A Better Bus Service

For Cremorne/South Arm/Opossum Bay

Metro is proposing changes to the bus service in order to reduce travel time to and from our area. For example: The 5.22pm bus from Hobart would be an Express along the Tasman Hwy to Shoreline (saving 7 mins). If this bus no longer does the 'Lauderdale Loop' it would save another 13 mins (so that makes 20 mins). The Cremorne service at this time would be 'by request', so on some days, if the bus doesn't go into Cremorne (10 mins), the South Arm/Opossum Bay passengers could get home 30 mins earlier than at present!

By the time you read this these changes may have already taken place. Please support the local Metro bus service

The group is happy to announce that we have recently received a \$20,000 grant through Tasmanian Landcare to employ contractors to further tackle Weeds of National Significance (WoNS) in the Cremorne area. The funding is via the Federal Government's Caring for our Country initiative. The main weed is serrated tussock which has a heavy infestation on Calverts Hill and surrounding land. It is a major threat to the threatened species of Eucalyptus Morrisbyi on the hill as it invades the understorey and in times of drought is a major bushfire risk.

The draft Cremorne Foreshore Community Management Plan (also funded through a Caring for our Country grant) will be available for public comment towards the end of July/ early August through the shop and on the Coast Care notice board.

Gellibrand Vault (cont from last N/letter)

A few months ago some friends of mine who are related to the Mortimer family

who are related to the Mortimer family who settled at Muddy Plains in 1825-36, passed on a letter written by Martha Jane Mouritz the daughter of Henry Mortimer which reads:

"In October 1839 we Ann Selina and I, went to stay at South Arm for a few weeks. We enjoyed it immensely as we stayed with Mr. Gellibrand and his housekeeper Mrs. Watkins. I think from what I can remember he must have been nearly 80. We were made much of by Mr. Gellibrand; he would leave early in the morning to dig a little every day on the grave, (Mr. Gellibrand died 1840)

which was on a point of land just half a mile from the house. (I believe the monument was erected there after his death). He used to make Ann and I race there before breakfast. While we were there we had a narrow escape.

An old fisherman named Jimmy had his hut near the beach and went out fishing most days. On one occasion

when Ann and I were sent to the beach to play, Jimmy was out in his big boat so we untied the dingy, which was just floating, got in and drifted out with the tide. Fortunately old Jimmy saw us and towed

us in again.

Henry Mortimer left Hobart on the 4th December. The vessel hove to at South Arm and Mrs. Watkins took us three girls out in one of their yachts, (They had two boats the "Amphitrite" and the "Star") to meet the vessel. Goodbyes were said and on we went."



Fishing News



It's Flounder Time

Well it's that time of the year again when fishers can indulge in one of the great fishing experiences of a cool night and calm conditions, with a healthy walk in the shallows in pursuit of one of the jewels of the sea, the flounder. If the seasons are true, towards the end of July and into August sees the arrival of the southern sole spawning run, to complement the availability of the local greenback flounder.

With my trusty fishing buddy "Eagle Eye Jack" we have recently scored good catches of large greenback after a couple of hours wading under the southern stars in the South Arm Bays. The run-in tide is clearly the best time to hunt flounder. Remember the minimum catch size is 250mm so please take care in sizing fish before spearing them.

On a recent Friday night I fancied beer battered flounder but then found that I had no beer in the fridge. However I did have some "ginger beer". As I was feeling a little adventurous after a couple of reds, I added a small bottle of ginger beer to the mix of 40% plain flour, 40 % SR flour and 20% cornflour with a teaspoon of salt. After dry flourering the flounder I deep fried them until golden brown and served them with a generous squeeze of fresh lemon. As Con the fruiterer would say, they were 'bewdifull'.
