WINSPEARS DEVELOPMENT at Halfmoon Bay

The new development proposed for Halfmoon Bay is a different style to any previously established in our area and rumours abound. In an attempt to help 'clear the air', SAPRA offered space for both the for and against arguments for this project.

Most of you either know Ian Grubb and myself or know the Protea Farm that Ian has been a part of since he was 19. Many of you have shaken your heads about the various enterprises he has started in an endeavour to keep the farm viable. Hopefully you all appreciate the tenacity it has taken for him to survive personal hardship, rising fuel, freight and other costs as well as a depressed agricultural economy. But now, after 32 years, Ian can no longer compete with the huge orchardists and the third-world flower farms.

We don't want to sell up and leave but our options are very limited. The council planning scheme does not allow us to subdivide (which would have been our preference) but there is a provision for Community Living which allows for strata-titled cottages with amenities available for residents. Unfortunately, we do not have the funds or commercial knowledge to tackle such an undertaking.

I (Ann) met Mr Peter Chen (Principal of G8 consultants) through my work in real estate. Mr Chen has been a property advisor / developer for 40 years, specializing in innovative projects in Australia and overseas. Yes, we know not all have been successful, but he has experience. His team of 12 specialist, professional consultants have carried out various technical assessments to set development parameters. The main areas were water (rain, bore and recycled), traffic (electric tricycles and car sharing will be available), environmental impact (a full report has been tabled), as well as eco-friendly sustainability.

Imagine - a development with 3 times the number of dwellings in Half Moon Bay; the Peninsula's population increasing by one third again in a short period of time and you'll get an idea of the scale of the proposed "Lifestyle Village".

How the development will affect you:

- Long term traffic increases of 150 or more commuters on South Arm Rd; constant heavy vehicle usage during construction and increased water carriers for new dwellings.
- It intends to draw its water from an already stressed water table, potentially leading to increased salinity levels. This same water table will receive the outflow from 150 wastewater disposal systems, and any associated contamination that may occur.
- The sudden influx of a large number of new dwellings will impact negatively on property values in South Arm, tipping the balance of housing supply and demand.
- By their own admission the developers are attempting to exploit a 'loophole' in the planning scheme which, if approved, will set a precedent that may result in rampant development in all areas subject to rural zoning.

Be wary of the developer's "eco" claims:

• The development budget is \$30 million – approx. \$200,000 per dwelling – enough for a standard kit home but nowhere near the budget required for sophisticated renewable technologies as claimed by the developers



- Construction of access roads and culde-sacs will result in removal of mature native trees that provide important wildlife habitat.
- Clarence City Council assesses the conservation priority of Musk Beach, adjacent to the development as 'Very High'. The development's presence would have an adverse visual impact from South Arm Rd, Musk Beach and the neck that is at odds with the fragile coastal location.

We believe this high density housing development will have an immediate negative impact on residents of the Peninsula and leave us with issues that will continue to impact for years to come. We all must decide now how WE want the Peninsula to grow.

Gellibrand Family continued.

Joseph Tice Gellibrand born 1826 was the third son of Joseph Tice Gellibrand (Attorney General of Tasmania) and Anne Isabella Gellibrand. He had an early education at St Johns College, Oxford UK returning to Tasmania briefly in 1847. In 1849 he was ordained Deacon by the Bishop of Bath and Wells. Returning to Tasmania that same year he married Salina Hannah Evans on 26 December 1849 and they set up home on the South Arm Peninsula. Joseph was ordained as a priest in 1850. One of my uncles has a bible presented to the Potter family by the Rev. Joseph T. Gellibrand during his time at South Arm.

While in Hobart Joseph became involved in building the All Saints' Church in South Hobart travelling there each time by boat from South Arm.

After retiring from the ministry in 1875 he ventured to New Zealand with Salina. Together they visited Dunedin and Christ-church then went on to England returning to Tasmania that same year. Joseph and Salina adopted a daughter who had been born 1848 at North Whitley Yorkshire UK. They

named her Elizabeth Winspear Gellibrand. (I have been unable to find any records for Elizabeth Winspear Gellibrand yet there was, and is, a property named Winspears at the time at South Arm. Possibly named after a family.)

Joseph his wife Salina and Elizabeth arrived in New Zealand by boat March 1876 and travelled from Dunedin to Christchurch in the South Island. During this period there was a war between the Maoris and the Imperial troops over land at Te Ranga in the North Island. A meeting between Joseph Tice Gellibrand and Penetaka (Chief of Pirirakau Maoris) April 9 1876 brought an end to hostilities. Captain Arthur Crapp who was a leader of the Imperial Troops subsequently married Elizabeth on 28 February 1878. On 27th April 1876 the Maori chief handed over the land at Omokoroa Point to Joseph T. Gellibrand, and the family settled in the North Island at the town of Omokoroa on 27 November 1877.

Fishing News


Recently at the South Arm Jetty there were people fishing who had come from New Norfolk, Moonah and Rokeby. The man from New Norfolk was waiting for dark to set in before heading off to the Neck to go floundering.

The guy and his partner from Moonah had only basic fishing skills and were getting plenty of bites but no fish. I helped them re-rig their lines with some small long shank hooks on a triple rig with a heavier lead on the bottom. I trimmed up some tiny strips of flathead (skin on) and showed them how to fish for whiting as it was obvious to me that the rat-a-tat bites they were getting were from school whiting. Within a few casts they were hooking and landing good size whiting. An old Fisho once told me that a school whiting will only touch a bait once. Whiting is one of the tastiest fish in the sea, just roll in flour after cleaning and shallow pan fry until golden brown.

The fellow from Rokeby, to many screams of both fear and delight, landed a small octopus. When he said he would have to cut his line to get it off I was quick to grab it remove the hook and turn the occy inside out. When he said he didn't want it I was delighted because my Australia Day lunch then became a fresh calamari taken from the Opossum Bay wharf and a fresh octopus from the South Arm jetty which were combined to make a delicious warm Greek style salad washed down with a Boags light. That's what living in Tassie is all about. Tasmania Dayeveryday!
