History & Heritage

A lecture on the wrecks of South Arm was held at the community centre on 9 September. Those people who found the time to come along were very appreciative and learned a lot about maritime history over the years at South Arm. The group found it surprising to learn that the Captain's and crew survived such hard times on these vessels. Many of them, such as the Louise 1827, The Governor Sorell 1827, The Alfred and Lizzie 1894 and The Hope 1927 were all caught in terrible squally weather, some dragged anchor and ended up on Roaring Beach, now named Hope Beach. The Captain's and crew of all these vessels survived, others not so lucky.

The Prince of Wales 1842, struck the reef at Betsey Island on her voyage from Pittwater to Hobart in 1868 luckily all the crew were safe after the ordeal. The Lintrose Steamer, 104 tons, was caught in a heavy squall and began to flounder when rounding the Iron Pot heavily loaded with logs.

She drifted onto the reef at Cape Direction and became a total loss. The crew were saved by a passing boat.

I told many stories of boats lost or salvaged between the Iron Pot and the Northern end of the South Arm Peninsula between 1831 and 1916. In several cases the Captain's and crew did lose their lives. I spoke about the local farmers using a fleet known as Passage boats which they used to carry produce for the market in Hobart. Another highlight of the talk was the old sailing ships that raced in the Regatta's: The Foam, Huon Chief, Heather-Bell and the May Queen. I also looked back on the days of the steam driven boats that traded between Hobart and the coastal towns: The Excella, Togo, Seabird, Remere and the Cartela.

On-going weed control on Calverts Hill

Pipe Clay Coastcare Group has been busy with on-going weed work on Calverts Hill and adjacent reserve with thanks to NRM South who provided us with a \$3,300 Naturally Inspired Grant funded through the Federal Government's Caring for our Country Program. The project aims to undertake control works of Serrated Tussock,

African Boxthorn and Paterson's Curse.

This is being achieved through cooperation with Seven Mile Beach Parks and Wildlife Service and a contract weed controller. This work is a follow-up of previous grant efforts provided both by Tasmanian Landcare and the Federal Government's Caring for our Country program. Whilst these weeds will require on-going control this grant has been a significant boost to maintain the efforts already achieved.

Emphasis is on control of these declared weeds in the immediate forested area of the reserve which is home to the endangered *Eucalyptus Morrisbyi*. Calverts Hill is home to one of the last remaining stands of *E. Morrisbyi* which is under threat from these invaders. These declared weeds also exist in and around Cremorne. If you would like to find out more about these weeds go to the Invasive Species Weeds Index of the Department of Primary Industries, Water and Environment at www.dpiw.tas.gov.au.

Here are some tips to keep safe and keep snakes at bay:

- Keep grass short and the lower branches of trees and bushes trimmed off the ground where possible.
- Clean up building materials around the yard, such as piles of timber, bricks or sheets of corrugated iron.
- Keep rubbish and compost areas tidy.
- Be aware that chicken sheds and aviaries attract mice which attract snakes.
- On bigger blocks, put containers of water around the edge of your property to eliminate the need for snakes to come close to the house to drink.
- When working outside wear long pants, thick socks, boots and gloves.
- Snakes generally won't bit unless they are trodden on or backed into a corner.
- If you are bitten get immediate medical attention call 000. If a pet is bitten they will need immediate veterinary attention.
- If you see one, leave it alone and call **Reptile Rescue on 0407 565 181** and keep this number handy!



Congratulations and thanks to Coastcare, Garden Club, Hall Committee, SAPRA and the RSL. In July, 17 people turned up to plant the garden behind the BBQ at South Arm. They looked like ants swarming over a piece of toffee and in two hours the area was turned into a mulched garden with pathways. Something for everyone to enjoy.

Fox Eradication Operations

Over the past decade a number of physical items, including fox carcasses and scats, have been collected across the State which indicates that there is a small fox population in Tasmania. In response, the Fox Eradication Program (FEP) is conducting a fox baiting program to target core fox habitat ('ideal' fox habitat) across Tasmania. The targeted baiting operations will start in the Clarence Council area this spring and will continue through the local landscape over the next few months.

Strict measures are taken by the FEP in managing the fox baiting program. For example, fox baits are not laid within certain exclusion zones, including around residential areas, schools, and waterways and all properties being baited are clearly signposted on all access points. Baits remain on a property for 14-28 days.

Dog owners are asked to take extra precautions while baiting is occurring and to keep dogs out of areas being baited for foxes, or on lead at a minimum. Fox baiting programs are carefully designed to minimise risk to wildlife but baits are particularly toxic to dogs.

The FEP attended the SAPRA meeting recently to discuss community concerns about baiting the South Arm Area.

It was identified that there may be a temporary inconvenience to dog walkers using the area but once the FEP finishes (in a few weeks and probably before you receive this publication) all will be back to normal. **To learn about FEP operations in your area visit www.dpipwe.tas.gov.au/invasivespecies.**

1080 Baiting


Concerned residents of the South Arm peninsula have questioned the validity of the Fox eradication program. We would like to know how effective a one off baiting program is in eradicating such a huge threat to Tasmania's wildlife. Many landowners have exercised their right to refuse entry to the FEP. If such a threat was valid then it would be backed by a legal obligation forcing all landowners to comply. You are under no obligation to let the FEP bait your property. Why won't the FEP use the highly trained dogs before using 1080, which we all know, is dangerous to pets and wildlife? They expect to find nothing. Wildlife that dig such as bandicoots and bettongs may take these baits and according to wildlife vet Dr David Obendorf there is sufficient poison in one bait to kill an eastern barred bandicoot, a brown bandicoot or a Tasmanian bettong and definitely sufficient to kill a domestic dog. **Follow the debate at <http://tasmaniantimes.com>**
