What began as an offer to "hang some old photos" has developed into a fascinating insight into our history and characters from the mid-1800s including the Calvert, Musk and Alomes families and convicts, through to more recent times including the renowned Calendar Girls, ANZAC Days, community achievements and other activities.

Whether you're a new resident or long-term local, we hope this Room and the Centre, will show where your community has come from, its people, its resilience and sense of place. After all, our history is our stories and these bring us all together. History isn't just 'old stuff', it's the people and places that were, and still are, the fabric of our community. 

Opossum Bay Local Swims English Channel

In August 2019, I become one of the oldest swimmers in history to swim the Channel, at a spritely 63 + 10 months!

The shortest route from England and France might be 30km but strong tides and currents mean it's impossible swim in a straight line. The average time is about 14 hours so I was relatively slow at 15 hours, 38 minutes, over 59km, but plenty take longer.

My swim started at 2am (dictated by tides) with the first 4 hours in the dark. My wife Kerry, sister Laura and coach Chloë McCardel, were a fabulous support crew on my escort boat 'Pathfinder', keeping up warm energy drinks, gels or Sustagen every 30minutes. The water was 17.5 degrees and not once did I think about cold or feel cold.

The first few hours through the night were hard mentally. I developed a sore shoulder and started to obsess the swim would end. At about eight hours Chloë ticked me off and told me to pick it up or things would get grim. I had a talk to myself and forgot the shoulder. The next few hours were steady until at about 10 hours when I was in danger of being swept into the Calais commercial port. I had another self pep-talk and focused on strong strokes, keeping 62 stokes/minute for the last 5 hours. The ignominy of being pulled out petrified me! I made it, landing on a beach near Sangatte, 2km south of Calais. Phew!

Living at Opossum Bay has been a great training as the summer water temperature is very similar to the English Channel. All those laps of South Arm Beach and Glenvar Beach really paid off! I appreciated the dozens of Facebook messages, emails and texts I received and it spurred me on. Thank you.

Fire Permit Period Declared

The Tasmania Fire Service declared a Fire Permit period from 31 October 2019 until further notice.

With the threat of summer bushfires fast approaching we should all be working to ensure unwanted fires don't happen and that hazards which can contribute to fire spread are eliminated. Fire can still be used responsibly for land management purposes and other uses such as barbecues, campfires, for heating & for disposal of garden waste.

As a way of managing the use of fire, the Tasmania Fire Service may declare a Fire Permit period when the danger of bushfire is considered high. Other regulators such as the Environmental Protection Authority and local councils may issue directions on the type of materials that can be burnt, avoidance of smoke as a nuisance and the limitation of pollution.

Only the following fuels may be legally burnt:

- · Unpainted, untreated and uncontaminated wood
- Vegetation and vegetative waste
- Paper, briquettes and fuel pellets
- Coal, charcoal and peat

The burning of synthetic materials, metal, tyres,

paint, plastics, building waste, household waste and anything not mentioned above is an

offence against environmental regulations.

People intending to light a fire for burning vegetation or for a similar purpose must obtain a permit. It is an offence not to have obtained a Fire Permit before commencing the burn. Contact the Tasmania Fire Service on 1800 000 699 for information about obtaining a Fire Permit and to register your burn.

Before lighting any fire, regardless if you have a permit, you must consider the weather. Wind speed, wind direction and relative humidity must all be considered. Also, the weather conditions can change while the fire is burning so be very aware of the forecast weather conditions as well.

When the risk of bushfire is considered significant, the Tasmania Fire Service may declare a Total Fire Ban - this will override any Fire Permit already issued.

Save St Barnabas Update

The Diocese has provided the timeline and requirements for sale of St Barnabas Church and Cemetery to the community as follows:

- A financial proposal including evident of funds is required by 1 February 2020.
- · The Diocese will take into consideration this is a community purchase with the intention to keep St Barnabas as a place of worship.

We currently hold around \$35K in cash & pledges. For reference, the Dunalley Church is for sale - offers over \$140K. To make St Barnabas compliant, it's estimated around \$40k of immediate work is needed.

ACTION NOW:

Significant fund-raising efforts are required NOW, particularly pledges & large donations. If you can contribute, please see website for how to donate or contact us.




