Community engagement through activities and fellowship

On Wednesday 13th December 2023 the Hon. Julie Collins MP officially opened the South Arm Peninsula Men's Shed at South Arm. A good attendance of nearly 60 were present for the occasion.





The Shed will shortly receive final certification allowing member activity to commence. Currently we are holding Wednesday sessions between 9am and midday encouraging members to turn up and assist in the internal shed fit-out. This is a great opportunity to meet fellow members and help with the sorting and repair of donated items. Additionally we need to construct benches, establish shadow boards and generally work towards establishing a shed which meets the needs of members.

At the official opening I stressed the point that now the Shed is built, it is up to the community to engage with the activities and fellowship that is available. The extent to which the Shed can be open to members will be determined by the level of interest and the availability of people to supervise sessions. Membership of people over 18 is now open and fees up to the end of June will be on a monthly pro rata basis.

While the Shed will be set up with traditional woodwork and metalwork facilities members are encouraged to engage in different craft activities which hopefully they can share with others. In some sheds members simply turn up to share fellowship with other Shedders, drink coffee and play crib.

An important part of Shed activities is our engagement with our community. I hope in time we will take on some of the challenges that are part of our community. This may involve interaction with our local school as well as enhancing community facilities.

A shed requires ongoing funding which in some cases will be provided by grants but to a large degree we must raise our own funds through providing services and selling products we have made. The more we engage in these activities, the less members need to personally contribute through membership and other fees.



Congratulations to the community on achieving a constructed Men's Shed. I hope to see many members and prospective members as we kick-off our Wednesday sessions.



Autumn planting

Protection of fragile dunes and lagoon foreshore through plantings is an ongoing focus. Given the vast area to cover, we encourage locals to look after their own patch with the group's assistance. We aim to provide once again four key coastal species along with guards and stakes. These are *Dodonaea viscosa* (Hopbush), *Atriplex cinerea* (Saltbush), *Acacia sophorae* (Coastal Wattle) and *Allocasuarina verticillata* (Drooping Sheaok). Let us know if you have another particular species in mind.

Please get in touch ASAP, the end of March at the latest, with your plant order.

Future 2024 activities

To keep the group fresh and motivated we are after new members to help with planning. Our Annual General Meeting is coming up in early May. Get in touch if you are interested in getting more involved.

Council generously funds our activities and is in the process of changing the model in which this will occur. As such, we are waiting to hear back from them before making any plans.





Do you know our local history?

A cautionary tale?

One of the most scenic drives on the peninsula is that narrow stretch of road we call the "Neck" with spectacular tidal changes on the north side and the natural sandhill barrier along Hope Beach on the other.

Occasionally, as a result of very high tides and severe stormy weather, the bay encroaches on the roadside and occasionally spills over on to the road surface. Few would deny that the Neck is vulnerable to extreme weather events.

Is this the first time the Neck has been under threat? No.

As retold by Maurice Potter (namesake of the <u>Maurice Potter History Room</u> at the South Arm Community Centre) a section of the Neck was under threat over 80 years ago from seawater encroachment, not from the north but from the Hope Beach side.

An area of the sandhills at the junction of the Potters and Calvert properties was breached during a heavy storm around 1940. Strong winds over many years had created a gap in the dunes, sufficient to allow breaking waves to breach the sand barrier. Seawater encroached to within about 20 feet of South Arm Road.

Between 1960-70 a truck driver, Mr Tonks, working for George Males' sand mining business and also on the Potter's farm, agreed to apply his bulldozing equipment to the task of filling the gap between the dunes.

Friends of the Bays update

It's been three months since Friends of the Bays was formed to challenge Petuna's proposed salmon farm off Clifton Beach. In that time, the "Bay Boys" have been a regular feature at the South Arm Community Market, raising awareness and gathering signatures on their petition.



President, Mick Lawrence said "We didn't know what level of community support we would get, but we've been blown away. After three markets we've been lobbying politicians in the Franklin electorate, attracted over 100 members, have built up a healthy fighting fund and gathered over 1000 signatures on our petition."

"That represents over 6% of the population of the South Arm Peninsula already, which is most encouraging." Mick said "Community is telling us they are not happy and that government is failing to listen to their concerns, so we are planning a major protest featuring guest speakers and paddle out be held at Clifton Beach in the near future."



Echidna facts...

- The Australian short-beaked echidna along with 3 species of long-beaked echidnas in New Guinea and the platypus are all monotremes egg laying mammals.
- The female feeds their young (puggles) by sweating milk through milk patches on their belly.
- Echidnas do not have pouches. They use strong muscles to hold an egg for the 10-12 day incubation period and then to hold the puggle during its first 30 days of development.
- After that, in Tasmania, the female will bunker down in a hollow log or bury herself until the puggle can be left.
- The oldest echidna on record lived to the age of 62!
- In the cooler months echidnas will go into a mini-hibernation known as a torpor.

We are fortunate to share our peninsula with these amazing animals and our other beautiful wildlife.
