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EASTERN OPTION FOR HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Eastern philosophy talks about doing things each day as regular maintenance of our bodies and also setting up living and working environments that promote good health.

I'd like to share with you two key tools I now use after 20+ years of research, that support establishing and maintaining good health.

Qigong: my regular maintenance routine. It is a number of simple and gentle movements, combined with meditation, that restores energy levels and melts away daily stresses. Qigong was used by the Shaolin monks between Kung Fu training sessions to "keep them on deck" and is practiced, in its various forms, by millions of Chinese people every day.

Qigong basics classes: 1 night per week for 5 weeks at the Community Centre. Cost is \$50 per person which also includes an option to have your house checked for stresses (see below).

Stress check in your house

There are stresses between nature and our modern world within our work and living environments Evidence is all around us if we know what to look for - it might be

- •A spot in the garden where plants struggle, die or are infested with parasites
- •A hedge that always has a gap in it no matter what you do
- •A dog that won't sleep in its kennel
- •Cracks in the concrete or bricks at you place with no apparent earth movement

By themselves, these stresses don't cause disease but can lower our immune systems and leave us prone to disease.

Most houses have these stresses but for most of us moving houses is not a realistic option. In the new Russell Crowe movie "The Water Diviner" he uses a technique called dowsing to find water and I use a similar technique to locate and cure these stresses to make your living/working environment safe again. Sounds weird but it works! House stress-check service: around \$100 for a full check.

HISTORY & HERITAGE: The Navy 1940

Fort Direction South Arm 1940-45, besides being a training area for the army a naval station was established on the top of the hill overlooking the Derwent River. This station was equipped with wireless communication also a large mast to display flag signals for communication with all shipping movements entering and leaving Hobart. A small 4 room weather board building was constructed to house all the equipment manned by a group of naval personnel on routine shift routine. On the lower side of the Fort Hill another building was built which contained the living and sleeping quarters for the fourteen naval men manning the operations under the command of Lt B. Dechaineux (RANR). This signal station worked closely with the Battery, but there was limited non-work related interaction between Navy personnel and the Army personnel. During the operations in the short period of this station I can recall only on one occasion that a ship failed to answer to the call to reply to signals being sent. This brought swift action from the army manning the large guns at that time. The sound of the firing of the gun at 6am in the early morning would have been heard by the residents of South Arm. The vessel was a liberty ship proceeding into Hobart at that time soon answered the call and came to a stop. I have the photos that appeared in a local paper sometime during the establishment of the station. Unfortunately like many of these places the whole station was dismantled before the end of the war in 1945. I was still attending school in those times I saw the men in training and many things that took place in the 1940-45 period. The firing of the guns at a target being towed across Storm Bay for practice, this quite often happened at night with the use of the search lights that had been established on Cape Direction and Cape Deliverance beamed to light up the target. The target was constructed of two floating pontoons made of wood which were constructed on the South Arm beach. It was often damaged and had to be repaired before it could be used again. Also a lot of training took place in the sand dunes on Roaring Beach and the farms surrounding the camp area. We were warned not to enter these areas and a red flag was positioned and displayed to mark the area. Often the training took place at night or during the early morning this meant that South Arm was very much alive then.

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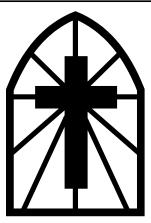

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SOUTH ARM FIRE BRIGADE: "TWO METRES FROM THE HEATER IS CLOSE ENOUGH"



By the time this newsletter goes to print Winter will officially be here once again and home heaters and wood heaters will soon be going flat out. At this time of year the Brigade switches from bush fire 'mode' to house fires, and so we are concentrating our training on responding to structural fires and the use of Breathing Apparatus.

Fire permits are not required now, but if you are planning to do some burning off, please register your burn with the TFS by free-calling 1800 000 699 to avoid unnecessary brigade responses.

Over the last few winters there have been quite a number of house fires in Tasmania caused by people putting clothes to dry far too close to wood or electric heaters. If you do use your heater to dry clothes please remember, "Two metres from the heater is close enough." Overloaded power points and power boards are another potential cause of house fires.

There is plenty of evidence that smoke alarms save lives, but the batteries need to be changed regularly each year. Did you change your smoke alarm batteries when the clocks changed the other month?

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CREMORNE PLAYGROUP

On 12 May, Clarence City Council hosted a get-together to thank the many and varied volunteers who help to keep our society functional. It was great to see the South Arm Peninsular well represented at this function. I don't remember all the statistics that were cited during various speeches but I do recall the Mayor, Doug Chipman, referring to 600,000 voluntary groups across the nation with just 10% of these having paid staff on their books. It was also said that \$2 billion per year was contributed by volunteers towards our annual economy.

Despite the big numbers and the broad scope of official "volunteering", for those of us involved in voluntary organisations, it is sometimes the small steps, the little gains and the guiet achievements that are especially memorable. As Albert Einstein is supposed to have said: Not everything that can be measured counts...and vice versa! In our small corner of the Peninsular, this was brought home to me recently when a much-respected member of our community suddenly and unexpectedly died. During the sad and confusing period following his death, the strength and support offered to grieving family and friends was swift, impressive and practical. The clearest demonstration of our community's caring nature was on the day of the funeral when scores of residents not only swelled the funeral chapel to overflowing but decorated the Bowls and Community Club, helped set up additional shelter, cooked and served masses of food and returned the next day to clean and clear up the

the clubhouse. It was an impressive display of little bits of help that amounted to a big contribution.

Not everyone has the capacity to "volunteer", in an organisational sense,

but most people can – and many do – "help". In Cremorne we have people who help with our award-winning Playgroup, people who have made a positive and visible impact on our shoreline through Coastcare, people who help in both formal and informal ways to run the Cremorne Bowls & Community Club, people who assist firefighting efforts and others who help organise bonfires, discos, Halloween jaunts and community BBQs.

Our Cremorne Community Group sometimes acts as a communication source for these helpers in addition to our primary role in organising "events" (primarily our Long Table Lunch and Christmas @ Cremorne). 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RECIPE — Chilli Beef Ramen

(Quantities are for 2 people)

150g beansprouts

250g ramen noodles

350g sirloin steak

A little vegetable oil and a little teriyaki sauce (for brushing)

1 litre chicken or vegetable stock

2 Tbsp chilli ramen sauce (see below)

4 spring onions, trimmed and sliced in strips

1 red chilli, trimmed, deseeded and sliced lengthways

1/2 red onion, peeled and very thickly sliced

1 limed, quartered

Handful coriander for each bowl

- Blanch the beansprouts in a large pan of boiling water for 10 seconds. Drain, reserving the water, and refreshing in cold running water. Cook the noodles in the reserved boiling water for 2-3 min or until just tender.
 Drain thoroughly and refresh under cold water.
- Heat a griddle or frying pan over a medium heat for 1-2 mins until hot and almost smoking. Lightly rub the steak with oil, then book for 2 mins on each side until just medium rare. Remove, brush with the teriyaki sauce and keep warm while it rest for 3-4 mins. Slice finely in diagonal strips
- Divide the noodle between 2 bowls. Heat the stocks, stir in chili ramen sauce, then ladle over the noodles.
 Top with the beef and all the fresh ingredients.

Chilli Ramen Sauce

2 scant teaspoons sugar

2 tablespoons malt vinegar

3 tablespoons sweet chilli sauce

5 tablespoons fish sauce

Dissolve the sugar in the vinegar in a small pan over a gentle heat, allow to cool and then combine with the other ingredients.
