St Barnabas Church to be sold to our community!

Wonderful news - our 129 year old church will become the *Community Church of St Barnabas - South Arm*.

A recent decision by the Trustees has cleared the way for the sale of the church to proceed. A new contract is expected from the Diocein Redress Team in coming weeks. St Barnabas will become a community church as the community had hoped.

Meanwhile the church will continue with regular 10am Sunday services, where the congregation is slowly growing. After the service there is always the opportunity for some lively conversations in the Hall – a good way to make new friends over a cuppa.

As it will now soon be OUR church, we hope the community will rise to the occasion and use the church and the hall. Both will be available for hire and of course for all the usual rites of Baptisms, Marriages and Funerals.

Our Bus is on its way!

We've shared a community bus with Risdon Vale and Warrane/Mornington Neighbourhood Houses for a decade but with the bus garaged at Risdon Vale and availability limited, time came for us hit the road alone. With a growing population and so many community groups on the Peninsula that could benefit from access 7 days a week, SAPRA has been working on securing our own bus for two years.

As reported in South Arm Peninsula News earlier this year, a conversation between President Kerry Scambler and Nic Street MP in the Community Garden resulted in a Liberal commitment eight months later to fund our bus. Labor matched it and our community couldn't really lose!

Funds have now been received and a small working group (Bob Blaauw, Bree Hunter, Kirstie Judd, Don Nicoll and Kerry Scambler) has done the groundwork to ensure the bus is delivered in early 2022.

Community groups and organisations across the Peninsula have/are being contacted to see if and how often they anticipate using the Bus.

Active (walking/biking etc) and social/special interest groups are also invited to use the Bus – contact Bree to register your interest.

SAPRA also plans a regular resident service to Rosny Park and social outings to different destinations.

We are beyond excited about the possibilities our new bus opens up for our community!



Arm End Reserve update - RITE



The golf course proposal for Arm End has had a surprising development. Arm End now has three connected projects – Arm End Golf course, a pipeline from Blackmans Bay to supply water to the golf course and a water treatment plant to be upgraded from Class B to Class A water. This appears to be a plan to take what was a golf course proposition for Arm End Reserve to an agricultural irrigation proposal for South Arm peninsula. It is ironic considering Arm End was reserved for its natural and cultural qualities. Reserving the land was a significant win for the environment and Aboriginal Heritage and to restore this beautiful fragile tip of our peninsula after nearly 200 years of grazing.

The Australian government via Senator Jonathon Duniam announced on 11 August 2021 that \$5 million from an irrigation funding program was "committed" to the South Arm water pipeline. It is unsure what the funds are for and whether the funding has been allocated yet - the minister said it was "committed". We have written to the minister to ask what the funding is for, the treatment plant or the pipeline or both, and whether the funds have been allocated or are dependent on approvals. We have received no answer.

The waste water treatment plant application has been with the Environment Protection Authority since July 2020 but there has still been no public comment process and approvals are months away if it ever occurs. The EPA web site was recently updated and includes a clear statement that the Class A water is intended to be taken to South Arm recreational area i.e. for the golf course. The upgrading of the water quality is for the benefit of the golf course. The EPA notes it will also assess the "application of re-use water for the South Arm recreational area". This is important because the use of the irrigated water was not considered by the Council and the EPA consultation process is the community's first opportunity to make comments on the impact of irrigation on the reserve.

Water solution SOUTH ARM PIPFI INF update



South Arm Pipeline Pty Ltd has welcomed Federal Government funding of \$5 million to enable the pipeline project to proceed. This funding was assessed exclusively on the benefits to the regional agriculture of South Arm.

The Arm End Public Recreation Reserve project (Arm End) has, through the need to find suitable golf turf irrigation and revegetation water, developed the South Arm Pipeline concept over the last four years. It will deliver 2ML of very high quality (but not potable) water daily to the Peninsula - 76% to the community and 24% to Arm End. Currently 14ha of the region is under irrigation the pipeline will allow a total of 350ha to be irrigated.

The pipeline will provide water to the western part of the South Arm Peninsula, including interested local farmers and rural landowners, the Iron Pot Golf Club and the South Arm RSL & Community Club. We will also provide access points for the South Arm Volunteer Fire Brigade.

Our goal is that this Tasmanian-first project, taking recycled water and converting it to Class A, will be entirely accessible for community and agricultural use. The pipeline will also transform the Arm End Public Recreation Reserve into a world class destination to enjoy walking, cycling and with potential Aboriginal Heritage interpretation – along with a pretty good public access golf course

The South Arm recycled water scheme is intended to operate on a no commercial return basis. South Arm Pipeline Pty Ltd will construct and manage the pipeline operating on an operational and maintenance cost-recovery basis (ie. no commercial profit). All users will pay proportionally to the volume of water they take.

The pipeline is expected to take most of 2022 to complete and Arm End site development construction will continue through to end of 2023. In the meantime, we continue to look after and manage the land at Arm End.

Please feel free to connect with us for more information. After years of robust planning and approvals we are getting closer to a construction start.

South Arm Fire Brigade

The Spring rains throughout the State mean a late and unusual fire season, with little time to conduct hazard reduction burns, and rapidly growing grass and bush (as anyone who has to mow knows). TFS will have additional aircraft available, but it will always be volunteers on the ground that actually extinguish the blaze. At South Arm we've recruited 4 new members (3 of them under 20 years old!). This highlights what an amazing community we live in, and the strength of character in our youth.

We have had a relatively quiet year so far. A few car

accidents, escaped burns and smoke investigations. We've been out providing advice on smoke alarms, bushfire plans and water tanks at the market etc.

Remember, if you see a fire, call 000. I've seen a few posts on Facebook about fires and accidents which is not very helpful! The only way to get our group of well trained volunteers to the fire is via 000.

Fire permits, call 1800 000 699. They will tell you if you need a permit, if the weather forecast is unfavourable, and also register the burn to ensure we don't get called out by mistake.


