STORIES OF CONVICT SETTLERS

The South Arm Convict Walk was launched in December 2013 and is well worth a stroll down the path which connects South Arm and Opossum Bay. Along the way you will now find a series of 12 interpretive signs—or information panels—that tell the stories of the convicts who contributed so much to the history, heritage and community of our peninsula. SAPRA are delighted by the media atten-



tion the initiative has attracted and hope many visitors will follow. Funding from the Federal Government's Your Community Heritage Program made this project possible along with the assistance

of Clarence City Council. Here is just a taste: Eliza Hurst (convict ship Emma Eugenia). A nurse and needlewoman, Eliza Hurst was 18 when she was transported for pickpocketing 16 pound. In 1843 she married William Lazenby, another convict, and officially became he assigned servant. But she still got in trouble occasionally, for being 'disorderly' and pretending to be free. If you have any ideas for projects or issues you'd like us to raise, please contact any committee member.


'The Avenue' of Red Flowering Gums

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM Activity Update

The CERT previously known as First Responders has been operating in the South Arm/Opossum Bay area since 2008. Many of you may have seen the CERT vehicle in the area, which was provided by Tas Ambulance in 2009. The vehicle not only allows us greater visibility when attending an emergency but more importantly allows easy transport and accessibility of our live saving equipment and gear.

When Tas Ambulance receives a triple zero call for this area communications officers simultaneously dispatch the nearest emergency ambulance and our local CERT group by pager message. CERT volunteers working generally as part of a two-person crew are then able to reach local residents quickly and provide critical assistance whilst the ambulance is on route.

CERT volunteers receive training in basic life support techniques, how to administer oxygen and how to use an automated external defibrillator. Whilst this is significantly less training than paramedics, the skills learnt by volunteers can and does save lives, particularly in cardiac and respiratory emergencies where time is often critical.

As of writing this article our local CERT has attended 22 incidents in the local and surrounding areas from 1 December 2013 to date. It has been a very busy month but certainly highlights the importance of having a CERT in our area!

Recently, due to the fundraising efforts of people in our community we have purchased a traction splint, torches and an upgraded blood pressure meter.

A very big thank you to the RSL for recent donations and to Judy Alexander, Leonie Rusden, Deb Gwynn, Sally Morley, Kaye Stansfield and Lesley Gore who were involved in organizing a Melbourne Cup Luncheon that raised \$1610.00 for the CERT. Your support and efforts is very much appreciated.

Finally if you are interested in joining the CERT we are always eager for new members. Presently, although we do endeavour to attend most emergencies we don't have enough members to provide 24/7 coverage. The work is very rewarding with an added bonus of learning lifelong skills.










BUSHFIRE FOCUS

We are now in the middle the fire season and so far we have been pretty lucky with no bushfires in our area, however we have been busy with motor vehicle **0-11** accidents, 3 so far in the period from Christmas Eve onwards.



The Fire Permit season was declared before Christmas and Permit Officers for the South Arm and Opossum Bay area are: Richard Calvert on 6239 412, Barry Heather on 6239 9564, Brett Arnold on 6239 9259 and Glenn Palmer on 6239 9346. Due to the hot and dry conditions there have been a number of days this month that were declared as Total Fire Ban days, and there will probably be more during summer. That means:-

- Camp fires, burn offs etc and any other fires including barbecues that use wood, charcoal or other solid fuel are banned, but gas and electric barbecues are permitted subject to the strict application of the conditions set out below.
- Gas and electric barbecues provided in public reserves/campsites may be used providing:
 - The barbecue is electric or gas fired and the barbecue is a fixed permanent structure.
 - Portable gas and electric barbecues may be used provided the barbecue is located within 20m of a permanent dwelling (mobile homes, caravans or tents are not classified as permanent dwellings).

Additional conditions that apply to the use of portable electric and gas fired barbecues and barbecues in public reserves and campsites: the area for 3m around and above the barbecue is completely cleared of flammable material, an adult is in attendance at all times, a tap with hose connected is ready for use and at least 10 litres of water is on hand in case of emergency.

If you are in any doubt, please contact either the TFS or a Permit Officer.

By the time this newsletter is published the Brigade should have taken delivery of a new fire truck. This is a Hino a heavy tanker and comes complete with some impressive up to date technology to replace our aging unit. No doubt you will see it around the district as we train to become familiar with it's capabilities.

PLANNING FOR PETS

The horror and destruction caused by bushfires in NSW and our own fresh memories of the Dunalley fires last summer are a reminder to be prepared for the bushfire season. Bushfires are an unfortunate part of our sun burnt country's landscape and can seem as arbitrary as a roll of the dice. With luck your home will never be in a bushfire's path, but it is still best to be prepared for a worst-case scenario. Having a good bushfire plan increases your chance of survival, and it is important to include pets and livestock in any plan you make so that they make it along with you.

EVACUATION

The first thing to decide ahead of time is at what point you evacuate your animals. Don't leave it to the last minute, when it is possibly too late. The next thing to decide is where your animals are going to go. If possible, arrange an alternative place, whether a friend or relatives' house or a professional facility. Make sure to work out the details such as feed, accommodation and medication. It is also a good idea to have feed ready to go, and to make sure that any animal/stock crates, cages, floats and ramps are in working order. Putting together an 'emergency cache' that contains all their essential supplies and includes a content list, instructions and contact details for yourself and your vet is a good way (p.7)

(continued p.6) to have everything ready to hand in case a hasty exit is needed. Designate ahead of time a 'safe room in your house in which to corral smaller animals if there a bush-fire threat.

IDENTIFICATION

Make sure that important information stays with your animals wherever they go. This includes NLIS ear tags for sheep and cattle, microchips and collar tags for cats and dogs and more improvised methods such as names, phone numbers and addresses attached to cages and carriers, written in stock crayon on rumps or on sticky labels folded into manes.

LEAVING ANIMALS BEHIND

Sometimes the best choice will be to leave the animals on your property. If this is the case, elect a refuge or low-risk fire area for your livestock. Areas with low vegetation such as ploughed or eaten-out paddocks or irrigated pastures are a good choice. There should be a water supply that wont be compromised by the fire, such as a dam. If you choose a yard make sure there is a 20m-wide cleared or ploughed perimeter and no bush or flammable structures alongside. Don't tether animals, and open up internal gates so they are able to escape to a safer place if need. Don't let them out on public roads where they may cause a problem. Remove any flammable accessories such as halters and collars. Most important of all, make sure that everyone in the household knows the fire plan ahead of time, so everyone knows what to do and where to go.

HISTORY AND HERITAGE

The opening of the Convict Trail on the South Arm Peninsula in December 2013 would have people thinking of a possible convict connection in their family, especially those who are related to the very first families who settled here. This month I tell the story of Jacob Bellett who was convicted of having stolen a 51 ells of silk from his employer John Gearing and Thomas Taylor. Jacob was tried on 25 January 1785 at the Old Baily Middlesex UK. Found guilty by jury he was sentenced to be transported to Africa on 19 March 1785. Due to the upheavals in the African country he was never sent there. He spent two years and six months remaining in the UK prison. This was not a life that anyone would wish for, as all prisoners were thrown in together. To alleviate the congestion in the prisons was to transport many to the unknown land that had been discovered by Captain Cook. Although there were many delays, selected prisoners had to help load supplies on to the ships, finally the day came and they sailed under Captain Phillips. Jacob had been given a sentence of seven years so joined the many others in the fleet; they arrived in the new colony on 20 January 1788 at the place named later as Port Jackson New South Wales. In desperation to establish a settlement that would supply food for the Colony a party was sent with convicts to what is known as Norfolk Island. It was on Norfolk Island that Jacob Bellett like the others were granted land to farm, which turned out very well for him. In the later records we read that he married Miss Ann Harper on 15 November 1791 on Norfolk Island. She also had been transported as a convict to the new colony. All reports state they both did well with the farm and had constructed a house and owning several head of stock. As reported in many books we read how under Captain Collins a settlement had been made in Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania) this was followed by several ships transporting families from Norfolk Island to Van Diemen's Land in 1808. Jacob and Ann with a now growing family of seven children arrived and once again granted land to farm. The eldest daughter of Jacob & Ann Bellett, Elizabeth married Robert Alomes (Carter) who had arrived with Captain Collins of the first fleet. In July 2013 I wrote in the newsletter about the Alomes family, Christopher Calvert Jnr. John Potter and the connection with the eldest daughter Elizabeth of Jacob & Ann Bellett. When reading the family tree connecting the people from that period there are well over three thousand five hundred other families and decedents in Tasmania. Since I started 15 years ago tracing our family history I have been in contact with many of these people seeking to learn more about their family link to Jacob and Ann. One very good book "Chains to freedom" written by Thais Mason covered the history of the families and connections, the only copies of this book I have read have been on loan by relatives. A very good website by M J Donaldson who covered these people by way of the family tree is no longer available. BUSY SURF CARNIVAL TIME



Over the past few years the South Arm community has fared well from the provision of grants by Clarence City Council. Since September 2010, the South Arm Primary School Association has received \$1,000 to support its involvement in the Arm End revegetation; SAPRA has received \$1,500 towards the re-development of the Community Centre, and an \$816 contribution to the Opossum Bay Flowering Gum Avenue. The Grants Program is one practical means by which Council's Strategic Plan 2010-2015 is implemented. Three types of grant are available:

Quick Response Grants – for individuals and groups for up to \$150 (can be applied for throughout the year);

Community Support Grants – a bi-annual grant of up to \$1,500 for groups and not-for-profit organisations, closing on 15 March and 15 September each year; and

Partnership Grants - up to \$15,000 for groups and not-forprofit organisations based in Clarence, which may be disbursed over 3 years (can be applied for throughout the year). If eligible, you are welcome to take the opportunity to apply for funds. Successful applicants will be aided in undertaking their cause or interest, whilst working with Council to fulfil its vision for Clarence: a place of diverse communities working together for a vibrant, prosperous and sustainable city.
