Will there be a GP in South Arm?

In late 2011, a survey was distributed via the SAPRA newsletter with the aim of determining the level of resident interest in establishing a general practice in



Public Meeting was held on 3 April 2012 at the South Arm RSL to present the results of the South Arm Peninsula Health Services Survey and discuss the next steps required to facilitate establishing a general practice in the South Arm area. Approximately 50 people attended, including members of SAPRA, 3 GPs, RSL subbranch President Terry Roe and other interested community members. Unfortunately, no one representing Clarence City Council was able to attend. Dr Shane

the South Arm area and also to establish current levels of health services use. A

Jackson presented the results of the survey to which about 20% of the community responded. In brief:
72% of people had seen a doctor in the previous month. Approximately half of the respondents currently use the practice at Lauderdale, and 79% of respondents indicated they would be likely to change to a practice in South Arm. Most

- Data showed that there would enough work for a half-time GP. A solo practice
 operating half time would not be financially viable in isolation, however, there
 would be potential to have part-time allied health services 3-4 days each week.
- The ball-park cost of establishing a new practice would be \$50,000.

respondents indicated a preference for a practice to be open all day.

- Federal Funding may be available to assist in establishing a practice, and the Council may be able to assist.
- A community petition may be of value in sourcing funding.
- Two locations for the practice have been discussed; the Community Centre and the empty space adjacent to the pharmacy each have pros and cons.
- Learning from recent experience in Geeveston and Brighton in (re-)establishing a general practice may be valuable in this process.

PIPE CLAY. Over the coming months we will be busy with revegetation work along our fragile dunes and it is anticipated that finalising work on the spit walk track will commence in June.

SOUTH ARM. Council have advised they are anticipating that the Blessington Coastal Reserve Activity Plan will be developed before the end of the year. Besides significant low level community engagement and promotion for the coastcarers once completed, the Council will be available to do some priority activities.

Next year we will participate in 'Trees for Mums'. Perhaps we could plant White Gums (Euc. Viminalis) for Mums AND for the Forty Spotted Paradalote, just in case any of those little birds blow across from Bruny!

The Council have begun a substantial monitoring program for South Arm Beach with a strong focus on the Halfmoon Bay area using a new aerial photo technology to provide high resolution beach imaging. This will help develop long term understanding of the beach to see if it is eroding and if so at what rate.



History and Cultural Heritage

WHEN WAS THE OLD HOUSE BURNED DOWN? The proposal to build a links golf course on Arm End at the Northern end of South Arm Peninsula has prompted us to establish its history and cultural heritage for documentation. This is important for future generations to know about the buildings, places and people who established our community.

We already know that William Gellibrand was the original grantee and built his homestead on Arm End around 1825. We know he built his own vault and that two of his grandsons are buried beside him there. When he died his land passed to his daughter and grandsons. We also know that Christopher Calvert Jnr. leased the land and lived in the Gellibrand homestead until he retired and moved to Hobart. In 1914 there was an auction of farm machinery and animals. It was about this time or soon after that the house slipped into disrepair and was eventually burned down, possibly accidently.

Over the years the pleasure craft owners of Hobart pulled in to Mary Ann Bay or the Spit at Ralphs Bay to spend the day or stay overnight. Many of these people befriended Christopher Calvert and he welcomed them to picnic or camp ashore. Can you help us to determine when the house was destroyed? Maybe you remember the house on the rise above Mary Ann Bay. Perhaps you have relatives who spent time there or passed on stories to you. Whooping Cough

The number of people diagnosed with whooping cough in Australia is the highest in 20 years. In 2011 there were 342 cases in Tasmania and so far this year there have been 266 cases. Whooping cough is а highly respiratory contagious infection; although the infection is mild in adults it can be life threatening for vulnerable babies and is easily spread. The most effective way to prevent whooping cough is to get vaccinated. The national Immunisation Program recommends boosters for:

- Couples planning a pregnancy
- parents (including Breastfeeding mothers
- Grandparents
- Adults working with young children e.g. childcare workers
- Other household adult members or carers of young children
- All healthcare workers


