

Please remember your plantings and give them a few good doses over the dry summer months.




Sea Star Clean Up - Sun 3rd Dec 1:30pm



Vale Joan Griffiths

Joan Griffiths, born in 1928 in England, spent her adult life in South Arm. She passed away in October leaving a significant community legacy, illustrated by the large, diverse turnout at the Morning Tea held in her honour at Calverton Hall. Joan was dedicated to both Calverton Hall and St Barnabas throughout her life.

Calverton Hall. In the 1970's, Joan was a member of the group set up to manage Calverton Hall, the oval and tennis court. In 1996 the owner, Alma Calvert, deeded the complex to Clarence City Council. A formal committee was formed, South Arm Calverton Hall Association Inc. with Joan as President, to take on the lease granted by Council as a deed condition. Joan was always the guiding hand behind all aspects of managing the Hall - taking bookings, ensuring the kitchen was well equipped and maintenance up to date. She made sure it was run with the community's best interests at the centre of all decisions. Joan retired as President at the 2021 AGM and was honoured with Life Membership for her outstanding contribution to the Hall and the community.



St Barnabas Community Church. Joan is remembered as a stalwart of the church over many

decades. She was a hard-working member of the church family – on committees and organising events. The documents and information she assiduously kept give a clear and interesting history of the past 50+ years. She kindly passed these to the current Board when St Barnabas became a community church, so we have, through Joan's work, a deeper knowledge of what has been done to preserve the church and the cemetery by local community members. Joan was a regular member of the congregation for many years, and she will be sadly missed by everyone involved with St Barnabas.

On behalf of the community, we send our condolences to Joan's family.

Protect what you value!

- 1. Keep your fire water tanks FULL, outlet marked and clear, valve in working order.
- 2. If you have a fire water tank let the brigade know: Facebook or <u>val.ansett@fire.tas.gov.au</u>
- Ensure unrestricted fire truck access the vehicle and crew must be able to enter your property AND have sufficient turn around space to safely exit.
- 4. Make a plan: https://www.fire.tas.gov.au/

CAT OWNERSHIP RULES – the basics

- Cats over 4 months must be microchipped and desexed (some exemptions apply).
- No more than 4 cats over 4 months old on your property (some exceptions apply).
- · Breeding cats only allowed by registered breeders.
- Dumping/abandoning cats or kittens is an offence with strong penalties.
- Requirements for selling/giving away cats must be 8 weeks+, microchipped, desexed, vaccinated and meet required health checks.
- Trapping of cats allowed on private property with strict procedures, see guidelines https://www.tassiecat.com.au.

Do you know your local history?

Potter's Hill Bushland Reserve and the Labyrinth

In the previous newsletter issue we encouraged locals and visitors to explore our convict history by walking the <u>South Arm Convict Trail</u>. Continuing with the theme of exploring our peninsula history on foot why not plan a visit to Potter's Hill Bushland Reserve to enjoy the extensive views from mountains to sea in a serene and peaceful atmosphere.

From the mid-1800s the ancestors of local historian (namesake of the <u>Maurice</u> <u>Potter History Room</u> in the South Arm Community Centre) farmed the land until



subdivision in 1996 at which time Clarence Council acquired five acres as a reserve. After a suggestion to council by a local walker and coast care enthusiast that the Potter name be assigned to this parcel of land and with agreement to that proposal from Maurice and his wife, the reserve was officially opened as Potter's Hill Bushland Reserve on 17 November 2013. Look for the blue signs on Fort Direction Road to get you there.

A feature of the reserve is the Potter's Hill Labyrinth, a circular pathway of rocks through which you can walk and soak in the atmosphere while enjoying a spiritual connection to the surrounding landscape. Nearby, note the engraving on The Gratitude Seat acknowledging the work of the late Richard (Dick) Vaughan and his fellow volunteers, on establishing the Labyrinth (and involvement in other projects).

South Arm Community Centre's Buchanan Hall

Many community members and visitors will have been in Buchanan Hall - to enjoy market day cakes, attend a Pilates class or to visit South Arm Primary School's recent art show etc. Even so, many may not be aware the hall was named in 1999 in honour of the late Neil Buchanan, his wife Jenny and their family, for 17 years of unstinting work to fundraise and build the Community Centre we enjoy today. There is also a plaque for Mr Buchanan just to the right of St Barnabas Church next to the pathway to Gellibrand Hall.
