



Tragically, following a short but stoic battle with cancer, one of the group's founders, Roger Toombs, has passed away. South Arm local, Tamar Cordover, has been invited to fill

the vacancy. The family requested that instead of flowers, donations be made to Roger's passion - Friends of the Bays.

President Mick Lawrence, thanked the community's overwhelming generosity 'which will allow us to increase awareness of the issues that expansion of industrial salmon farming will have on our lifestyle and recreational waterways.

Co-Editor comment: The South Arm Peninsula is rich in native wildlife but, unfortunately, is not currently a declared Cat Management Area so it is up to all of us to take responsibility for the protection of both our native wildlife and the pets we love. See the Oct-Nov 2023 and Dec-Jan 2023/24 issues at http://southarm.tas.au/south-arm-news/ for more on responsible cat ownership. Below we hear from a local expert on a parasitic illness that can affect us all....

Toxoplasmosis (or "Toxo") is an illness caused by the *Toxoplasma gondii* parasite. Toxo occurs worldwide in cats, livestock and humans, however not all infections lead to symptoms or illness.

When a cat consumes the parasite via their food/prey, it reproduces and forms eggs (called oocysts) in their digestive tract. Millions of these eggs are then shed in faeces and can survive for 12 months.

Infection in humans, is often non-symptomatic or mild, however some infections (especially during pregnancy) can be extremely serious.

Toxo leads to significantly higher stillbirth and abortion rates in livestock (especially maiden ewes), and can be fatal to many native marsupials including bandicoots, wombats, wallabies and possums.

What should I do?

- Keep your pet cat contained to your property this greatly reduces the likelihood they will be exposed to or transmit Toxoplasmosis.
- Ensure pet cats do not have access to vegetable gardens and areas such as beaches, sand pits and other children play areas – this reduces the likelihood of accidental human exposure.
- Handle cat droppings safely wear gloves and wash your hands thoroughly after cleaning up cat litter/droppings.
- Wear gloves when gardening and wash hands after gardening- roaming pet cats or feral cats may leave faeces in your garden potentially exposing you to infection.
- Do not feed feral and stray cats feeding encourages them to remain in the area and breed, greatly increasing the chances of exposing other people and wildlife in the area to the parasite.
- Follow safe food preparation guidelines.

Do you know our local history?

Betsey Island...at a glance!

What we now call Betsey Island was originally known as Lore.by.larner to the Moomairremener People. Here are a few of the key points in its history...



In 1792 Bruni D,Entrecasteaux named the island Isle de Williaunez, after the commander of the expedition ship, Recherche.

In 1798 Mathew Flinders climbed to the summit while on a charting expedition with Bass.





The island was purchased, in 1820, by a Mr King who stocked it, in 1826, with silver haired rabbits, with the meat going to Hobart and the furs to China. After King, the business continued under Cpt John Bell and Mr Crombie.

In 1852 the island was stripped of trees which were exported to Port Phillip. Now we see a bare side and a lightly treed side to its appearance.



 Since 1916, the area to the west of Little Betsy Island has been used for the disposal of unwanted ships and sections of <u>Hobart's floating bridge</u>.

Now a Reserve with restricted access Betsy Island and its surrounds offer some of the best of nature!

Shortly after, in 1793, unaware of the French visit to the island, Lt John Hayes of the British East India Company, named it Betsy Island, most likely after the ship Betsy commanded by a colleague.



In 1804, Harbourmaster W. Collins established a convict shipping lookout on the island, initially using smoke for signalling. Later, whalers from Bruny Island also used Betsey Island as a lookout.

In 1840 the next owners of the island, Lt-Gov. John Franklin and Lady Franklin, planned to establish a botanical garden or game reserve but the rabbits continued to rule the island for many years.





The island was bequeathed to the people of Tasmania in 1863 (the name 'Van Diemen's Land' was changed to Tasmania in 1856).

Egeria History Tours

SAPRA, in conjunction with the Motor Yacht Club of Tasmania, hosted History Cruises again in March this year on board the ML Egeria. The 2 hour cruise ran from Opossum Bay Jetty to the Iron Pot, then to Gellibrand Point via Mary Ann Bay at 9.30am, 11.45am and 2pm with the Community Bus doing transfers. All trips were fully booked, and the day included an extra trip to Bellerive from Opossum Bay (return in the Bus).

Michael Topfer provided commentary on board, explaining points of interest, geographical features, notable buildings and associated stories. The weather was perfect with plenty of sun and not too much breeze, spectacular views of hang gliders in action near Mary Ann Bay were an exciting bonus!

Tours will be held again in March 2025.





Nature Notes Snakes on the Peninsula a Catcher and Carer's View

Tasmania is home to the Tiger Snake, Lowland Copper Head and White Lipped Snake - all of which are venomous and shouldn't be approached by anyone untrained in venomous snake handling. All three snakes are live bearers, they don't lay eggs. They are quiet creatures that, given the choice, will generally choose a secluded spot away from human activity.

I enjoy the privilege of working closely with these



Heading into the winter months, you are much less likely to catch sight of a snake on the move as they enter into brumation, similar to hibernation in mammals. Brumation allows snakes to conserve energy when temperatures drop and food becomes scarce. During brumation snakes typically seek out a sheltered spot and are likely to be curled up, tucked out of sight and a little on the slow side.

Let's continue to work together to protect and preserve our local wildlife for future generations to enjoy.
