FLU SEASON has arrived!



It has been widely reported that the flu season this year is particularly bad. Influenza (or flu) comes around in winter; vaccination is your best protection. The 2012 flu vaccine helps protect you against 3 of the most common strains of flu - influenza A (H3N2 and H1N1) & Influenza B. People who had the vaccine in 2011 still need to get a vaccine in 2012 as immunity from the vaccine only lasts a short time and it is important to have a high number of antibodies circulating in our bodies to protect us. Free influenza vaccine is available for:

- anyone aged 65 or over
 - pregnant women
 - Indigenous people aged over 15 yrs
 - people from six months of age with medical conditions, such as heart & lung disease, cancers, HIV, asthma & diabetes.
- See your GP for the influenza vaccine. Those eligible for the free vaccine may still have to pay a consulting fee, just like a regular appointment. People who are not eligible for a free vaccine can purchase the vaccine via pharmacy prescription. We still have stocks of the 2012 Fluvax available.

Prevent the spread of flu. As well as getting the seasonal flu shot, there are some basic steps we can all take to help prevent the spread of flu this winter. **Cont...p. 4**

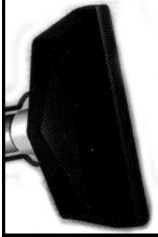

Arm End History

With so much interest at the present time about the northern end of the South Arm Peninsula and what we all call Arm End, I felt it was time to talk about some early history and about what has been described by the people who lived through the period when it was still being developed. A letter written in 1825 by the grantee of the land himself William Gellibrand told how he found several small wells of fresh water supply for his sheep, by which time he had a stock of 500 sheep grazing on the land. I was fortunate to have a visit in 2007 by Jan Holloway who was trying to locate Mortimer Bay which we all know is on the East side of Ralphs Bay. Jan explained her connection with Henry Mortimer and his family who in 1825 established their home and farm at Mortimer Bay. Some time after I received a copy of a letter from Jan written by Martha Jane Maritz nee Mortimer who was a young girl born September 1834, she also had two sisters and two brothers. In the letter Jane described the times spent staying with Mr. Gellibrand and his house keeper Mrs. Watkins. It was 1839 and Henry Mortimer decided to move his family to Victoria, leaving the three girls Jane, Ann & Salina with Mr. Gellibrand while they made arrangements for the move, she went on to describe how Mr. Gellibrand went each morning to dig the area that the vault now stands. She also mentions how an old fisherman named Jimmy lived in a hut by the beach (possibly Mary Ann Beach) as remains of a building has been found within that area. Henry Mortimer chartered the Brig Caroline (Captain Stains) they left Hobart 4th December 1839, the vessel hove to opposite South Arm and Mrs. Watkins took the three girls out in one of their yachts. Mr. Gellibrand had two boats the "Amphitrite" and the "Star". From the remains of the home established by Gellibrand and later aerial imaging has been possible to determine the position of the home plus a description passed on by the late Ruby Gellibrand wife of Thomas, who lived at Glenvar Opossum Bay. Although there is very little to show today we do know that quite a small orchard was established on the lower level against the bank of what we know as the Spit. Following the passing of William Gellibrand 1840, some years later the farm was leased to Christopher Calvert Jr. till the time he retired 1915 and moved to Hobart. Mr. George Richardson leased the Arm End in 1948, he appointed a manager Mr. Arthur Thompson. It was 1852 when Mr. Geoff Calvert purchased the property. The land today is in under the control of the National Parks & Wild Life with a proposal to lease the land for a links golf course to be established.

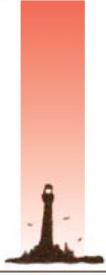

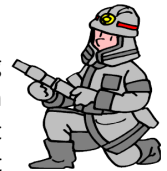
South Arm Fire Brigade

History & Heritage

The South Arm History Sub-Committee recently received a **Convict Trail Grant** and have begun research into the convicts assigned to the Gellibrand family and those who settled in South Arm after receiving their pardons. So far around 40 convicts, men and women, have been identified, with some interesting stories about their lives and early contributions to establishing our community. The project runs for 12 months and will result in an interesting and informative attraction for both locals and tourists along the bike path.

Another project recently achieved was the **ABC open 'Now and Then' photography project**. The history team went out into the community with historical photographs and re-took them in the same location, the old over the new to give the illusion of creating a window into the past comparing then and now. Around 70 pictures were taken some of which appear on the ABC website. Visit: abc.net.au/open and click on the Now and Then project, choose Tasmania, then Opossum Bay or South Arm. These photographs will be on display at the Community Centre.

Join us for our Sunday **"Afternoons & Coffeespoons"** events at the Community Centre. We hope to make these regular events and the first in the series is a talk on Maritime History.
