### Plant a tree ..... Adopt a tree World Environment Day 5 June, 2010

10.30am at the Opossum Bay Park

SAPRA invites residents to celebrate World Environment Day by helping us plant the first of the 'Avenue' of Flowering Red Gums which will link South Arm, Halfmoon Bay and Opossum Bay villages. A ribbon of colour, with each tree approximately 12m apart.

These will be planted in four stages, the first beginning at the front of Opossum Bay Shop and proceeding up to the Sheoaks (about 600m). Planting will be easy, the holes will already be dug.

We are also hoping that individuals or families can 'Adopt a Tree' (or two) to keep an eye on it for the first year or so of its life. To water it, if we get a really dry spell, and to make sure it's protection is still in place.

After the planting join us in Opossum Bay Park for lunch. There will be a free sausage or two and a cuppa, and if you would like to bring biscuits or a cake to share it will be appreciated. All volunteers will also receive a native plant for their own personal WED planting at home.

**Childcare:** Stepping Stones is closing on 25th June due to low support for services, low interest in local staffing and changing Federal staff requirements. Their lease finishes in mid August. It's a sad day for the community and SAPRA given the hard work put into getting the Centre running for local families. Income from the Centre has also meant SAPRA has funded many local projects.

SAPRA welcomes all suggestions on the future of the Centre – please contact a Committee member with your ideas.

**Memorial Seats on the bike path:** SAPRA and Council will be placing two seats honouring two of our loved and missed people – Glad Kelly and Ted Bezzant.

Maintenance of existing bike path. We recently received a letter from Mayor Campbell committing Council to follow up on specific safety issues and put the bike path on a regular regime for spraying. He went on to say "Council appreciates the past efforts of local residents in relation to the construction of the track..."

Line-of-Sight on South Arm Road has been improved since SAPRA contacted DIER about several unsafe areas. More work was done and whilst some may not be entirely happy about their methods, line-of-sight has improved which after all had to be the priority given road events over the last year.

**Ongoing projects:** Planning of the **BBQ and shelter** at Calverton Oval is well underway and we have also received Council plans for the **Extension** of the bike path to the RSL. A joint application has been lodged for a **community car/bus** and SAPRA's work continues.

The Do Not Call Register was launched by the Federal Government in May 2007 in response to community concerns about the growth of unsolicited telemarketing calls.

Registrations are valid for three years and can be renewed (for another three years) at any time. **May 2010 marks the third anniversary of the register**. Up to 1.04 million numbers may be automatically removed from the register, unless they are re-registered prior to this date.

#### Tuna in the Derwent -

The big news this season was the presence of large schools of Striped Tuna in the Derwent which was apparently the first sighting and capture of the species in the river in living memory.

The latest edition of the Tasmanian seafood industry news "Fishing Today" continues to beat the drum on climate change and how it is increasingly affecting the patterns of marine life.

A local company in Hobart is leading the world in the design and production of software for the analysis of data that can be applied to understand the impacts of climate change. Water tolerance for all marine species is a critical factor in migratory and reproductive cycles.

Aquaculture is certainly the thing of the future as the world's wild marine stocks continue to decline. If I were a young person considering a future career it would certainly be aligned to the marine aquaculture industry. Fascinating stuff!

training on structural fires and the use of Breathing Apparatus.

New Computer Systems

There is plenty of evidence that smoke alarms do save lives, but the batteries need to be changed regularly. Did you change your smoke alarm batteries when the clocks went back?

#### The Gellibrand Vault

In this Vault lie, William Gellibrand died September 1840. Thomas Lloyd Gellibrand died November 1874 and Walter Angus Bethune Gellibrand died November 1909.

**William Gellibrand** was born 28<sup>th</sup> May 1765 and married Sophia January 1788. They had 3 children, Sophia, William and Joseph born 1792.

Joseph's first son Thomas Llovd Gellibrand, was born 22<sup>nd</sup> September 1820. Thomas married Isabella on 1st December 1860 and started farming at Ouse Tasmania. They had seven children, 5 boys and 2 girls. Unfortunately he died 14 years later on the 9<sup>th</sup> November 1874. Their sixth child was John Gellibrand born on the 5<sup>th</sup> December 1872. Soon after the Thomas's death his wife Isabella and the family went to England where John received a good education. He joined the army at the age of seventeen and went on to Royal Military College at Sandhurst. Commissioned as a second lieutenant and promoted to lieutenant in 1895, he served in the South African War. He married Elizabeth at Yorkshire England and returned to Tasmania in 1912 to settle on a farm at Risdon with his wife and family. At the outbreak of war in August 1914 General Sir William Birdwood appointed him to the A.I.F John went to France in command of the 12<sup>th</sup> Brigade and in May 1918 Gellibrand was promoted to Major General Sir. John Gellibrand. He commanded with outstanding success in the final operations along the Somme.

Walter Angus Bethune Gellibrand the 7th child of Joseph & Anne Gellibrand, was a member of the Tasmanian Legislative Council from 1871-1901. He was also its President from 1884-89. To be continued ... Maurice Potter


#### Move Well Eat Well
