TRAINING CONDUCTED FOR SOUTH ARM EMERGENCY/RECOVERY CENTRE

The South Arm Community Centre is designated by Clarence City Council as an emergency/recovery centre. In late November, an information/training session was conducted by Council staff for local volunteers interested in helping in the case of an emergency. Also present were representatives from Tasmania Police, the SES, Tasmanian Health Organisation-South, Mayor Chipman, Alderman Chong and the Salvos served lunch, demonstrating their emergency food setup. Volunteers learnt much about setting up and running a centre as well as the massive support network in place at all levels to help communities in times of emergencies. The agencies involved in that network also explained the lessons learnt from the Dunalley fires and how the system has significantly improved. As well as providing feedback to Council from the training, the core volunteer group is now working to set up their own processes, in line with the prepared plan, and setting up their own local contact and support network of volunteers.

Now we know that our community is pretty special when it comes to helping ourselves and in particular helping others. In the case of an emergency, volunteers will be needed for a range of tasks – everything from making coffee, directing traffic or people, looking after animals, general gofers etc.

CLIFTON BEACH SLSC NEWS

Summer is here and surf life saving is in full swing. Surf Boat crews and ski paddlers have been competing very successfully in the statewide long distance events during October and November. Clifton Beach surf boat crews topped the winners podium in the Mens, Womens and reserve sections with great victories in the North West Marathon at Ulverstone and Mercury Surf Safari in Hobart. Ski paddlers were also winners in a range of age and junior sections.

New members have been completing awards training for Surf Bronze Medallions, Surf Rescue Certificates and current members their annual proficiency check for beach patrol duty in readiness for the summer. Nippers have been back in action in the pool and now in the surf enjoying the warmer weather and water.

Inshore Rescue Boats IRBs experienced several search and rescue call outs in past months including one at Clifton when a person was reported in difficulty several hundred metres offshore in very windy conditions. Police, the Westpac Rescue helicopter and Clifton Beach SLSC IRB crews participated in an all day effort without finding anyone.

SWIM BETWEEN THE FLAGS: Surf Patrols begin on Saturday December 6th at Clifton Beach through to the end of March. Club Surf Patrols are conducted weekends and public holidays between 10am to 3pm. Professional lifeguards operate weekdays in December between 10am and 3pm.



We had a wonderful day recently when we took the Community Bus to three local community gardens — Okines (Dodges Ferry), Source (UTAS) and Creek Road (Lenah Valley). An inspiring day — we're brimming with new ideas and energised by what others are doing! Thanks for driving Richard - not even the visiting Chinese president could deter you!

In the new year, we will be holding informal workshops at the centre/garden. We have a long wish list of subjects - wicking beds, propagating techniques, soil improvement, pest control, edible weeds - just to name a few! One of the first will be 'hydroponics' with Russell. 



SUMMER SAFETY — SOUTH ARM FIRE BRIGADE

We are now approaching the fire season and the Brigade again urges all residents and shack owners to be familiar with the fire danger levels.

The Tasmanian Fire Service held its pre fire season briefing for Brigades a few weeks ago and advised that the indication are that we will have a hot dry summer and a bad bushfire season this year.

During the bushfire season, fire danger ratings forecast for Tasmania will be available on the Bureau of Meteorology website, the Tasmania Fire Service website and on the weather page of Tasmania's daily newspapers. You should listen for warnings on ABC Radio or check the TFS website at www.fire.tas.gov.au to find out where fires are burning. Power supplies and phones are likely to fail in a bushfire. If power fails, listen to fire updates on your car radio.



During Fire Danger Levels of Catastrophic, Extreme, Severe, and Very High you should frequently check conditions outside your home. If smoke is blowing towards you, a fire is approaching and you should make a "stay or go" decision immediately, and if leaving do so by a safe route, away from the fire. Please don't wait for an official warning. If ash or burning embers are landing in your yard, the fire is very close and it may be too late to leave. If this is the case, take shelter in your home. Fill your bath and all available containers with water, and actively defend your home by using the water to put out any parts of your home that catch fire. Alternatively and if time permits, go immediately to a nearby safe place.

The Tasmanian Fire Service has a number of booklets/brochures available via their website http://www.fire.tas.gov.au/ including: Bushfire Survival Plan, Using Fire Outdoors and Fire Resisting Garden Plants. Also available through the TFS is the DVD "Bushfire Prepare to Survive."

On a lighter note the brigade and fire truck will be at a number of local community events over the Christmas period, (but of course operational needs will always take precedence). Unfortunately we will not be able to do the Christmas Eve lolly run this year. Having the new fire truck means that Santa would have to ride inside the truck, and the potential for accidents and injury to the public is too great. We will look to bringing Santa back in future years, but have to work out how to do it safely...

Finally, the South Arm Fire Brigade wishes all residents, shack owners and visitors a happy, safe and fire free Christmas and New Year, and thank you all for your support during the last 12 months.

HISTORY AND HERITAGE SAPRA's beginnings

SAPRA formed in March 1989 with its main task to build a gymnasium and community centre. The first Committee elected in April that year was Neil Buchanan, Jill Calvert, Rick Cuthbertson, Michelle de Quincey, Barry Duncan, Noela Foxcroft, Richard Hamlyn-Harriss, Bryce Harvey, Ray Leonard, Annette Potter, Phillip Read, Dawson Smith, Trish Smith and Bob Verrier.

That first year, SAPRA raised \$34,500 through bingo nights, raffles and golf days – an amazing amount at any time. The first newsletter was circulated..

and included a logo competition! (Still the same logo today.) Over ensuing years the community contributed almost \$100,000 towards the construction of the Centre which officially opened in 1996.

But the Centre wasn't SAPRA's only goal. From day 1 the community had a "strong voice to represent our area in matters of community concern", as stated in the first newsletter.

Reflecting on these beginnings and the contribution of many residents over the years, one thing is crystal clear, the underlying feeling of community on the South Arm Peninsula remains as strong as it was then, perhaps summed up in this snippet, again, from that first newsletter 25 years ago.

"FUN" RAISING

The South Arm peninsular is known for its community spirit and its family based interests. We hope to make every fund raising event a FUN based activity. The community is what it is all about. SO LET'S GET CRACKING! Good ideas, assistance, time, money, effort - we don't mind.

RECIPES — PUT MUSHROOMS ON THE BBQ MENU!

Marinated Mushrooms

500g mushrooms—chopped up

1/2 cup olive oil and 1/2 cup white wine vinegar

3 cloves garlic, 2 tablespoons parsley, 2 teaspoons chili all chopped fine

1 teaspoon caster sugar, salt and pepper Combine in a jar and refrigerate for 1 hour.

Baked Mushrooms

4 x large honeybrown mushrooms

1 tablespoon olive oil

3 cloves garlic

Handful of thyme or lemon thyme

1 cup breadcrumbs

125g feta, crumbed

1/2 cup of toasted walnuts or pinenuts finely chopped

Remove the stalks from the mushrooms, chop them finely and place into a bowl. Brush the base of each mushroom with olive oil. Add the garlic, thyme, breadcrumbs, feta and nuts to the chopped mushroom stalks, mix.

Cook the mushrooms oil side down on a preheated medium-high BBQ for 1-2 minutes. Turn mushrooms and fill with the breadcrumb mixture, cook for 1-2 minutes longer. Serve immediately. You can also bake briefly as an alternative. Enjoy!

SNAKES ALIVE!



Have you seen any yet? I've seen one "teenager" hanging around near our water tank and also an "s" track in the soft gravel on the side of our road.

Here are some tips to keep safe and keep snakes at bay:

- Keep grass short and the lower branches of trees and bushes trimmed off the ground where possible.
- Clean up building materials around the yard, such as piles of timber, bricks or sheets of corrugated iron.
- Keep rubbish and compost areas tidy.
- Be aware that chicken sheds and aviaries attract mice and rates which attract snakes—good time to do any repairs.
- On bigger blocks, put containers of water around the edge of your property to eliminate the need for snakes to come close to the house to drink. Very often they are simply attracted to water and we are going in to a dry summer.
- When working outside wear long pants, thick socks, boots and gloves.

Snakes generally won't bit unless they are trodden on or backed into a corner. If you are bitten get immediate medical attention call 000. If a pet is bitten they will need immediate veterinary attention.

If you see one, leave it alone and call Reptile Rescue on 0407 565 181 and keep this number handy!
