#### THEFT OF SOUTH ARM RESERVES SIGNAGE

CAN YOU HELP? Signage entering reserves along South Arm Highway have been subject to theft recently. This signage is important for visitors and locals alike,



marking entry points to reserves, and as reminders of the regulations that apply. With a replacement cost of approximately \$400 per sign the theft of these at six locations is a significant loss. The time and resources to manufacture and replace these stolen signs will be at the expense of managing reserves in this region.



#### FOOD CONNECTIONS CLARENCE PROGRAM

South Arm will become a hub for the Food Connections Clarence Program. The aim of this program is to provide packaged cooked food to older isolated people in the community. The meals are cooked fortnightly and distributed from Geilston Bay High School. The school sources produce for the nutritious meals through donations from Second Bite Tasmania and also purchases additional produce where required. Catering students from the school prepare the meals from a fully equipped commercial kitchen on site and the menus are well vetted. These meals are made available to community hubs to be distributed to residents at a very minimal cost. Our Garden Club often has visits to gardens on the Peninsula where we pick up tips on how to be water-wise, mulching, planting shrubs, flowers and vegetables. With the lack of water for some on the Peninsula and the sandy soil, having a garden can be a bit of a challenge. We recently had a most enjoyable garden club outing to Darryl and Lu Howlin's and afterwards to Rae Calvert's, both in Opossum Bay.

Both gardens had much to offer by way of inspiration. The avenue of Acacia baileyana at Rae's was an absolute picture, while the vegetable and also the walled garden at Darryl and Lu's was amazing. (You may have bought bok choy or chillies off them at the market recently). Their vegetable patch is extensive and getting bigger while the walled garden has around half a dozen citrus trees, all very healthy. It was interesting to see that they used lawn clippings for mulch. No sign of weeds!

If you are interested in joining the Garden Club we meet on a monthly basis on the Monday after the Community Market at the beginning of the month. At present the starting time is 3pm. So just come along and find out more about what activities we have or talk to someone on our market stall at the market.

## COMMUNITY PHARMACY Know Your Numbers



#### What is blood pressure?

Blood pressure (BP) is a measurement of the force your blood puts ion blood pressure walls as it travels through your body. Blood pressure varies throughout the day to meet your body's need and most people cannot feel when it is high. High blood pressure is sometimes called the 'silent killer' because sufferers can have high blood pressure and show no warning signs. High blood pressure can lead to a number of complications including stroke and heart attack.

#### But what is normal?

Normal blood pressure is 120/80 or lower. A reading between 120/80 and 140/90 is considered high normal. BP greater than 140/90 is high and requires further investigation and/or management. BP greater than 160/100 requires urgent attention.

#### What is a stroke?

A stroke happens when blood going to the brain is interrupted. Blood is carried to the brain by blood vessels called arteries. Blood may stop moving through an artery because the artery is blocked or has burst. The lower your BP, the lower your risk of stroke.

## BLESSINGTON COASTAL RESERVE ACTIVITY PLAN 2013-18

The *Blessington Coastal Reserve Activity Plan 2013-18* has been adopted by Council and is available for viewing on the Clarence City Council website www.ccc.tas.gov.au.

It is pleasing to announce that funding has been allocated in Council 2013-4 budget to implement some of the Plan's recommendations. These include the drafting of a track options report namely 'South Arm Track Investigation' which proposes three options for the alignment of the track linking Spring Beach to St. Johns Beach. In accord with the Plan this report will form the basis of an extensive community consultation program to engage the South Arm Community on their preferences in relation to the linkage track. This consultation period will be heralded by a mail out to all residents in South Arm as well as installation of signs at the Reserves entrances. These will invite interested folk to view the South Arm Track Investigation report on the Council website. Both the mail out and the website will also detail how to register your preferences using an Options Registration Form.

Another project to be funded this year will be the construction of a track connecting the South Arm Car park along the upper Jetty Rd service road to the Reserve entrance. This gravel track will be constructed in association with the upgrading and sealing of the lower Jetty Road and footpath.

## RECIPE — Simple Date Balls

1 & 1/2 cups of dates1 cup raw almonds1/4 cup cocoa powder1 tsp vanilla1/2 tsp cinnamon

- 1 Soak dates in boiling water for about 10 mins to soften them up.
- 2 In a food processor blend almonds until they are chopped into small pieces.
- 3 Add all the remaining ingredients and blend until it becomes one big clump.
- 4 Roll in balls and serve or refrigerate.

This recipe is easy to adapt — use cashews or walnuts instead of almonds, shredded coconut, honey, nut butters, raisins, dried goji berries and dark chocolate and even frozen raspberries. 

#### **GET A HEADSTART ON YOUR** SPRING GARDEN

It's almost too late to prune your fruit trees now. Although it's harder to see the structure of the tree in full leaf, it is better to prune mid-summer in small gardens where size needs to be contained.

In the flower garden, now is a good time to cut back Salvias, Erigeron (Sea Daisy), Plectranthus, etc. If you haven't pruned your roses that could be done now and miniature rose bushes can be cut back to 1/3.

#### **PLANT NOW:**

- Artichoke off-sets (suckers)
- Asparagus and rhubarb crowns both of these grow well down here, but need lots of manure and mulch and regular water the first year to give them a good start.
- Divide up your chives and plant them as path borders, they look great and it's good to have lots of chives (Mondo grass, the trendy path border, isn't edible)
- Certified seed potatoes (planning to have them pop up AFTER the frosts have gone);
- also shallots, potato onions, garlic cloves and oca (Oxalis tuberosa).
- Sturdy young seedlings of cabbage, cauliflower, celery, broccoli, lettuce, onion and leeks.

Sow direct: peas (including delicious snow peas), broad beans, turnips, swedes, Asian brassicas, English spinach and onions.

Sow under glass (Sept) tomatoes, zucchini, in containers (or a sunny spot inside), give sweet corn a miss unless you have plenty of water. Start that pumpkin for the pumpkin competition next May!!!

#### HISTORY AND HERITAGE: Looking back to our early settlers in South Arm

Henry Alomes and his son in-law Alan Calvert continued to produce a quantity of apples and pears for the UK and Sydney market. You could say eighty percent of the farmers were in production of all varieties of fruit with some growing apricots and melons for the jam market which was sold to H. Jones & Co. Hobart. The two brothers Edward and Leslie Alomes continued farming until Leslie Alomes sold his portion of land to Mr. Robert Giblin who then sold it to Mr. Murrium Sweet in 1960. Mr. Sweet commenced the development we now know as Oakleigh Subdivision and Blessington

Street. It was 1962 when Pauline and I purchased our first block of land; in the photo here you can view the very first homes to be built overlooking the jetty and water front. The owners were Mr. Ian Kerslake, Mr. Ron Alderton, and Mr. & Mrs. Quon. In the lower left hand corner of the photo is our home then under construction. Mr. Ron Alderton was selling the

blocks of land as he was working in real estate at the time; he built his home as he viewed it as the perfect spot to retire. The subdivision was built in three stages as the blocks sold Murrium would open up the next stage. The old homestead "Oakleigh" which was named by the late Leslie Alomes can be seen in the centre with the remains of the horse stables and the old barn. Mr. Sweet was a much laid back semi-retired person who had lived most of his life in New South Wales. He had been involved with the development of land in the area of Picton N.S.W. He would be well remembered by many of the people who purchased a block of land along Blessington Street. As the first South Arm R.S.L. had just been completed it became a popular place to find Murrium on a warm sunny day and many a deal for a block of land was conducted while having a beer or two. He was a man who fitted in well with the community in those days to the point if there was any reason to have a party he would invite everyone along supply a barrel of beer and organize the entertainment for the children in the way of a roundabout, this was supplied and operated by Mr. Mick Savage. Today we can see some of the mistakes that were made as some of the blocks of land were too small which meant many purchased two blocks together so as to build a larger home. Others purchased a five or ten acre block as these became available. This story will be continued in the next issue. MAURICE POTTER
