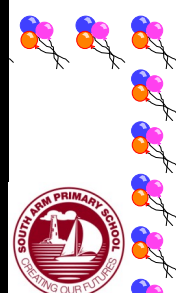

The latest indications are that Tasmania may be at a higher risk of wildfires this year compared to previous fire seasons, and the Tasmanian Fire Service and the South Arm Brigade urge all residents to be fire safe this summer.

Even with the recent rains the bush is drying out very fast, so now is a really good time to clear up around your property and create a safe zone in case of fire.

Please don't forget to change the batteries in your smoke alarm now daylight savings has started. Smoke alarms can and do save lives, but only when the battery works.

Most importantly, if you need the Fire Brigade please ring 000. **Please do not ring a Brigade Member directly.** Doing so will result in a delayed response from the Brigade.

What's new at Little Bee South Arm?



Over the past month the children of South Arm Little Bee have still been busily investigating, exploring and learning about our roads. Working together to answer our focus question 'Where do roads go?' The children have looked at and talked about different pictures and photos of roads and road signs. Each child was encouraged to tell our small group about the road that they could see in their picture or photo, enhancing our communication and self-confidence skills.

While role-playing using roads outside, the children's knowledge of one particular road sign, the traffic light became apparent. We observed the children shouting out the colours (red, orange and green) to the other children who were riding the bikes. When the colour was named the children completed the action, red- stopping, orange- slowing and green- continuing on their way. In our morning meetings we questioned the full purpose of the traffic light. We asked: How does it work? Who made it? Why do we have them? What noise does it make?

Local History

CWA South Arm

The Country Women's Association was first formed at South Arm on Tuesday 17th May 1946. Officers elected were: President, Mrs. Ethel Dreaper, Vice-Presidents, Mesdames A. Calvert, Mrs. W. Potter and J. E. B. Hughes; Secretary, Mrs. G. Calvert; Treasurer, Mrs. B. Calvert. The branch later became known as South Arm/Opossum Bay CWA Group. Other active members to follow were Mrs. Sarah Padman, Mrs. Yates, Mrs. Wheeler, Lorna White, Dolly Leake, Zena McCallister, Nance Lipscombe, Linda Calvert, Glad Lawrence, Ettie Bezzant, Nora Ward. Miss Doris Jordan was elected president 1948-1949 and in 1952 Mrs. G. Calvert was President with 20 members attending.

The CWA held their meetings at members' homes up until 1994 when they moved to the Calverton Hall in South Arm. Fundraising by members supported many charities besides funding the purchase of items for use in the hall.

On 11th June 1977 they held the first Soup and Sandwich luncheon at the Hall followed by a stall at the RSL Club to raise funds for the Multicap Quest.
