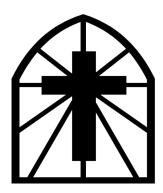

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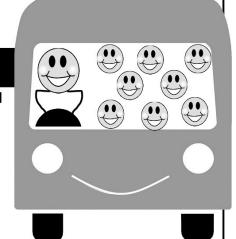

TANGARA TRAIL

Tangara is an Aboriginal word meaning "Lets get away together".

It's easy to take the Tangara Trail for granted. There's a lot of it for a start! You can wander on to it and not even realise as there's so many access points. It's a fabulous asset for the community that is overseen by a management committee that liaises with the Clarence City Council and the Parks and Wildlife Service for matters of safety, maintenance, extension and continuity of the trails.

The Trail comprises an extensive network of Public Right of Ways and public open space areas between residential subdivisions, grassy road verges, and formal and informal tracks and trails through bushland and along the coast. The network now extends from the Cambridge area, Seven Mile Beach, throughout Action Park, Lauderdale and Sandford almost reaching South Arm.

In the 1970s it was originally conceived to create a network of safe and easily accessible trails for local horse riders between rural-residential subdivisions, and within nearby bush and coastal land. And although horse riding is still at the heart of the trail it is used extensively by walkers, dog walkers, and mountain bikers.

We are currently attempting to provide education to trail users on sharing the trail, especially for those who are unknowledgeable around horses, to help eliminate any incidents. Signage throughout the trails shows the order of the user priority. This is for safety. Horse riders have right of way, walkers give way to horses, cyclists give way to both horse riders and walkers.

We emphasise that the Tangara Trail is a recreation trail. The RACT states "A person who is riding a horse or in charge of livestock that has become restive or alarmed may direct an approaching driver, rider or pedestrian to stop and remain stationary until the horse or livestock has become settled and it is



safe for the driver, rider or pedestrian to proceed".

Occasionally various clubs may use a section of the trail for an event. (Running, rogaining, endurance, part of a triathlon etc.). We ask to be advised of this so it can be shared on social media and our website. Other users then have the opportunity to avoid this area on that day/time if preferred.

We are endeavouring to provide some primary and secondary hubs for users to begin their adventures. A primary hub has already been established at 32 Acton Court, Acton Park. This 10 acres comprises of float parking, horse yards and water. A track leads to a fantastic view over Seven Mile Beach and beyond, and forms a short loop through a revegetated area.

The Tangara Trail is a valued asset for all users, but particularly for horse riders, as Clarence is the only municipality that facilitates this unique recreational horse riding experience.

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OPOSSUM BAY & SOUTH ARM COAST-CARE

Over the last 18 months Opossum Bay and South Arm Coastcare has been busy controlling boneseed and

removing select patches of Cape Leeuwin wattle, small African box thorn plants and Cottoneaster (a small tree with bright red berries). We alternate working bees between Opossum Bay and South Arm, working in reserves, council land and assisting residents with removal of weeds from their land.

This autumn-winter has been great for planting. We have focused our planting in areas where weeds have been removed. We have planted on the southern tip of the new Blessington Street Track, including many Correas, Casuarinas and grasses. The bank on South Arm Road near the



memorial has been planted with *Correa alba*, running postman, grasses and some prickly box. Other areas planted include the northern end of Halfmoon Bay, adjacent to the Algona Street car park.

Coastcare remains active and engaged in the Arm End development proposal. At a public meeting in April this year the community was told that a revised Weed Management Plan for Arm End had been completed by the golf course proponents and the Parks and Wildlife Service. We are currently waiting for this to be forwarded. Our offer to provide information on new weeds and weed removal was not accepted by the Developer. It is important that mapping is up to date and accurate data concerning weeds is essential. For example, the African boxthorn which is taking over on the northern tip at an alarming rate. Earlier this year a token effort was made by the proponent to poison a hand full of large boxthorn and spray smaller isolated plants. An inspection in mid-July shows that all sprayed boxthorn have recovered. We are happy to report that most of the serrated tussock and gorse has been sprayed by the proponent but some gorse has been missed and is now flowering.

The Coastcare schedule is pinned up at the South Arm and Opossum Bay stores and posted on our Facebook page (search Opossum Bay & South Arm Coastcare), if you are interested in joining in. All equipment and gloves are provided. Thank you to our small dedicated group of volunteers.

The generosity of both local businesses and the local community, and the hard work of the scouts and their parents on the night was incredible and ensured a fun and successful night was had by all.

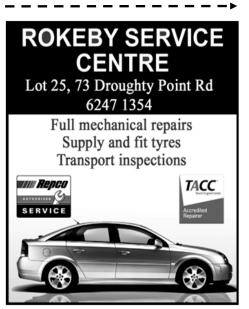


CREMORNE PLAYGROUP

Cremorne Quiz Night Sat 3 Nov @ the Bowlo



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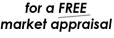
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ON THE AGENDA WITH SAPRA

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MY HEALTH RECORD

What is a 'My Health Record'?

By the end of 2018, every Australian will have a My Health Record unless they choose not to have one.

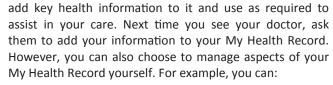
A My Health Record is an online summary of your health information. It can be accessed at any time by you and your healthcare providers.

This means that, whether you're visiting a GP for a checkup, or are in an emergency room following an accident and are unable to talk, healthcare providers involved in your care can access important health information, such as:

- an overview of your health uploaded by your doctor, called a Shared Health Summary. This is a useful reference for new doctors or other healthcare providers that you visit
- hospital discharge summaries
- · reports from test and scans, like blood tests
- medications that your doctor has prescribed to you
- referral letters from your doctors.

You control your record

You don't have to do anything to start benefiting from having a My Health Record. Your healthcare providers can



- add notes about your allergies and adverse reactions, an advance care plan or custodian details
- set access controls to restrict who can and can't see your health information
- review your own health information, seeing everything your healthcare providers can see
- set up SMS or email notifications so you know when a healthcare provider first accesses your record.

How do I access My Health Record?

You can access your My Health Record from any compatible computer or mobile device with an internet connection, as well as using authorised mobile apps.

How can I opt out?

If you don't want a My Health Record, you will be able to opt out of having one created for you during 16 July to 15 October 2018.

RECIPE - CHICKEN PHO (SERVES 4)

250g dry rice-stick noodles

8 cups chicken stock

2 cooked chicken breasts finely slice (or left over roast chicken shredded does the job)

Mint leaves and basil leaves - half a cup each

100g mung bean sprouts

2 red chillies - deseeded, finely sliced (more if you like a hit)

Fried shallots - half a cup

Lime wedges and fish sauce to serve



- Put noodles in a large bowl, cover with warm water. Allow to soak for half an hour, or until soft, then drain and divide in to four bowls. Divide chicken breast between the four bowls.
- 2. Pour stock into a large saucepan and bring to the boil reduce heat and pour over each prepared bowl.
- 3. Throw in everything else and serve with lime wedges and fish sauce to suit your taste.
