## South Arm Fire Brigade

The Brigade has provided crews for both the Forcett and Molesworth fires working 12 hour shifts, with some members assisting the Incident Management Teams as well. It has been a particularly busy time for members who have, in many incidences, taken time away from families and time off work to be part of the crews. Although this year the bushfire season has been the busiest time for fire-fighters, in Tasmania autumn and winter often prove to be more dangerous, with significantly more house fires, and unfortunately, some fire-related deaths. Wood heaters are always a potential for house fires and need to be serviced every year. Smoke alarms do save lives, but the batteries should be changed twice a year when the daylight saving starts and finishes, so don't forget to replace yours when the clocks change. A smoke alarm without a battery is just a useless decoration on the wall.

a number of men restoring furniture, perhaps restoring bicycles for a local school, maybe making Mynah bird traps or fixing lawn mowers or making a kids cubby house for Camp Quality to raffle. You might also see a few young men working with the older men learning new skills and maybe also learning something about life from the men they work with. You will see tea-bags, coffee cups and a comfortable area where men can sit and talk. You will probably also see an area where men can learn to cook for themselves or they can learn how to contact their families by computer."

The Men's Shed initiative is underpinned by an emphasis on good health. "Good health is based on many factors including feeling good about yourself, being productive and valuable to your community, connecting to friends and maintaining an active body and an active mind. Becoming a member of a Men's Shed gives a man that safe and busy environment where he can find many of these things in an atmosphere of old-fashioned mateship. And, importantly, there is no pressure. Men can just come and have a yarn and a cuppa if that is all they're looking for."

As you can see the possibilities are endless. There are about 40 sheds already established throughout Tasmania so be involved in setting up one for the peninsula and get in touch with Morrie.

## South Arm Garden Club

Our Garden Club starts the year with some exciting garden visits – one to Redlands in the Derwent Valley which we have visited before. It will be interesting to see the progress in the garden there, a truly beautiful place. You don't have to be a club or group to visit it now and it is worth a visit.

#### GARDENING TIPS FOR AUTUMN

- Once we start getting regular rain you can prune your native plants.
- Those dead looking Seaside Daisies (Erigeron) are not dead, when we start getting more rain just cut them off fairly close to the ground and they will come again.
- Sow Sweet Pea seeds in April.
- To avoid cabbage moth grubs, wait until May before planting brassicas. The moths should all be dead from cold by then.
- All that excess fruit can be turned into delicious fruit wine. It's a simple procedure with minimal equipment and expense (see page 8 for a recipe for peach wine).
- If you had bad curly leaf in your nectarines/peaches, it might help to spray with Bordeaux mix at leaf fall (autumn) as well as at leaf bud stage.

#### Peach Wine

2.5kg peaches (use damaged fruit, just cut off bad bits, cut up, discard stones). Freezing the fruit first makes the process easier.

2kg sugar

Nutrient	)
Pectozyme	)
White wine yeast	)
Campden mix	)
uice of 2 large lemo	n

These 4 items can be purchased from Tasmanian Home Brewing Supplies at very minimal cost. Quantities to add are marked on packets.

Juice of 2 large lemons 5 litres water (and a 5 litre lidded bucket from an el cheapo shop)

#### METHOD

- Boil water, pour over peaches and leave to cool. Mash.
- Add lemon juice, campden mix, pectozyme. Cover and leave for 3 days.
- Strain finely, stir in sugar, nutrient and yeast (I always pre-start the yeast in ¼ cup of warm water for 15 mins, although the recipe doesn't say that).
- Pour into a fermentation jar/bottle with a fermentation lock (both of these latter items purchased at THBS) leaving about 25mm gap. When fermentation ceases anywhere between 3 12 weeks carefully siphon off the clear wine leaving the dregs at the bottom of the bottle (you'll need a bit of clear plastic tubing for this) and bottle.
- Use ordinary dark wine bottles, well cleaned, with screw tops which still contain their cardboard liner. These quantities will fill 5 bottles.
- Store these away, upright, in a cooler part of the house for .... wait for it .... 12 months. Oh, alright, you could probably drink it after 6 months! Once again you may have a few dregs in the bottom of the bottle, so pour gently. Try to avoid metal coming into contact with the wine at any stage.

And enjoy!

## History and Heritage: Looking back to our early settlers in South Arm

I start this story with Jacob Bellett born in the UK in 1765, and was found guilty for stealing. He was sentenced to seven years and transported to Sydney on the "Scarborough" in 1788. He was later sent to Norfolk Island on the "Sirius". Also on this ship was convict **Ann Harper** whom he married on Norfolk Island, today from this early marriage there are now over 3000 families and relatives throughout the Australia. Together they did well constructing a house and farming in the 18 years that followed.

All had to be left behind when William Bligh, then Governor of New South Wales, received orders from England that they would be transported to Van Diemen's Land. They left Norfolk Island on 5<sup>th</sup> September 1808 on the ship "City of Edinburgh". By then they had eight children but only seven are recorded on arrival, another child was born in Hobart. Jacob was allocated land at Kingborough and later farmed at Glouster which is now Sorell. The head stone at Rokeby states he died 5<sup>th</sup> September 1853.

Their first child Elizabeth Bellett born 18th January 1792 married Robert Alomes on 21st August 1809. Robert was a Mariner with David Collins and the first fleet when they arrived in 1803. Robert Alomes was also known as Carter (his mothers maiden name). Their first three children are registered as Carter and the following children as Alomes. Robert and Elizabeth raised eleven children, the ninth child born to Robert and Elizabeth in 1827, George Thomas Alomes married first Janet McKay, and second Agnes Musk. The eleventh child Elizabeth Ann married John William Potter on 23rd August 1866. The 7th child John James Alomes born 1822 married Rosina Davidson. All these are to be remembered for the part they played in those early years leasing land on the South Arm Peninsula from George Henry Blake Gellibrand.

Robert Alomes born 1784 in Dublin, died 31<sup>st</sup> August 1853, he was buried at St Matthews Church in Rokeby. His wife Elizabeth died at South Arm 24<sup>th</sup> December 1866. On headstone St Barnabas Church South Arm. When Robert died it appears that Elizabeth came to South Arm to live also to be near her remaining family.

This possibly explains why she was buried at St Barnabas Church and not at St Matthews in Rokeby with her husband. Geroge Alomes farmed the property "Rosemount" at South Arm and John Alomes farmed "Green Hill" the name changed later to "Ralphsdene" and is now trading as Retreat Cabins.
