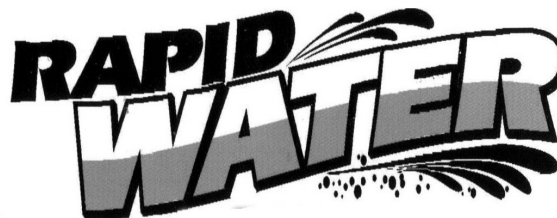

Rev. Joseph Tice Gellibrand (b) 1826 Hobart Town also listed as farmer owning house and land at South Arm 1866; Joseph married Salina Evans 26th December 1849. Before departing for New Zealand in March 1876 they adopted Elizabeth Winspear she was then 28 years old. (Reasons unknown) She became known as Elizabeth Winspear Gellibrand and married Arthur Crapp in Auckland New Zealand on 28th February 1878. Elizabeth's sister Hannah (b) 1850 married George James Morrisby 21st July 1877; she died on the 19th August 1877.

When Joseph Gellibrand went to New Zealand George Gellibrand took over the farm known as "Winspears" followed by his son Reginald Gellibrand who was then living at "Terra Linna". When I view all the family links, the name Winspear appears as the second name to many of the children born to these families in Tasmania. I would appreciate any information anyone has to offer about Mrs. Winspear when she was operating the farm 1852-1866.

Watson, Winspear & Gellibrand Families.

I have finally been able to establish the connection between these farming families at South Arm. Also how the farm name "Winspears" at Half moon Bay occurred.

William Watson living in England married Elizabeth (nee Hill) on 23rd December 1811. They raised four children John, Martha, Thomas and Hannah. William Watson, accompanied by his wife two sons and two daughters, came from the town of Whitby, Yorkshire UK, on the ship "Harvey" under Captain Peache in 1825. The voyage out was very long, around 11 months, due to very poor weather. On arrival Mr. Watson received a grant of land from Governor Arthur on the 11th June 1825. Unfortunately he died some years after their arrival and was buried in St. David's Cemetery.

John Edwin Watson inherited the farm; he was married some time later to Amelia Alomes the daughter of Robert and Elizabeth Alomes (nee Bellett). Robert Alomes was a sergeant of marines under Colonel David Collins. Mrs. William Watson and family returned to England. Martha and Thomas both stayed in England for some time, leaving the son John Watson to manage the farm at Muddy Plains.

On returning from England Hannah married Christopher Calvert. Martha Watson married William Winspear at Danby in Cleveland, Yorkshire 8th June 1847. They had four children, Elizabeth, (b) 1848, Watson (b) 1849, Hannah (b) 1850 and William (b) 1852. Martha & William Winspear with family sailed to Tasmania in 1852, William Winspear died on the voyage out 14th August 1852. It appears Martha Winspear started farming at South Arm with her very young family, the property being listed in the name of her eldest daughter Elizabeth in 1866 who was then only 16 years old. It is possible they received help from John Watson and the Gellibrand Families. Mr Watson's widow, Elizabeth, lived to the age of 86 and passed away November 29th 1877.

St Barnabas Church

On 29th January a Parish Service was held at Rokeby where people from all three centres joined together. This happens when there are five Sundays in a month. Normal Church Services are listed on page 8.

Outwit the Nits

We are looking forward to another school year and statistics indicate that more than 20% of primary school students are likely to have head lice. However, anyone with a head can catch head lice – regardless of age, sex, background or how clean your hair is.

Head lice are endemic in Australia. They cannot jump or fly but they certainly get around; and they live their entire life (about a month or so) on the head of their host. Their favourite hiding places are behind the ears and at the back of the neck. Female lice lay their eggs (known as nits) close to the scalp, where they remain firmly stuck to the base of the hair shaft until they hatch in about a week's time. They feed exclusively on human blood; but unlike mosquitoes, it appears that head lice do not carry disease. They can, however, cause severe itching and this can lead to scratching and skin infections.

Of course an itchy scalp may be due to many other causes – among them dandruff, psoriasis and seborrhoeic dermatitis. So, before you start shampooing with insecticide, it's best to get an accurate diagnosis.

The good news is that if you or your children have head lice, there are simple, safe and effective strategies to send them on their way. Various shampoos, lotions, cream rinses and conditioners are available. If live lice are found in the combings after treatment, it's possible that the head lice are resistant to the particular product, and the person should be retreated as soon as possible using a product from a different group. Nevertheless, most treatment failures are due to inadequate time in contact with hair and scalp, inappropriate application methods, or the use of ineffective products.

Remember whatever head lice treatment you choose, a fine toothcomb is essential to get the nits out.

Despite symptoms of tickling, itching and scratching, head lice can sometimes be difficult to find. The answer is to indulge in a little "detection combing". You apply to dry hair, enough hair conditioner to cover each hair from root to tip. Starting at the scalp and working carefully in sections, you comb the conditioner through the hair with a special lice comb.

Head lice treatments can kill living lice, but they don't protect people from getting head lice. Regular inspection, and detection, and persistence and perseverance with an effective product used appropriately are the keys to success. Of course, it helps if you can convince all the parents of your children's classmates to put in place similar procedures.

For more information South Arm Community Pharmacy can provide you with a *Head Lice* fact card and are happy to discuss the best method of eradication for you.

community group is

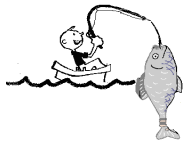
being proposed to help out locals who find themselves in need of assistance, financial or other.

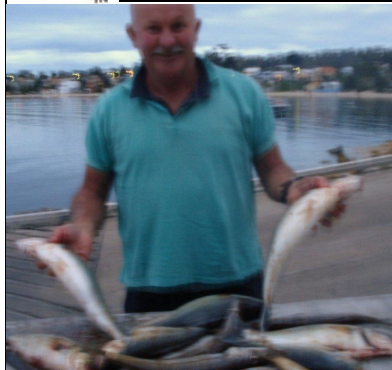
Fishing News

Hey Fisho's ... What a lucky and plentiful area we live in! After visiting France, Spain and the Netherlands recently it became apparent just how decimated the northern hemisphere sea stocks have become due to relentless commercial trawling and pollution over the last century.

I saw some strange looking fish including one that looked like a cross between a flathead and a stargazer...I called it a "Flatgazer" or it could have been a "Headgazer" "Flatstar" or a "Headstar"... ©..."What's for tea tonight mum? ..." *Headgazer and chips dear*"...HAHAHA

If you mentioned Tasmanian Salmon, Crayfish or Abalone in Europe people's eyes lit up with instant recognition and approval....felt like doing a Hogan and saying "Now this is an Abalone" as theirs were like barnacles scraped off the bottom of a boat!...☺

On the local scene I have been taking good catches of Calamari from the Opossum Bay Jetty, Flathead on a drift in the bay and off Maryanne and plenty of Australian Salmon off Gellibrand Point. The salmon are the go and we have taken some big ones up to 2.5kg. Yesterday we fished in calm but overcast conditions and although the fish weren't showing we landed a dozen good fish but be prepared to lose about twice as many as you hook as they invariably throw the hook if they leap out of the water because they have soft mouths ...and plenty of spirit.



Interestingly we also took some arrow squid on the lures we trolled. I don't think that you can go past the Halco Slice or Twister 30gram silvers as we seem to have the most strikes with them. With one line weighted and another on the surface and trolling at about 4 to 5 knots you are sure to find a Salmon, Couta, Pike or Squid at the moment.

Don't forget to bleed the Salmon with a deep cut behind the gills as soon as you get them aboard. Cooking them is a snap. My favourite way is to scale and fillet their skin on, put the fillet skin down on foil with a bit of salt and lemon, then wrap it up and cook it in a very hot oven for 5 to 10 minutes depending on size. Everbody at the dinner table will be saying "Yes Yes Yes!" or if you lash out with a

bit of Dijon mustard they will probably say "Oui Oui Oui!"...☺👉

As a service to the community, South Arm Community Pharmacy is attempting to coordinate 'flu vaccine clinics in March and April. We hope to have a doctor or nurse immuniser available on three separate days.

The make-up of this year's vaccine is the same as last year – yes it also contains swine flu. This does not mean if you had an injection last year you don't need one this year. The vaccine only lasts for 12 months and you MUST BE IMMUNISED EVERY YEAR to maintain protection. If you aren't sure whether you should have a 'flu vaccine come and talk to us.

The specific dates and times of the Clinics are yet to be confirmed but we will keep you informed as arrangements are made.
