

South Arm Fire Brigade's youngest volunteer

Meet Will Malcomson, one of South Arm's newest volunteers. After a local recruiting drive to search for new members, Will joined with three others and commenced his training six months ago. At 18, he is also South Arm's youngest member – ages range from 18 to 80.

The induction and basic training focused on developing team skills, practical firefighting techniques, ladders, ropes, map reading and communications. This culminated in practical scenarios to test each member's abilities to safely deal with an emergency incident.

Now that the basic training has been completed, Will joins volunteers from around the State in three intense training weekends to become proficient in bush firefighting, urban firefighting and pump operations. Only then a volunteer is ready to respond to emergencies unsupervised.

Will joins a wonder team of local volunteers at South Arm dedicating a small amount of time to protect our local community. With a range of experience from builders, engineers, students, teachers and retired professionals, there is something truly unique about a volunteer team. The diversity of knowledge and skills leads to a very professional outcome, and great conversations in the fire station afterwards.

Have your say on lobbying in Tasmania

The Integrity Commission is seeking your input into a review of Tasmania's lobbying system and how it might be improved.



Integrity Commission Chief Commissioner Greg Melick said, 'The Tasmanian community needs to have confidence that public administration and government decisions are made fairly, transparently, and in the public interest. The submissions we receive will inform recommendations to improve accountability of lobbying practices and associated decision-making within Tasmania. Submissions can be made from now until 30 June, 2022.'

Lobbying is the process of seeking to influence government decisions on behalf of special interests. It can be a healthy part of a democracy ensuring different views are represented in policy, legislation and budgeting, but can also be a source of distrust in government when more powerful interests are seen to have the most influence. Oversight through tools like a public lobbyist register, can be a way of increasing transparency and accountability.

Mr Melick said, 'We are interested to hear people's experiences of lobbying and their thoughts on Tasmania's current model of lobbying oversight. You may be a lobbyist or someone who has been lobbied, or have been affected by public decision-making that resulted from lobbying. We hope to hear from anyone interested in this vital democratic process.'

How to make a submission - Visit www.integrity.tas.gov.au for a submission form with discussion prompts to guide submissions from the community. You'll also find a consultation paper that summarises the relevant issues, plus a full research report for those interested in understanding how lobbying, and lobbying regulation, works in Tasmania, across Australia, and internationally. Submissions close 30 June, 2022.

On the move

For the past two years the South Arm Peninsula Men's Shed has focused on raising money and seeking approval to build on a site at the Calverton Oval. However, it became increasingly apparent that building at this site created more difficulties than benefits. The style of building resulting from Council and community concerns became too expensive. Being on Council land also required us to have a lease which proved to be overly restrictive to our needs.

An appeal to the RSL and Community Club for land to build on was met with great enthusiasm and we are now fully focused on establishing a "Shed" on the Club site. Members have endorsed with their full support this move which has cost benefits and as well provides us with far greater amenity than our previous site.

Our build at the RSL and Community Club site is fully funded by our own fund raising, donations received and generous grants from both State and Federal governments. We are currently in discussion with Council to gain Planning Approval and anticipate that should this process proceed as expected we will have an operational Men's Shed by the end of this year.

It is exciting that we are now on a realistic pathway towards achieving our goal. The benefits of a Men's Shed in our community are immense. The scope of use of our "Shed" will only be realised once members have a structure to work in. The range of possible activities which extend from having a coffee with friends, to engaging on a construction project for yourself or the community is endless.



Big plant giveaway success

It's not too hard to plant a native seedling but does require solid commitment to keep it alive. The Big Plant Give Away in mid-May saw a great crowd at the Cremorne Bowls and Community Club with 600 natives walking out the gate of which around 100 were endangered Eucalyptus Morrisbyis.

The aim of this day is to get native plants in the ground in your Cremorne garden, nature strip, dune and/or foreshore area to increase native habitat and stabilise coastal edges, and additionally keeping the Morrisby Gum alive and thriving. With everyone looking after their own plantings it's a greater way to achieve success. Give your plants a fair bit of love for the first two summers and wean them off over the following two – three years but don't forget them. The summers can be harsh.

A huge shout-out to Andrew and Helenka Stevenson from Wildseed Nursery at Sorrel for providing the seedlings. They've got a great selection at extremely reasonable prices and come highly recommended. If you need assistance with guards, stakes, water granules and native fertiliser for reserve areas let us know. As a group we would love to see more of the households on the dunes and lagoon foreshore planting species such as Coastal Wattle, Coastal Current, Sheoaks, Hopbushes, Boobialla and Atriplex to smother out the Marram Grass to improve dune and foreshore stability.

Many thanks for all to help run the day - Jan, Di, Heather, Hannah, Kerry, Geir, Linn, Sarah, Finn and Mads with Anne, Jen and Jodie. As well as Emmalene from Council and Karen and Magali from the E. Morrisbyi Project; Pato and Jacqui for the great hot drinks and waffles and cinnamon scrools; and the Club for their space.

Thank you to Clarence Council for their ongoing sponsorship to Pipe Clay Coastcare for such events. We have also engaged specialists TasFlora who recently have undertaken weed and track clearing out at the Spit.


