Fishing News

There has been plenty of action at the Opossum Bay wharf with the Cala-

mari on for young and old. After a slow start to the season in the Derwent the squid are now on the move and most are of medium size but with a few very large ones also hitting the jigs. The smaller jigs on a slow retrieve and then a drop back to near the bottom are taking the most squid but as the squid grow they are just starting to strike at the bigger jigs. Some of the late afternoons and early evenings have had gorgeous warm weather and it is good to see the kids turning out for the action. A black outfit is recommended when fishing for squid because if you score a direct hit with an ink squirt the stain is much easier to get out!

Half the fun is watching the kids scatter when there is a hookup and landing! My son Jack has been coming home regularly with up to four nice Calamari courtesy of his "magic jig" he says but it is really all about the technique when you are dealing with Calamari as they can be timid at times. There are some good size Octopus around and don't be surprised if one goes for the squid jig. The Sellars family went home with a nice one going about 1.5kg on the labour day long weekend and I took one earlier in the week that weighed 3kg cleaned. I couldn't help but wonder how much that would cost in a shop smoked and sliced? Of course the beauty of Calamari and Octopus is that they freeze so well and taste just as nice, if not better defrosted.

There have been big schools of Blackback still moving around in the river so don't forget to take a silver lure for a throw off the shore or a slow troll behind the boat. I caught a 2kg Blackback in the bay and when opened it had two large mackerel in its belly so there are plenty of baitfish about now, in addition to the squid, to keep the better quality fish in the river.

Remember this when you next go fishing in the words of Lao Tzu (no relation to Costa) "If you don't change direction you will end up where you are going".

SOUTH ARM PRIMARY SCHOOL LAUNCHING INTO LEARNING NEWS

Firstly our school would like to acknowledge and express our appreciation to those parents who committed so much of their time and energy building up and supporting Playgroup within the South Arm community over the last 10 years. It was a privilege to meet and work with all of the families and children who came through the organisation both in the Community Centre and South Arm School. In particular we would like to say a heartfelt thankyou to Wendy Huxley and Anitra Jackson for starting up and continuing such a successful Playgroup and creating such a happy, supportive learning environment for young children and their families. Although Playgroup in South Arm has now sadly disbanded, it is our school's commitment to continue to offer support to families in our area and provide fun, play-based learning experiences to young children to "maximise their potential and develop a foundation for future success in learning."

Our <u>Birth-5</u> sessions have begun in the Kindergarten at South Arm Primary and we invite all new and existing families to come and take part in our *Story-Time*, *Chat & Play and Music and Movement* sessions throughout the week. The format is a little

different this year, with sessions planned for using the Early Years Framework to extend and enrich children's learning from birth to five years and through the transition to school.

"....The Framework forms the foundation for ensuring that children in all early childhood education and care settings experience quality teaching and learning. It has a specific emphasis on play-based learning and recognises the importance of communication and language (including early literacy and numeracy) and social and emotional development...[It]...has been designed for use by early childhood educators working in partnership with families, children's first and most influential educators..."

Due to the current school building developments, we are only offering at this stage Story-Time sessions between 10.00a.m - 11.00a.m and Chat & Play between 11.00am - 12.00pm every Tuesday in the Kindergarten. These sessions include story-telling, songs, rhymes and craft, outdoor play, gardening and parent/child reading together in the school library. Children also have the opportunity to borrow 2 books from the library per week. We ask that parents provide some fruit and a drink (preferably water) for their children to snack on for morning tea in between sessions – and time is set aside for this. During Chat & Play sessions we will be inviting guest speakers in to discuss various topics of interest.

After Easter we will begin our *Pre-kinder* sessions between 9.00 – 10.30a.m. every *Thursday in the Kindergarten*. These sessions are only for those children turning 5 and will be attending Kindergarten in 2011. Parents are reminded to bring some fruit and a drink for rumbly turnmies! Cost is \$2.50 per session to cover cost of materials.

Also after Easter, we will be offering Jumping Joey sessions (originally called Music & Movement) at 10.45a.m – 11.30a.m. every Thursday in the school gym. These sessions focus on specific concepts and motor skills for children 0-4, like balancing, jumping, crawling, climbing etc and will follow a regular routine and format (including some music and movement). There will be a separate area specifically

set up for babies.

All families are welcome and we value any feedback regarding the sessions and families needs. Occasionally (and depending on interest) we will organise an excursion (at no cost to families) to a playground or Jumping Jacks with transport provided. Parents will be given plenty of notice about this. We will be providing a monthly calendar of events for our LiL sessions as well as a brochure detailing times and places for your information.

All families are required to fill out a registration form which can be obtained from the school office. It should be a great year - especially since we will be moving into our new Early Learning building in second term! We look forward to meeting and working with you and your children throughout 2010 and thank you for our patience while our school undergoes renovations!

FIRST RESPONSE AMBULANCE SERVICE

in the South Arm/ Opossum Bay Area

When a triple zero (000) call is received by the Tasmanian Ambulance Service for this area. Communications Officers simultaneously dispatch the nearest emergency ambulance and our local First Responder Unit by pager message.

First response volunteers working as a twoperson crew responding in the South Arm/ Opossum Bay area are then able to reach local residents quickly and

provide critical assistance while the ambulance is en route.

First response volunteers receive training in basic life support techniques, how to administer oxygen to a patient and how to use an automated external defibrillator. While this is significantly less training than career ambulance personnel, the skills learnt in first responder training can, and does, save lives making a real difference in respiratory and cardiac emergencies where time is of the essence. Our local First Response Unit has been able to reduce response times by 25 minutes.

VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED: Who would like to serve their community, gain first aid skills that are nationally recognised while working with a close-knit team of local residents in times of emergency, leading to a real sense of achievement and community spirit?

An ability to keep a level head, communicate with others and use common sense is desirable but prior knowledge of first aid, while an asset, is <u>not</u> essential as initial and ongoing training is provided. A commitment to on-call availability and a small amount of time in responding to emergencies is required.


St Barnabas' Church

Local History

Joseph Gellibrand continued

Joseph Gellibrand and Selina moved into the homestead at Omokoroa Point in NZ on the 20th Dec 1877. They purchased cows, horses, farm equipment and cleared the land. (When I view the photos of Omokoroa Point it resembles Opossum Bay)

Arthur Crapp married Elizabeth Gellibrand in Auckland 1878. Joseph Tice Gellibrand had been too ill to attend the wedding so Selina his wife went alone. Returning from Auckland by steamer Selina was picked up by a small sailing boat to be taken to Omokoroa Point. While sailing down the harbour the boat capsized and Selina was drowned on March the 1st 1878. On December the 4th 1880 Joseph sold the farm to Arthur Crapp and Elizabeth (also known as Dottie) for seven hundred and fifty pounds with all the stock including 350 cows and calves. Joseph had found it very hard to carry on with the farm. He returned to Tasmania in 1881, and went back to Omokoroa July 1883 the year that Tarrwerra eruption happened. He again returned to Tasmania in 1884 and 1887.

The Rev. Joseph Tice Gellibrand had been in poor health for some time, he finally passed away on 10th October 1887. He was buried along side his wife Selina in the Tauranga Cemetery, NZ

Arthur & Elizabeth Crapp raised six children, the first child Arthur born on 18th August 1879, then Sidney Tice born 11th August 1881, then Walter Harris, Lena Louise, Rosina and Gerald.
