HISTORY AND HERITAGE

The South Arm — New Zealand Connection as told by Maurice Potter from his recent travels with wife Pauline

On arrival at Tauranga wharf on the cruise ship Dawn Princess 26th February 2014 we were met by Mr Colin Pettigrew who is a leader of just one community group who have been very active in restoring the history at Omokoroa Point and the land once farmed by Rev. Joseph Tice Gellibrand. Community spirit is strong in Omokoroa and there are many cultural and community groups and activities run by volunteers. After a tour of the Tauranga taking in the views from the highest peaks we could find, we preceded to Omokoroa Point 17km from the harbour. It is very much like the area of Opossum Bay the only difference being the number of houses along the many small streets with a population around 2000 people. A very large retirement village surrounded by the parklands runs along the foreshore with a golf course and Clubhouse nearby. At the home of Colin & Shirley Pettigrew we met with the other members of their group, while enjoying a lovely lunch, we discussed the history of Gellibrand his wife Selina and Elizabeth which took place back in 1877. Elizabeth married Arthur Crapp in Auckland 28th February 1878; at the time Rev J. T. Gellibrand was very ill so only Selina was able to attend the wedding. On the return trip by steamer to Tauranga, Selina was met by a small sailing craft in the harbour to be returned her to Omokoroa Point. While sailing down the bay the sailing vessel capsized and Selina was drowned, the boatman was picked up by Maori's in a canoe. This was a big blow to Joseph as he had been in poor health for some time. For the next few years Joseph took more time to travel visiting South Arm and also the UK. Arthur Crapp had been a surveyor and member of the Armed Constabulary as well as a veteran of the Maori Wars. He became a friend and advisor of Gellibrand and eventually taking over management of the farm, at a later date Arthur Crapp purchased the farm. Gellibrand was a keen naturalist and consequently Omokoroa Point was planted with many exotic trees and shrubs. The reserve today contains many trees planted by Gellibrand, some of which are outstanding and unusual specimens. Today the reserve is named the Gerald Crapp Historic Reserve the majority of which were planted by Tice Gellibrand and Arthur Crapp in the late 1870 -1900. The street into the reserve is named Gellibrand Place, and Gerald Crapp was the youngest child of the seven children born to Elizabeth and Arthur Crapp. Gellibrand constructed a large Kauri homestead out near the Point and poured money and man power into

creating a productive farm. The house was destroyed by fire in 1958; the photo here is from a painting. A new home now stands in its place today. During our visit we met three relatives of the Crapp Family who have helped to keep the historical records and history of Omokoroa. **To be continued.**

TANGARA TRAIL

Travelling from Cambridge or Five Mile Beach to South Arm you will notice the little blue, or larger white Tangara Trail signs to guide horse riders, walkers and mountain bikers throughout our wonderful network of rural-residential, bush, hills, coastal trails and reserves. Comprised of a main corridor intersected by many other tracks and loops, the scenic Tangara Trail offers close to 100 kilometres of recreational trails.

The Tangara Trail is recognised as one of the best horse riding, walking and mountain bike trail systems in Australia and is used as a benchmark in other states where new trails are being established.

The trail began in the 1970?s when the need for safe horse riding was recognised during land subdivision in the area. A management committee formed in 1988. Since then, walking and mountain biking on the trails increased and in 2004 Tangara Horse Riding Trails Inc. became the multi-user Tangara Recreational Trails Inc. It is very unique as it is the only trail network in Southern Tasmania specifically accommodating equestrian use.



Our small, dedicated committee liaise with Clarence City Council, Parks and Wildlife Service and land owners to ensure safety, maintenance, continuity and extension of the trails so locals and visitors may continue to enjoy this valuable community asset.

- Paying bills, visit the hairdresser

- Travel locally, to Hobart or anywhere within the state.

RICOTTA HONEY TART

Preparation: 20 minutes Cooking time: 1 1/4 hours

Melted butter, for greasing 5 eggs 100g fresh white breadcrumbs 200g plain thick yoghurt 2 rosemary sprigs, leaves only 150ml honey 600g ricotta 55g caster sugar

350g mascarpone Zest of 1/2 a lemon pine or cashew nuts

EXTRA: 3-4 tablespoons honey, for glazing, cream to serve.

- 1. Preheat over to 170 degrees. Grease and line a 26cm springform tin with baking paper. Coat with breadcrumbs.
- 2. Put rosemary and honey in a small heavy-based pan over a medium heat. Bring to a simmer, then set aside to cool.
- 3. In a food processor, process ricotta and sugar until smooth. Add eggs, 1 at a time, processing briefly after each addition. Add cooled honey, yoghurt, mascarpone and lemon zest, and process until smooth.
- 4. Pour mixture into prepared tin, sprinkle with pine or cashew nuts (enough for a good cover) and bake for 1 1/4 hours or until cooked. Cool to room temperature.
- 5. Warm extra honey over a medium heat; glaze tart. Serve with cream.
