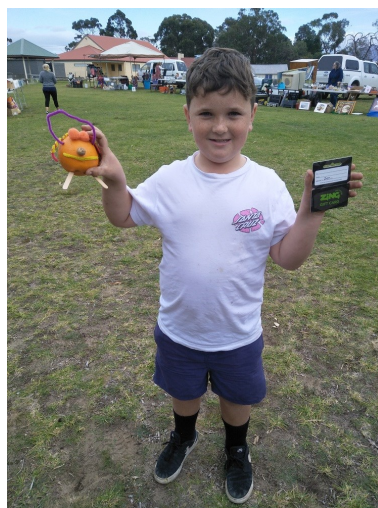

ARM END and WATER

Arm End is extremely pleased to announce that a water “solution” for the rehabilitation, revegetation and irrigation programs for the Arm End Public Playground has been achieved.



At a recent community meeting, we explained to residents and other stakeholders that we will use recycled water, piped under the Derwent River from the Blackman’s Bay water treatment plant and we will make the water available to whoever wants it ... farmers and other South Arm and Opossum Bay residents.

Arm End has support and has signed an MoU with TasWater. Water will likely be free, with the only cost to users to be proportional to volume use fees for pipeline upkeep and maintenance. Arm End will pay for of the majority costs. The infrastructure solution we have decided upon follows the same philosophy as the one developed by the Clarence City Council and Tas Irrigation to irrigate the Coal River Valley, now regarded as perhaps the best pinot noir-producing region of Australia.

We have the opportunity to make good farming land on South Arm great ... to grow grapes, proteas, garlic, turf and anything else our farmers want to grow.

FISH FARMS

Tassal, Huon Aquaculture and Petuna Seafoods each have proposals which will total 1,600 hectares (16,000,000 square metres) of farming zones in Storm Bay. The closest to South Arm is the Petuna Proposal, 430ha, approximately four kilometres south east of Betsy Island.

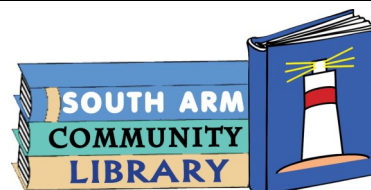
We are a small group of South Arm/Sandford residents that have growing concerns about the proposed extension of fish farming in Storm Bay.

For the most part we did not become aware of the proposals or the approval process early enough to review the proposals and provide submissions to the Planning Authority within the times set out by the Planning Authority. Through discussion with other locals, beach users and boating people it seems that a large proportion of these people are not aware of the proposal. They are certainly not aware of the approval process and are genuinely shocked when the 'adaptive management' process for the proposed developments is explained.

While we understand that salmon farming has become an important part of the Tasmanian economy we also understand that the medium and long-term impact of fish farming in an area like Storm Bay is not yet understood, either by the regulators or the industry itself. Recent events at Macquarie Harbour and what looks likely to be similar outcome at Oakhampton are clear evidence of this.

To us, who live in and around Storm Bay, the risk of environmental damage is far too high and the 'adaptive approach' entirely unacceptable. We are not scientists, but people with appreciation and some understanding of Storm Bay and the surrounding beaches, reefs, swells and currents.

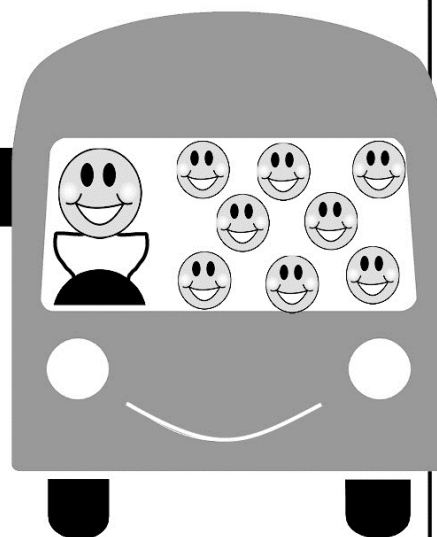

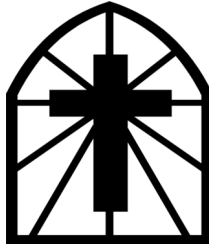

Potential sale of St Barnabas Church at South Arm

As you are probably aware, St. Barnabas church buildings and land has been earmarked for sale to raise money for the Anglican Diocese of Tasmania's proposed Redress scheme (see link to more info below).



This has caused a lot of concern amongst not just the local church-goers but the wider community, especially with respect to the cemetery.

There is a team of dedicated people (from a variety of perspectives) working in the background on this issue and once the relevant facts and possible options for purchase and continued use have been gathered, a public meeting will be held.

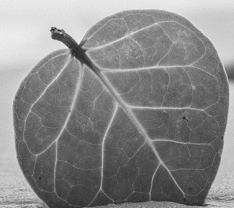

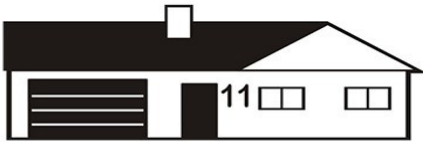

BUSHFIRE risk over - but not out!

Time again people say 'It wont happen to me!' however as we have experienced lately that extreme weather events do happen and affect us all. Disaster preparedness is very important and should be a consideration for your safety; just like wearing a seat belt in a car.

Tasmania Fire Services community fire safety program, the Bushfire-Ready Neighbourhoods (BRN), works in high bushfire risk areas for 2 year periods to engage residents in identifying risks and working through plans for preparedness to mitigate these risks to be a safer community to bushfire and other emergencies.

Since 2016 BRN has held a number of local community bushfire safety engagement activities in the South Arm Peninsula and there have been a few bushfire-ready articles that have been published in the newsletter. All resident communications highlight key preparedness messages; "Know your risk. Make a plan."

Local BRN community engagement about bushfire preparedness has occurred at the Clifton Beach Surf Club, South Arm Markets and the South Arm Peninsular Residents Association. Visits engaging with parents with young children have occurred at the Cremorne playgroup and South Arm Primary School Launching into Learning. BRN visited the Pop-up Café at Cremorne bowls club to chat with local residents. More formal presentations about local bushfire risk were offered at the Bushfire-Ready Forum held at the South Arm RSL where over 120 people attended to hear and discuss local related risks and issues, and a disaster emergency preparedness workshop for horse owners was provided at the Sandford Hall.

In 2017 identification and assessments of local places of last resort, 'Nearby Safer Places' were undertaken for the South Arm/Opossum Bay and Sandford/Cremorne/Clifton Beach Community Bushfire Protection Plans. The plans were launched in September at Opossum Bay and South Arm and in October at a Bushfire-Ready EXPO in Sandford.

During these winter months prepare yourself and your property in readiness for next bushfire season. From June to September you could be;

- Clearing flammable items/ liquids and rubbish away from your home including moving woodpiles.
- Ember proofing the gaps of buildings that are greater than 2mm with metal screens or putty.
- Regularly cleaning the gutters, cutting the long grass and getting rid of dead branches, leaves, twigs and bark.

- Write a bushfire survival plan and make sure you have considered contingencies of varying factors, such as a leave early plan even though you plan to stay and defend.

Remember for the upcoming bushfire season - six steps to a safer summer:

- Understand and practice fire safe landscaping and gardening
- Prepare a Bushfire Survival Plan that includes contingencies
- Understand weather and your environment should a bushfire occur
- Know your risk – know your Nearby Safer Places as places of last resort
- Check the TFS website regularly in bushfire season (fire.tas.gov.au). Don't rely on warnings. Fires can happen quickly without warning. Even if it is not a day of Total Fire Ban, think of the weather conditions and use common sense when doing anything that could start a fire and
- Some bushfires are started by arsonists. If you see anything suspicious call the police (000).

On reading the proposals, this would seem to be lacking in the submissions by the proponents of the developments. We believe that the Government's approach and the associated 2030 growth plan needs to change to allow for better consultation with the community and support an independent scientific study that can provide community and government supported guidelines for the sustainable use of Storm Bay for all Tasmanians.

THE BEE BOOK – Fundraising and launch update

Each February, our local market hosts the Honey and Bee Market. This market aims to raise awareness about bees and the critical part they play in the food chain as pollinators. Did you know that 71% of crops for human consumption rely on pollinators? And that the humble bee plays a major role as a key pollinator for food crops?

At this year's Honey and Bee Market, a raffle was run to kick-start fundraising efforts for The Bee Book—a book written by children, for children. We raised an amazing \$200 in one morning!

The project was initiated by Jenni McLeod (South Arm resident and Beautiful Girls Honey) in partnership with the Goodwood Community Centre, Story Island Project and the Tasmanian Junior Beekeepers. The project was started as a living memorial for Mr Fred House, a long-term Goodwood resident and beekeeper of 93 years. During the project the children took part in facilitated education, writing and drawing workshops to create the book. This included an editorial session and a visit to the Tasmanian Junior Beekeepers' apiary. As a proudly Tasmanian project, the book is now with the first class local publishing house, 40 South Publishing and it will be printed here in Tasmania too. Along with producing young published authors, the funds raised from book sales will all go towards projects dedicated to future proofing bees.
