Our 2010 Christmas Concert will be held on Wednesday 22nd December at 3.15 p.m. We hope all of our families can join in the festivities!

Initially the bus will be to assist people from South Arm, Halfmoon Bay and Opossum Bay who have a long drive to essential services and social events. In the future it is visualised that this bus could transport groups of up to 12 people to particular events on the weekends or evenings.

Note:

We will need a few volunteer bus drivers. It's

easy and fun. You don't need a special licence, although there will be some standard checks.

Volunteer bus drivers will be fully covered for any costs to have the necessary checks, and for any of the running costs where their car may be used to pick up the bus.



How it has all changed

It was 1851 when the first school was started on the corner of Bezzants Road and Main Road South Arm. Operated as a privately run school for the first few years before being taken over by the Education Department around 1856. At the time there were three schools listed in Clarence; Kangaroo Point, Muddy Plains and South Arm,

There were 15 boys & 9 girls attending Kangaroo Point the year the school at Muddy Plains was broken up. At South Arm the school master Mr. Townley unfortunately passed away in 1860. He was replaced by Mr. Reynolds at which time the school then had 27 boys and 18 girls in attendance, learning writing, geography, grammar and Latin grammar, with sewing for the girls as well. Two years later South Arm had 31 children attending with two teachers, Mrs. Bray and a teacher from Rokeby coming over once a week to help.

Many people I have known attended this school including my father, his seven sisters, also my mother Kathleen and her two sisters. The Potter family had to walk from their home at the foot of the hill at Goat Bluff. In those days the road went around the eastern shore line to Seacroft and came out near the St Barnabas Church.

By 1921 the school at Harmony Lane was built and the old school at Bezzant's Road became a home.

I attended South Arm school from 1936, the school teacher then being Mrs Madge Bessier followed by Mr. Dickenson in 1940. The school actually closed for a short time when he took ill as there was no replacement due to the war. Miss P. Hyland was the next teacher.

I remember the three children of Mr. & Mrs. Wishart who lived near Musks Road who did not miss a days schooling in seven years. I'm sure that would be a record. They would drive a horse and trap from their home to Mr. Alan Calvert's property, unharness and leave it there until returning after school to drive home again. In the later days they all had a push bike to ride to school. In those days we walked to school, rain. hail or sunshine.
