Farewell Little Bee

At the end of the month our community will say farewell to Little Bee South Arm which has been offering early years learning and child care services in South Arm for nearly two years. Despite the best efforts of both Little Bee and the SAPRA committee in promoting the centre —



and this includes many events, initiatives and programs designed to attract families and wider community support – its services have simply not been taken up. The centre has run at a loss for some time and is no longer financially viable. It will close its doors on Wednesday 29th February 2012.

The staffing team at Little Bee South Arm has given the centre their whole hearts and a tremendous amount of energy. Their thanks goes out to the local families who have supported the centre and given the staff the chance to showcase the exceptional education and care that Little Bee prides itself on.

For families that do need care and are interested in staying with Little Bee, there are a few vacancies remaining at the Little Bee Airport Centre, phone 6248 5994. Alternatively, the Childcare Access Hotline Number is 1800 670 305. The new Discovery Centre at Lauderdale Primary School is due to open early in 2012 and should be able to cater for new families.

SAPRA News Update

We hope you've all had a wonderful festive holiday – the SAPRA committee has enjoyed a break from meetings over the festive season but has still been working in the background on various issues. The closure of Little Bee is very sad for our area and we hope the families affected will soon find alternative arrangements. As well as the impact on families and the loss of such a facility for the community, SAPRA – which sub-let the building to Little Bee – now has the challenge of finding a use (or uses) for the building which meets a community need. Whilst the preference is for the centre to generate an income which can be reinvested in our community as has been happening over recent years, the greater emphasis is on the building being used. Don't forget; this looks like being a hot, dry summer, so unless there has been <u>substantial</u> rain during the week please make sure your tree/trees are watered. Those planted last year (2011) should have 2 litres of water each week, and trees planted in 2010 should be watered each fortnight.

You may notice your tree has some mulch around it, two or three kind volunteers have been putting the mulch around the trees to ensure the moisture stays in the soil.



South Arm Fire Brigade

We are now in the middle of the fire season and the Brigade urges all residents and shack owners to be familiar with the fire danger levels.

For all emergencies ALWAYS CALL 000 do NOT call members of the First Responders or Fire Brigade. This could result in unnecessary delays and stress for all.

During the bushfire season, fire danger ratings forecast for Tasmania will be available on the Bureau of Meteorology website, the Tasmania Fire Service website and on the weather page of Tasmania's daily newspapers. You should listen for warnings on ABC Radio or check the TFS website at www.fire.tas.gov.au to find out where fires are burning. Power supplies and phones are likely to fail in a bushfire. If power fails, listen to fire updates on your car radio.



During Fire Danger Levels of Catastrophic (black), Extreme (red), Severe (orange), and Very High (yellow) you should frequently check conditions outside your home. If smoke is blowing towards you, a fire is approaching and you should leave immediately by a safe route, away from the fire. Please don't wait for an official warning. If ash or burning embers are landing in your yard, the fire is very close and it may be too late to leave. If this is the case, take shelter in your home. Fill your bath and all available containers with water, and actively defend your home by using the water to put out any parts of your home that catch fire. Alternatively and if time permits, go immediately to a nearby safe place.

The TFS have a number of booklets/brochures available via their website http://www.fire.tas.gov.au/Show?pageId=colPublications or by contacting the Brigade. These include: Bushfire Prepare to Survive With Bushfire Survival Plan, Using Fire Outdoors and Fire Resisting Garden Plants. Also available through the TFS is the Bushfire Prepare to Survive DVD and again the Brigade has a number of copies available for distribution.

These three places are owned by the council and leased to the Calverton Hall Committee. All are available for use by local people. There are charges available on application.


To book the Hall please ring Joan Griffiths on 6239 9141. The Hall is well equipped with chairs, tables, crockery

Local History

CRICKET AT MUDDY PLAINS

A young boy, John Watson arrives in Hobart Town 1st May 1825 accompanied by his parents, two sisters, Martha and Hannah, and a brother Thomas. John was just ten years of age. His father William Watson was a farmer prior to leaving Yorkshire in the UK, on arrival he was granted acreage on 11th June 1825 at Sandford, known then as Muddy Plains. Unfortunately William Watson died a few years after so his wife, Hannah decided to return to the farm in the UK accompanied by her daughters, leaving her son John on the property at Muddy Plains. She received word that William had left the estate to his son and Hannah and her two daughters remained in England and did not return until some years later. For a boy to be left to establish a farm at such a young age would have been an effort on its own. John Watson married Amelia Matilda Alomes 25th September 1849. John Watson became well known in the South Arm district and achieved a name as one of the best sportsman and cricketer in his time. I am unable to establish if John Watson was the first to hold cricket matches between the local men. The earliest report I have found of a match taking place between Married Men and Single Men was in March 1859, held at York Grove, the Watson family home at Muddy Plains. Names of those taking part were: J. Watson (as Captain), J Calvert, D. Calvert, J. Alomes, W. Winspere, G. Alomes, C. Pedder, B. Ware, C. Calvert, Graves and Huxley for the Married Men. For the Single Men: C. May, O. May, T. Richardson, C. Lowther, O. Pedder, J. Alomes, (surnames only) Standley, Hitchcock, Richardson, Richardson, Calvert, and Winspere. The scores were Married Men 76 runs, and the Single Men 78 runs. From that time

several cricket matches were played at York Grove on a field that John had prepared. His team was selected from the local people mostly farmers between Sandford and South Arm.

Reports show his team playing a team from Sorell on the 22nd March 1882 against Muddy Plains (132 runs) and Sorell (101 runs). John Watson was regarded as a very keen sports man participating in ploughing contests on his property; he was also reported to be a very good shot with the fowling piece (shot gun). To



Pipe Clay Coastcare Inc Project

As part of the Be Natural Landcare grants program, Cremorne group, Pipe Clay Coastcare Inc has been awarded a grant of \$4,545 to work on a local environmental project which will see the group connecting with its local community. A total of \$125,000 of funding has been awarded through this grants program to 28 groups across the country to help them continue their work with on-going environmental projects. The projects are diverse in nature and range from a BeachCare project on Queensland's Gold Coast to building shelters for possums and gliders in Victoria.





Pipe Clay Coastcare Inc will put the funding towards a project that will include the construction of a walking track and ramps to allow better access around the Cremorne Spit while protecting the dunes by limiting sand dispersion. The group will also erect information

signage to educate community members about the weeds and birds that exist in the area and general dune care.

Rachel Viney of Pipe Clay Coastcare Inc believes that the funding provided through the Be Natural Landcare grants program will make a huge difference to the breadth of activities that the group will be able to undertake. "This Be Natural funding could not come at a better time. One of the key aims of our group is to protect the dunes around Cremorne while increasing awareness and understanding of coastal issues among the local community. Through this grant we will be able to keep local people informed about the ongoing project while encouraging them to get involved," she said.

Landcare Australia has been in partnership with Be Natural Cereals and Snacks since 2010 and earlier this year launched this grants program by bringing native Australia bushland to the city through the recreation of an area of native vegetation in Sydney's Martin Place.
