ARM END SUBMITS NEW DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION TO COUNCIL

Arm End developers have submitted a new Development Application (DA) to Clarence City Council seeking planning approval for several development improvements.

The new DA was informed by significant community consultation with the major change being the reactivation of the existing quarry at Arm End. An estimated 12,000 tonnes of material will be required for the new walking and cycling tracks. By taking that material from the quarry, heavy vehicle movements in and out of the site will be drastically reduced. After an estimated two years of use, the quarry will be completely rehabilitated.

Although we usually think of the bushfire season as the busiest time for fire-fighters, in Tasmania the winter generally proves to be more dangerous, with significantly more house fires, and unfortunately, some fire-related deaths.



Unfortunately we have already had a couple of structural fires in our area so far this winter, luckily without injuries. All householders should have working smoke alarms and a fire evacuation plan just in case the worse happens.

Planning ahead, spring is only a few weeks away and we can look forward to another summer fast approaching so now is a good time to clear up around your property and prepare for what could turn out to be another bush-fire summer. Another community suggestion was moving the already approved café/retail outlet and it is now proposed to overlook both Shelly and Mitchells beaches, and be built with consideration to its visual impact. The new location is 140m further away from the nearest residents and sits on higher ground allowing visitors to enjoy the site beauty.

The maintenance area will now include the site's native plant propagation nursery, where some 80,000 plants for the revegetation and rehabilitation program will be grown. The maintenance facility (with nursery) has been pushed about 140m further away from residents and will be screened by landscaped dunes and taller types of revegetation planting. The closing date for submissions to Council was the 22 July. We appreciate the continued excellent feedback and ideas from the local community at South Arm and Opossum Bay (like the plant nursery!) and look forward to seeing the project commencing on target in 2015.

HOPE FOR HORSES SUFFERING NEGLECT

Unfortunately there are many unwanted and neglected horses in Tasmania. They can be forgotten, considered past their use by date or their owners are suffering hardship themselves.

In 2007 the Tasmanian Horse Rescue and Rehabilitation Organisation Inc. (THRRO), a registered not-for-profit organisation based in Sandford, was set up to take and rehabilitate badly neglected horses, retraining and re-homing them RESCUE & REHABILITATION wherever possible. These horses deserve the chance of having a full and healthy life and in the last 8 years, 20 horses have come through the program.

Horse owners confronted with hardship or inability to care for a horse can turn to THRRO for non-judgmental assistance, whether surrendering their horse for the care it needs or simply advice on a problem.

THRRO depends entirely on its own fundraising efforts, donations and membership subscriptions. It's managed and staffed entirely by hardworking volunteers – the small group of dedicated committee members and volunteers giving their time and land to care for the horses. But there are always bills for feed, vets, hoof trimmers etc.

On the website you can see the horses in our care, and our success stories ... and how you can help by donating time, money or goods and services for fundraising prizes to help us keep making a difference.

THRRO only has the resources and manpower to rescue a few, but continues to make a difference where we can to suffering horses and owners themselves who encounter genuine hardship.

Tommy a Standard bred gelding found forgotten in a paddock after his racing days were over. He was very malnourished and his hoofs needed urgent attention. After rehabilitation, bodywork and training, he is re-homed in Launceston and ready to take on the next stage of his life.

HISTORY & HERITAGE

Looking back on family history and Mercury Records.

GOLDEN WEDDING CALVERTON-HALL, SOUTH ARM, on October 25, 1832, the marriage off WATSON-BELLETT William Robert, second son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Watson, sen., of York Grove, Sandford, to Alice Eliza, eldest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Bellette, jun., of Sorell.

The above wedding ceremony was performed by the Rev. Canon H. Finis at the old school, South Arm (on the corner of Bezzant's Road). The residents of South Arm and Sandford did honour to Mr. and Mrs. Watson by giving them a reception at Calverton Hall. There were over 300 persons present. A gold and white wedding cake was given by Mrs. H. Alomes, Mrs. Alan Calvert and Mrs. Alf. Calvert was surmounted by the representation of a gold cricketer, in recognition of Mr. Watson's 70 year's career as an active player. As the guests of the evening entered the hall "The Wedding March" "Here Comes the Bride" were played by Mrs. A. Hurd. The bridesmaid of 50 years ago (Mrs. A. M. Elliott, of Melville Street, Hobart, nee Bellette) accompanied Mrs. Watson. The Warden of Clarence Mr. A. Chipman was introduced by the chairman Mr. E. Calvert, spoke of his 50 years' association with Mr. and Mrs. Watson in the amenities of the district, and said he had found them true and constant friends, who had always been actuated by those principles that should guide us, all through life. They had never turned a deaf ear to any charitable appeal. Mrs. Watson had been one of the earliest State school teachers at South Arm. Mr. Watson was a great sportsman, in the bush and at the range, and had always been amongst the winners. He played the grand old game of cricket when it was in its infancy in the district, and had not missed a season since—a great record-from the age of 15 years to 75.

He presented Mr. and Mrs. Watson with a wallet of notes from his friends, a travelling rug from his sisters, a crystal clock from Mr. and Mrs. Jensen, a bowl from the Rev. H. C. and Mrs. Brammell, and, several other gifts from relatives; also numerous bouquets for Mrs. Watson.

Other speakers were the Rev. V. H. Gill (rector of Clarence), the Rev. H. C. Brammell) (late rector and lifelong friend), Councillor Mr. O. J. Morrisby and Mr. Ernie Calvert. Mention was made of Mr. and Mrs, Watson's long career of church work, Mr. Watson having served several terms as churchwarden, At 9.46pm silence was observed while 7HO radioed congratulations; then sheaves of telegrams were handed to the happy couple.

A feature of the evening's programme was the performance by the Sunday school children of "The Wed ding of the Painted Doll." This was organised by Mrs. Hurd and Miss Dickson and Mrs. Watson on the women's societies and committees. This was the first golden wedding that has been publicly celebrated at South Arm in the Calverton Hall. Notes from my grandmother's diary Mrs Edward Alomes states that 300 people from the South Arm and Sandford attended this celebration.



RECIPE: CARAMELISED CHICKEN & CORIANDER

- 4 (800g) x chicken thigh cutlets
- 1 medium (170g) red onion, sliced thinly
- 3 cloves of garlic, sliced thinly
- 1/4 cup (55g) brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon dark soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon fish sauce
- 1/3 cup coarsely chopped fresh coriander





- 3. Use the same frypan and cook onion and garlic, stirring, until softens. Add sugar, dark soy sauce and fish sauce cook and stir for about 3 minutes.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP: Rokeby High School and UTAS

Rokeby High School (RHS) students have been provided a fantastic opportunity after the announcement of RHS being the pilot school for a significant partnership with the University of Tasmania. The partnership will provide our students with numerous opportunities to get a head start on the competition by participating in a number of University led programs held at RHS and at the Sandy Bay Campus aimed at providing students with real life experiences of university, and the many possible pathways beyond high school. Some of the programs include:

UTAS 'Students in Schools' program

The university's Students in Schools program is designed to inspire young people in Grades 5-8 to broaden their options and consider higher education or university study in the future. The program has university students that go into schools and run a series of fun, hands-on and engaging activities to give students a taste of what university is all about. These programs aim to show students that it is possible and that with the right supports and a keen interest in a subject that they will be able to be the best that they can be.

Foundations for Active Living

This unit is a free course for everyone to provide students and community members with an opportunity to experience study at university and to give them an entry point into the Faculty of Health Science. The unit provides participants with knowledge and skills to commence or maintain a healthy lifestyle using evidence-based knowledge and practices. The unit covers nutrition and food, being active, health promotion, behaviour change, goal setting and tools and activities to put this knowledge into practice.

Business Education Partnership – In conjunction with Elizabeth College
