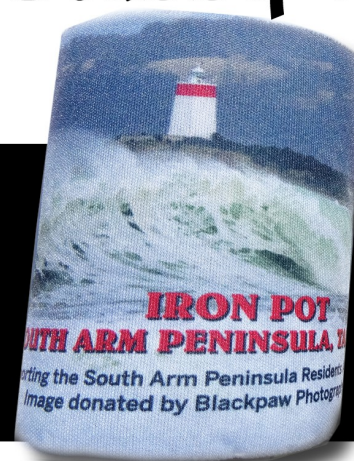

Tasmania fires stir memories of nearly 50 years

Recent bushfires active across Tasmania prompt us all to be vigilant of our risks and to be bushfire prepared. Nearby fires and smoke may stir memories of past fires and bring on recollections of survival and recovery in a non-digital time of telegrams and trolley cars. A significant fire in Tasmanian history is the Black Tuesday bushfires of February 1967. There are many people in the community that can still relate a story of the 1967 bushfires based on their firsthand experience of that day and others have had stories passed down to them through older relatives.

Throughout 2016 the Tasmania Fire Service Bushfire-Ready Neighbourhoods program will tour a video story booth to commemorate the 50 year anniversary of the '67 bushfires. People are invited to record their story in the video booth that will be at major community events and venues state-wide.

In January to March of 2016 the video booth recorded a range of stories of people's experience of the 1967 bushfires to add to the collection. Mrs Marjory Woolford recalls that "the morning of February the seventh 1967 began as most other days began but the morning had an oppressive feel about it with foreboding of something sinister about to happen."

Helen Walch remembers " heading to Kingston was terrible journey so dark at times and the fire kept catching up and trees and bushes were on fire, as we approached Taroona fire was on both sides of the road and large pieces of houses were blowing on the road."

To commemorate the 50 year anniversary of the bushfires in February 2017 the collection of stories will feature online and form part of a major exhibition at the Tasmania Museum and Art Gallery in 2017, and stories will be incorporated into the Tasmania archives. It has been an interesting few months for the CERT with January and February being particularly busy. We had 5 call outs in one week which would be close to a record! Of course being busy is not what we really want to see, but it is good to know that we are here to support the community and provide aid until the paramedic crews arrive on scene. We are also hopeful for some new members joining soon to boost our numbers, and I have been advised by Ambulance Tasmania that they will be conducting another Essential Skills training course in the coming months for new volunteers.

We are again very fortunate to have such a supportive community and a HUGE thanks to Lesley Gore, Judy Alexander, Sally Morley, Leonie Rusden and Marcia Pepper who coordinated the last Melbourne Cup luncheon where an amazing \$1200 was raised for the CERT! Thanks too to the businesses and people who support this event, particularly Allure Fashions Rosny, South Arm Community Pharmacy, and Alan Langley and Roger Smith who run the sweeps on the day.

With the kind donation, the CERT got together and decided that it would be beneficial to have another Automatic Emergency Defibrillator in the community, and this money went towards the purchase of a brand new unit located suitably at KBD Personal Fitness. We felt this was an ideal location due to the extended opening times, and easy access in the middle of town. This now compliments the unit in place at the South Arm RSL and of course the unit carried by the CERT.

CLARENCE PLAINS FESTIVAL

After a break last year, Clarence Plains Festival is back and it's growing. For the first time being held into the evening, the festival will take place on April 30 from 3-8pm and has a collection of festival highlights built and made by local young people.

Internationally renowned puppet sculptor Tristan Stowards has been working with local students to construct the 'Big Dude' – a three meter sculpture to which people are invited to 'throw their own light'. With 1000 LED lights, battery units and modelling clay to hand, people can make and throw their own light creation onto the sculpture.

Dance teacher Tullia Chung-Tilley has combined students from Rokeby High, Rokeby Primary, Clarendon Vale Primary and Lauderdale Primary to choreograph a work entitled 'The Doors Between' which explores traditional festival movement through community celebration.

Students from Rokeby High have also been working together on a performance installation with film maker

Lucien Simon called 'Blast!'.

But the Festival is keeping its roots firmly planted in good fun with the return of the mechanical bull, rides, activities for everyone and a chill out cinema.

On the day people can join in with the Clarence Paper Planes Distance Throw Competition, set up your own market stall or record your own video diary of the '67 bushfires (for those that were around). You can also have-a-go with Social Circus, play soccer on an inflatable field and take a selfie in the photo booth or if you'd rather kick back and relax, you can enjoy the full stage program including the Clarence City Concert Band, The Merkin Brothers, Nadira and Friends, Wax Doctor West and a big array of musical talent from all directions.

This year the Festival is also inviting painters, crafty folk and visual arts creators to enter into an on-site exhibition which takes place for a week at the Rokeby Neighbourhood Centre. Entry forms are available from there or for download www.clarenceartsandevents.net/opportunities.

With a selection of the best street food and a free barbecue, a super cheap multi-ride pass and lots of demonstrations, it's a great festival to celebrate the turning of the seasons.

Olive and Rosemary Quickbread

3 cups (450g) self-raising flour

1/2 tsp salt

75g butter, chopped

1 tbsp finely chopped fresh rosemary (+ a touch extra)

3/4 cup Kalamata olives, seeded, halved

3/4 cup buttermilk (+ a tbsp extra)

1/2 cup water, approximately

1. Preheat the oven to 220C (200C fan forced). Grease a 23cm square cake pan.
2. Sift flour, salt into a large bowl. Using fingers, rub in the butter until mixture resembles coarse bread-crumbs; add rosemary and olives. Stir in the buttermilk and enough of the water to make a soft, stick dough.
3. Knead dough on a floured surface until smooth; using your hands, press the dough into a square pan shape, cut the dough into 12 equal pieces; place pieces slightly apart in the pan. Brush tops with a little extra buttermilk and sprinkle with rosemary.
4. Bake for about 30 minutes or until golden brown. Stand in a pan for 5 minutes before turning out.
