SOUTH ARM FIRE BRIGADE — WINTER UPDATE

Winter is officially here once again and home heaters will soon be going flat out. At this time of year the Brigade switches from bush fire 'mode' to house fires, and so we are concentrating our training on responding to structural fires and the use of Breathing Apparatus.

Fire permits are not required now, but if you are planning to do some burning off, please register your burn with the TFS by free-calling 1800 000 699 to avoid unnecessary brigade responses.

Over the last few winters there have been quite a number of house fires in Tasmania and the last thing anyone wants is more of the same. One of the causes has been people putting clothes to dry far too close to wood or electric heaters. If you do use your heater to dry clothes please remember, "A metre from the heater is close enough."

There is plenty of evidence that smoke alarms save lives, but the batteries need to be changed regularly. Did you change your smoke alarm batteries when the clocks changed the other month?

In good times, or when we experience hardship, the community will continue to benefit from the stability and harmony offered by our local Church, today and into the future, particularly if we involve our children in meaningful and fun participation in the life of the Church.

To this end we are discussing the possibility of establishing a Family Church Library (also located in the Church Hall with the Church History Display) where parents can drop in with their children after school, at set times, to browse and read and borrow books. 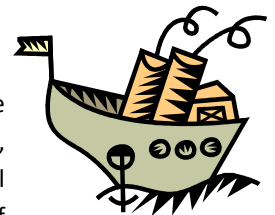

PUMPKIN CHOWDER RECIPE

A dead easy recipe, with a 'bung it all in' skill rating. Ingredients are:

1 onion, chopped; 1 leek, washed and sliced; 350g pumpkin, rinsed and sliced; 160g potato, peeled and chopped; 1 cup cubed ham (optional); 3 cups chicken stock; ¼ to ½ tsp curry powder (depending on your palate); pepper; 250g grated light processed cheese; 1 cup milk; chopped chives for garnish.

Put all ingredients (except cheese, milk and chives) in saucepan and cook till soft. Puree. Mix in milk and cheese, reheat till just under boil. Serve garnished with chives.

PREPARING FOR A WINNER

Pumpkins are always hungry so prepare for big feeders. Dig holes one spade deep and fill with manure, soft weeds, grass clippings and compost. When this sinks down, add more compost and mulch and plant seedlings in a depression when all danger of frost is over. Although pumpkins survive dry days, a daily watering at the roots is generally needed. [From *One Magic Square*]

If you don't mind a little 'see how it goes' method try leaving the scoped out insides of a pumpkin near the top of compost heap—the seedlings magically appear in the spring and grown down and feed on the heap. A word of warning though...try and limit zucchini scraps in this particular compost heap because its hard to tell the seedlings apart when they first appear!

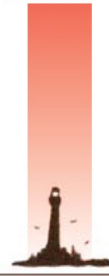

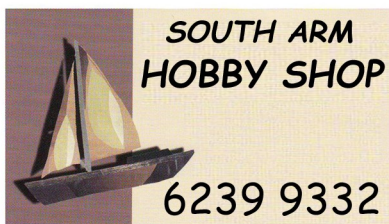

HISTORY & HERITAGE

In March this year my wife Pauline and I joined a cruise to New Zealand on the Dawn Princess. The main purpose of this trip was to revise the history relating to the late Rev, Joseph Tice Gellibrand who grew up – with his many relatives – on the South Arm Peninsula. He was the son of Joseph Tice Gellibrand the first appointed Attorney General to Tasmania who arrived here with his father William Gellibrand in 1824. William is well remembered as he was granted the land of the South Arm Peninsula in 1825. The Rev. J. T. Gellibrand, M.A. (1826-1887) was first minister of All Saints church in South Hobart; he was also responsible in the construction of this church. While living in South Arm at that time he gave many church lessons for the local people, this was possibly at the building on the corner of Bezzant's road which was used as the first school house in 1854. One of our family members still has a bible presented to the Potter family at the time, and signed by Joseph. Around 1870 Joseph T. Gellibrand with his brother William both visited New Zealand travelling by ship along the east coast calling at the ports of Dunedin, Christchurch, Wellington in the north Island. **Continued p.8**

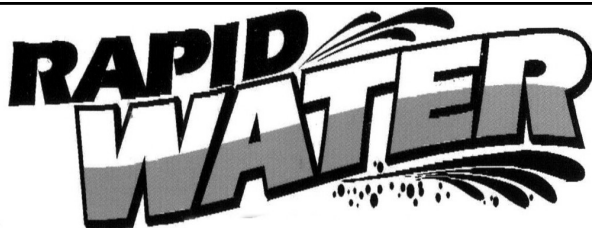

Following this Joseph returned to England for some time. On his return to South Arm in 1877 he and his wife Selina along with Elizabeth Winspear decided to move to New Zealand. It was said in several reports that Joseph and Selina had adopted Elizabeth as they did not have any children of their own. From what I now know the adoption was never approved. Elizabeth was the daughter of William and Martha Winspear who had married at Danby in Cleveland, Yorkshire in England on the 8th June 1847; besides Elizabeth born 1848 they had three other children. Martha Winspear was the youngest daughter of Mr & Mrs William Watson who had arrived in Tasmania in 1825 on the ship Harvey. Other members of the Watson family John, Thomas, and Hannah who we know married Christopher Calvert on the 16th January 1837. William Winspear died on the voyage out to Tasmania this left Mrs Elizabeth Winspear with four young children to raise which would have been very hard then. From the records she was listed as farming land at South Arm in 1866. Today that property still bears the name Winspear. The reason that her daughter Elizabeth was going to New Zealand with Joseph T Gelli-brand apart from the suggestion of adoption was not clear here or from the records in New Zealand. Never the less on their arrival at Omokoroa Tauranga Bay of Plenty in 1877 we discover Elizabeth Winspear married Arthur Crapp on the 28th February 1878.
