South Arm School News

Welcome back for 2012. This year is shaping up to be fantastic. We have increased enrolments, a new school van, new staff and the school has a real vibrancy.

On the school's behalf, I forward my thanks to the whole community for their support in a range of areas including volunteers help with the Coles and Woollies docket collection, the school Fair and so much more. The school is an integral part of the community and volunteers and community support are a vital part of supporting our children.

It is disappointing to read in a recent *Mercury* article that South Arm Primary is on the hit list for closure. The newspaper made this prediction before State Cabinet had even addressed the School Viability Group report. This kind of knee jerk reporting creates uncertainty in people's minds and undermines (cont. p.2)

community confidence in the school and the school's future. **South Arm Primary will not close.** We are a growing school serving our community with quality and comprehensive education

programs. The school out performs many larger schools academically and in inter school sports.

We have an experienced, high quality and dedicated staff who provide an amazing program for the students. This includes all the basic areas, Indonesian, German, leadership programs, arts and performance activities, cultural programs, gifted education, health and wellbeing courses and sustainable living activities (including our veggie gardens) and more.

We also have specialist teachers for Music, Health and Physical Education and Art. We enjoy the dedication and involvement of a significant number of community volunteers and I often boast that I have one of the largest School Association groups of any school in the state.

If the reporters had taken the time to really investigate they would have found that South Arm Primary will not close for a range of reasons: steady enrolment growth, quality comprehensive programming, quality management and staffing and more. The report indicated a need to address school catchment areas and bus options, which does not seem to have been addressed in the article.

With Lauderdale being just about full there is a need to look at shared school catchments and re-alignment of bus routes which will only benefit the future enrolment of South Arm. A small word of caution here: one of the key reasons South Arm School is as good as it is, is because it is not BIG. I would not like to see the school grow much more than it is. This year we have added a new class and there is just room for one more class group.

The school was not designed or built to accommodate many more students than we already have. Even in these difficult economic times it must be recognised that schools are not factories and money alone cannot be the driver for rationalisation of schools. I tell the staff that one of my key roles is to support them to provide the very best education opportunities we can. And I continually challenge the staff to fulfil this.

I can look at the NAPLAN results to see how we are going but a better indicator is the comprehensive information we collect with our in-school testing; this currently shows us on a positive wave of achievement. However, the best indicators are the happy engaged children I see every day in the classrooms and the positive feedback from parents and the community. Is it the NAPLAN test for Grade 3 children in numeracy or is it children trying their best, supported by quality teachers, making real progress (at their own rate), having fun and making friends? I believe it is the latter.

I hope the South Arm Community is as proud of the school, the children and the staff as I am. Let me reassure the whole community that I firmly believe South Arm Primary will not close and the school has a vibrant and positive future for many years to come. **Stephen Fagg—Principal**

'Flu clinics 2012 - 2 down 1 to go
South Arm Community Pharmacy has once again held successful 'flu vaccination clinics in conjunction with Lauderdale Doctors Surgery. The first two clinics were held in March and completed vaccinations for 110 people. We have negotiated to have a Saturday clinic this year for all of you who work, or who may have missed the first two clinics.

There is to be one **final clinic for this year – SATURDAY 14 APRIL**, from 9am -12noon. Bookings are required and are filling fast. Your consultation with the doctor and nurse is bulk-billed and people who fit one of the following criteria receive the vaccination free of charge:

- Aged over 65
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged over 15
- Pregnant women
- People medically at risk, eg people with heart disease, chronic respiratory conditions (asthma, emphysema), diseases of the neuromuscular system or impaired immunity.

If you don't fit one of the mentioned criteria, you can still be immunised but there will be a small fee. This year's vaccine contains the same 'flu strains as last year, including the swine 'flu, but you should still receive it again this year even if you had a jab last year. This is required to boost your immunity as each vaccination only lasts 1 year.

Local History - CRICKET AT MUDDY PLAINS (Cont.)

John and Amelia Watson and their son William Robert Watson of York Grove were well known for their hospitality to the people of Sandford and South Arm district. On 25 October 1882, William married Alice Eliza Bellette of Sorell. William and Alice became hard workers for the local St Barnabas Church. Just as his father did he continued as a cricketer and in several other sporting events. It seems that the cricket matches played at York Grove on the Watson's property continued up to 1888-90. As we know the Calverton hall was built in 1895 and used as the cricket club rooms. This was the time when teams from South Arm, Sandford and Rokeby appeared to be playing matches against each other. William Watson played for the best part of 70 years and was reported at the meetings as the best average bowler for South Arm. He played the grand old game of cricket when it was in its infancy in the district, and had not missed a season from the age of 15 to 75; a great record. In the early days he was seen carrying a spade to clear the pitch from bumps and was in his 88th year when he died. Mr Watson was a great sportsman, in the bush and at the range, and had always been amongst the winners. Mrs Alice Watson was one of the earliest State school teachers at South Arm. **Maurice Potter**

Halfmoon Bay - Halfmoon Bay residents have been meeting to discuss solutions to last year's sea water breach of the sand dunes at Halfmoon Bay including dune stabilisation and regeneration solutions for the area. The main issue we have confronted has been ownership of the sand dune area, which is currently in a private name of a person who is now deceased. In normal circumstances this land would be owned either by the Crown or Local Government and we are looking at land transfer options. This private ownership extends along a section of South Arm beach and currently impacts how we, as a community, can manage and maintain this land into the future, particularly in response to the effects of human impact and climate change. We are currently looking at solutions to resolve these land ownership issues and would like to invite interested community members to (a) express their interest in providing input to development of a Plan of Management for the South Arm Beach dune system and foreshore and/or (b) tell us what the beach (and the dunes) means to you and what changes you have observed over time that may be of interest to the project group.
