Both Southern Right Whales and Humpback Whales have begun their annual migration from the Southern Ocean down Tasmania's east coast. Sightings often peak over June and July, although the season can last well into spring.

Last year, residents in Cremorne and Clifton were able to watch Southern Right whales just off the shores in Frederick Henry Bay which seems to be a popular stop over for these very welcome visitors. It also seems more are venturing right up the Derwent.

## Clifton Beach SLSC Major Renovation

The first stage of a major refurbishment of the local Clifton Beach Surf Life Saving Club by Macquarie Builders is nearly complete. The \$500,000 STAGE 1 includes a major extension on the northern boundary for training and rescue equipment storage, new first aid and canteen facility, double glazed windows, carpets, disabled toilet/shower, kitchen makeover, up graded fire, water, plumbing and electrical services and rendering of the exterior.

The \$500,000 project was made possible with State Government funding, and





Mr Williams also thanked Reardon Demolition, Rogerson and Birch Surveyors and Paul Newman from HBV Architects for their input. Club members will complete internal finishing off tasks like painting, shelving, storage etc over the next few months

Stage 2 will include major upstairs extension, new kitchen, upstairs toilets, new entry and deck area. Mr Williams said it would cost another \$500,000 to complete the renovation and he hoped additional funding would be found over the next vear or so.

## National Broadband Rollout (NBN) - South Arm

#### Report from the Sunday Tasmanian—19 May 2013, p. 4

Work has begun on rolling out the National Broadband Network to the South Arm area. Contractors have started surveying the area and the existing telecommunications infrastructure, which is expected to take several months.

NBN Co has released a detailed map of the area covered by the first construction module, showing that construction will being tin the area between Driftwood Drive and Roaring Beach Rd. To see the map, go to www.nbnco.com.au/assests/ maps/south-arm-tas-rollout-map-7shr.pdf

It takes about 12 months from the start of construction until the NBN is available from telephone or internet service providers.

## South Arm Fire Brigade

Winter is almost here once again and home heaters will soon be going flat out. At this time of year the Brigade switches from bush fire 'mode' to house fires, and we so are concentrating our training on



responding to structural fires and the use of Breathing Apparatus.

Fire permits are not required now, but if you are planning to do some burning off, please register your burn with the TFS by free-calling 1800 000 699 to avoid unnecessary brigade responses.

Over the last few winters there have been quite a number of house fires in Tasmania and the last thing anyone wants is more of the same. One of the causes has been people putting clothes to dry far too close to wood or electric heaters. If you do use your heater to dry clothes please remember, "A metre from the heater is close enough."

There is plenty of evidence that smoke alarms save lives, but the batteries need to be changed regularly. Did you change your smoke alarm batteries when the clocks changed recently? If you want any advice on fire protection for your house or property please contact the Brigade Captain Richard Calvert on 6239 9412.



## FLU VACCINATION CLINICS



most serious strains of influenza that are likely to impact Australia this year. To those people who missed our clinics this year we apologise, and hope to be able to give more notice next year and promote the clinics more widely. If you would like to be immunised against influenza it is not too late; speak to your regular doctor about being vaccinated.

#### **BOWEL CANCER SCREENING**

It is that time of year again when we want to raise your awareness of bowel cancer screening. Screening for bowel cancer using a FOB test is one of the most effective ways to detect bowel cancer in its early stages. Research over many years has shown that population screening every 1-2 years with a FOB test can reduce the number of deaths due to bowel cancer by up to 33%.

There is a Federal Government funded screening program that issues a test kit to each Australian aged 50, 55, 60 and 65 years. For everyone else, we have the BowelScreen tests available all year round. This style of test is the recommended method of screening for bowel cancer in people aged 50 years and over with no symptoms or increased risk due to family history. The BowelScan test does not require any special preparation, dietary or medication restrictions. Screening should be repeated every 1-2 years.

Have you thought about joining the Garden Club? We meet monthly, go on excursions and look at local gardens too. In mid April a group of 21 we went up the Derwent Valley to the lovely old estate of Redlands. As this newsletter is being printed we will be going to the Botanical Gardens. Several visits to local gardens on the peninsula are also planned.

#### **GARDENING TIPS FOR WNTER**

- The Peninsula grows great potatoes and now is the time to put in your early potatoes, it's a good time for broad beans and salad onions too.
- Perennials and annuals can also be planted now.
- Lemon trees can be planted. This year my Meyer had a profusion of fruit on it. I had placed it in a sunny sheltered patio area with a brick wall behind it. This wall radiates heat and helps keep the temperature up. I also give it lots of mushroom compost and alpaca poo, water regularly. **Tip**: citrus do better in the ground not in pots as they will dry out in the pots too easily.
- Compost your autumn leaves.
- Remove and bag all mummified fruit still on trees or on the ground. Put them in a plastic bag and into the household rubbish.

Over the last four exhibitions, we've not only showcased and celebrated an amazing array of local talent, we've raised around \$15,000 for Legacy (Tasmania).



# History and Heritage: Looking back to our early settlers in South Arm

This month we continue the life of **Robert Alomes**, the spelling of the name Alomes (sometimes Allommes or Allomes) appears to have been chosen by several relatives in the late 18th Century. In September 1812 Robert was granted 130 acres of land at Sorell, Robert married Elizabeth nee Bellett, she was seventeen years old and Robert was thirty nine. Their first child to be born was Robert Charles Alomes who married Miss Jane Wood on 25th February 1844. They raised seven children four boys and three girls.

The third child to Robert and Jane was Elizabeth Maria Allomes born 17th August 1820; she married Christopher Calvert (jnr) on the 19th October 1869. Christopher and his eight brothers all learnt farming in South Arm. When William Gellibrand passed away in 1840, the land at the Arm End was leased by Christopher Calvert (jnr) who farmed there until 1914. Following an Auction of the farm equipment he moved to Hobart the head stone at St Barnabas Church South Arm shows he died in Hobart 11th June 1925. His wife Elizabeth died in Hobart 24th April 1877 she is buried in Res T. Downie New Warf Hobart. We continue with George Thomas Alomes who came to South Arm when he rented land from George Gellibrand. He married (1) Janet McKay 4th January 1855, (2) Agnes Musk; in 1861 he leased 220 acres from Gellibrand named it "Rosemount". To his first wife Janet seven children were born, due to reasons unknown three children died at a very young age. Janet died the 6th December 1864. On the 1st December 1867 George Alomes married Agnes Musk. They had three children Edward (Ted) Ethel and Leslie. George Alomes became a very prominent person within South Arm working together with the farmers. He played an active part with the others in the South Arm Roads Trust 1875 -1907 in conjunction with the Clarence Council. He also took part in several inquests into the accidents and deaths that happened within the South Arm area in those early years. When I look back in the old papers (now available online) his name appears in many articles over his life time. George Alomes younger brother John James born 21st February 1854 also leased land in South Arm and named it "Green Hill." John James Alomes and his wife Rosina raised three children. When John passed away 7th May 1894 age 40 yrs, the youngest son Henry Edward Alomes took over the farm with his mother Rosina. Henry like many others became very involved as secretary of the building committee for the St Barnabas Church 1892. Henry Alomes married Elizabeth Heywood 27th March 1883, of the four children born only the youngest daughter Isabel Rosina Alomes lived to carry this family to the next generation, Daisy and Darcy Alomes died very young also Mervyn John Alomes died 3rd June 1900 age 16 years. The very first home at "Green Hill" was closer to Ralphs Bay shoreline with the road way passing this property and continued around the shores of Ralphs Bay to Seacroft Bay and the home of Christopher and Hannah Calvert. At the time the road we travel on today through South Arm was only a track and appears on the early titles as carriage way to be kept clear at all times for the conveyance of produce by the farmers of South Arm. Isabel Rosina Alomes married Alan Calvert 29th July 1910, they had a new home built and named the property "Ralphsdene." Alan was the sixth child of John and Elizabeth Calvert of "Pleasant View" South Arm now Fort Direction. To be Continued

# Paul Healy's New Improved Winter Worming Mash

For healthy chickens take a preventative approach and make your own winter worming mash. This recipe is for 10 birds, based on 100g per bird.

1 litre of milk

1 knob of dark purple garlic

3 hot chillies

1 tbsp each turmeric, paprika, cayenne pepper

10 grams whole cloves

10 grams freshly grated nutmeg

10 grams crumbled cinnamon stick

20 grams freshly grated ginger

1 pinch seaweed meal per bird

1 kg commercial ground meal (or 7 parts wheat, 2 parts barley, one part oats or other grain)

#### 250g freshly grated organic carrot

#### 250g freshly grated organic apple

Warm the milk in a pan, crush and add the garlic immediately along with chopped chillies, all spices, ginger and seaweed meal. Stand overnight. In the morning warm up the mixture at the crack of dawn and add to the ground meal along with the fresh carrot and apple. The chooks should be starved for the 24 hours previously and the meal should be given on the last weekend before the full moon.

## Recipe—Spicy Red Lentil Soup with Yogurt

- ½ cup (100g) dried red lentils rinse under cold water until water runs clear
- 1 litre (4 cups) chicken stock
- 1 can (400g) diced tomatoes (or fresh)
- 2 dried bay leaves
- 3 cloves garlic, crushed
- a few large dollops of a mild curry paste
- 2 small carrots, chopped coarsely
- 1 stalk celery, chopped coarsely
- 2 medium potatoes, chopped coarsely

Combine all ingredients in a slow cooker, on low, for 6 hours. Season with pepper and salt. Serve with ½ cup Greek style yoghurt and ½ cup chopped fresh coriander (if it takes your fancy) and crusty bread. Serves about 4 people.




