


ANZAC Day 25th April 2011 (Easter Monday)



South Arm First Responders Group – what you should know

This group provides an invaluable service to our community and has saved a number of lives for which we are all greatly thankful.

Who are the First Responders?

They are volunteers, trained by Tas Ambulance, who provide a first response to medical emergencies within the South Arm area on a roster basis. When a call goes through to 000, Tas Ambulance quickly determines if the FRG is required. If so, they are paged and if someone is rostered on, they are asked to attend and treat until an ambulance can get there.

When do you call a First Responder? NEVER - always call 000 first. Tas

Ambulance will page the FRG if they decide the case requires their help. This can't be stressed enough, even if you personally know a member of the group, you must call 000 first as it could cause delays in getting help to you when time is critical ...

It's up to all of us to make sure we get the process right so that we get help quickly – it really can be a matter of life and death

What does a First Responder do? Early administration of basic life support can significantly improve the ability of a person to survive heart or breathing related incidents. First Responders use their training and best endeavours to manage any person who is suffering from heart or respiratory difficulties, while they are waiting for an ambulance. The FRG may assist in the case of trauma events depending on the skills and experience of the rostered members

ALWAYS - IN ANY EMERGENCY CALL 000 Do not contact local members of the First Responders. This may cause delays in getting emergency treatment when time is crucial to survival.

Volunteers always welcome

By having more trained volunteers available, the roster can be covered for longer hours and the workload shared more widely. If you'd like to know more about becoming a South Arm First Responder, please contact a SAPRA Committee member who will provide the contact for the current co-ordinator.

Successfully Protecting the Community

As a new initiative the Pharmacy has held 2 'flu vaccine clinics in conjunction with the doctors at Lauderdale Doctors Surgery. During two 2.5 hour sessions approximately 120 people were *vaccinated* in the pharmacy's consulting room - an outstanding result. Many of these people would not have had a vaccination if they had to make an appointment with a GP. We are delighted with the community response to this initiative and thank those who attended for their overwhelming support. If there is enough interest we may be able to conduct a third clinic. Bowelscan ®

During March there is a focus on bowel health in the community. There are now simple do-it-yourself home test kits that you can use to detect possible early signs of bowel cancer. The Bowelscan test kits do not require you to handle any faecal matter, change your diet nor alter your medications. They are simple and straight forward to use. We stock these kits all year round but have been focussing on them in the past few weeks.

As the weather cools off it's worth remembering that even though fire permits are no longer required the vegetation in the area is still dry enough for fires to get out of control and spread.

As you will have noticed from the news over the last few weeks, the Tasmanian Fire Service is being kept busy dealing with a number of house fires. Although the bushfire season is generally thought to be the busiest time for fire-fighters, in Tasmania autumn and winter often prove to be more dangerous, with significantly more house fires, and unfortunately, some fire-related deaths.

Wood heaters are always a potential for house fires and need to be serviced every vear.

Smoke alarms do save lives, but the batteries should be changed twice a year when the daylight saving starts and finishes, so don't forget to replace yours when the clocks change. A smoke alarm without a battery is just a useless decoration on the wall.


What's next?

Fishing News

Deep Fried Starfish

Whilst in Beijing China I noticed some food stalls selling deep fried starfish. This was the same starfish that has plagued the Derwent since its intro-duction by Japanese vessels some years ago!

Being open to try almost anything I handed over about \$4AUD for a "Starfish on a stick". The stallholder then dropped the starfish into hot oil and let it cook away for about 2 minutes after which he presented it to me on a stick. Bemused as to how I should eat it I attempted to eat the shell at first but I was soon instructed to open the shell and eat what was inside. Tasting mildly fishy with a soft brain-like texture it was nothing to write home about (which ironically I am doing!) but nonetheless it was a strong indication that anything from the sea has a market and in years to come a starfish harvesting licence may even be a viable fishing business venture.

During summer I was amazed to see massive schools of juvenile fish in the Derwent. This is the strongest indication yet that the Derwent and Channel waters are in the healthiest state they have been in for many years due to the environmental pollution controls introduced in recent years. Clean river and coastal areas in Europe and Asia are now almost non-existent and we certainly have something to be proud of; so all fishers should think to the future and "stow it not throw it" when enjoying our waters.

Local History We continue the story of Winspears and Arthur Crapp

Rev Joseph Tice Gellibrand settled at Omokoroa point in the Bay of Plenty New Zealand 1877. His adopted daughter Elizabeth married Arthur Crapp in 1878; they raised the following children, Arthur (b) 1879, Sidney (b) 1881, Walter (b) 1882, Lena (b) 1884, Rosa (b) 1887, Cyril (b) 1889, Annie (b)1892, and Gerald (b) 1894

Arthur's wife Elizabeth died 1st May 1894, just three months after their 8th child Gerald was born. Gellibrand, with the help of his son in-law Arthur Crapp, developed the orchards which consisted of cherries, nectarines, apricots, peaches and plums. Because of Gellibrand's poor health, in 1880 he sold the property to Arthur Crapp. Joseph had built his home which cost 1250 pounds on the end of the Omokoroa Point; the area around the homestead was laid out with trees, she-

oaks. eucalyptus, hakeas, elms and birches. After viewing photos of the park that Gellibrand had planted around his home, how nice it would have been had he staved at South Arm and produced the same on the Arm End at Opossum Bay.

1908 Arthur Crapp sold the land to Robert Francis who was a farmer. About that time the Gellibrand home was burnt down. Rev. Joseph Gellibrand passed away 10th October 1887. Today the Omokoroa Point has been developed

with over three hundred new homes, but the parks with the trees that Joseph planted are still standing today, the name has been changed to "Gerald Crapp Historic Reserve". The streets have been named Gellibrand Drive another Myrtle Drive, and Walnut Grove after the families. Sidney Tice Crapp died Dec 1954. Walter Howard Crapp (m) Dorothy nee Roselle. He died 1942. Gerald Vivian Crapp (m) Myrtle nee Lauder. Gerald operated shipyards on the shores of Omokoroa Point until he passed away October 1975. Those shipyards are still in place today.

Two years ago I had a visit from Colin Pettigrew an historian from New Zealand who was looking for information on Joseph Tice Gellibrand during the period when he lived in South Arm. I have also had the privilege of meeting relatives of the Crapp family when they visited South Arm just a few weeks ago. These people have since sent me a DVD on the life of Gellibrand and the history of Omokoroa Point. Maurice Potter.


