
New Editor:

On the 12th October 1981 it was decided to hold a Melbourne Cup luncheon at the old RSL Club and from that day on it was the biggest fund raising effort they provided each year. It was continued at the Calverton Hall following the old RSL Clubhouse closing and the RSL move to their new Club. Activities continued in the way of dinners, BBQ's, bus trips, and parties etc.

In 1980 the CWA was about to fold due to the loss of members so a meeting was called, with men and women attending at the RSL Club and the South Arm Country Club was formed. On the 14th December 1981 the CWA and the Country Club held a Christmas Party together at the old RSL Club. The late Merv Smith became so active with the CWA and Country Club that the ladies dubbed him" Our Honorary Member of the South Arm CWA".

Some of the many who gave their time to help were Dot Kelly, Pauline Potter, Pat Calvert, Joy Carter, Wenda Bruce and there were many more. Glad Kelly will always be remembered for the work she put into the CWA helping when they entertained the patients from the Royal Derwent Hospital. On the 30th April 2005 the ladies catered for 80 guests at the Calverton Hall to celebrate "Our Glad's" 90th birthday with her family. They watched a performance on stage by the CWA ladies and this was enjoyed by all who attended.

Thanks to Lou Smith Opossum Bay for supplying me with the CWA story from 1971 (when she joined the Association).

History in South Arm

Alan Townsend* spoke at SAPRA's recent General Meeting. Pene Marshall; Maurice Potter and Kerry Scambler have formed a sub-committee to look into the many possibilities to research and objectify the history of our area.

He said Wayne Smith was researching street and place names and plaques were being erected in various suburbs explaining the history behind the names. It is expected that this will happen in South Arm in late 2012.

Alan said that the Council have expensive (and clever!) recording equipment for capturing oral histories and we only had to ask to borrow them. Pene would love to talk to you and record your stories—history from the 50's and 60's.

> As we advised in earlier Newsletters Clarence Council are also recording and storing photos of artieacts/objects, documents and old photos. There are scanners available that are portable and can be taken to your home to photograph your valued photo or artefact so that they do not have to leave your sight!

There are other projects in the pipeline:

- a) A time-team style dig on the old Gellibrand House site on Arm End; this could tie in with the primary school.
- b) We could erect signs or sculptures along the Bike/Walk Track to illustrate a quite strong convict past. Money is available and the Tas. Community Fund grants would be applicable.
- c) Visitor information sign (SAPRA is currently looking into this with Maurice Potter's help). Council will help with this.
- d) We have several very old cottages (mid 1800's), mostly on private land which makes it difficult to get grants or funding. The Clarence Cultural Heritage Advisory

Committee have staff who can advise how to preserve them.

SAPRA intends to install a sign above Gellibrand Vault to briefly outline the Gellibrand history and show the vault wording.

Our small Heritage Committee would welcome anyone who has an interest in our local history, or has any ideas about what we need in our area.
