We're excited about what will be uncovered as we delve deeper into material being shared on the <u>South Arm Peninsula History Group Facebook</u> page and sourced from the wider community. There are so many more tales to tell and characters to meet.

There's a lot of work ahead but it will be a fun journey to discover new stories from the past to the present.

SAPRA has been busy behind the scenes - running the Centre, working on our history projects and a lot more:

Raft insurance. The rafts at South Arm and Opossum Bay have been under our public liability for 14 years but the recent renewal did not include them. QBE advised they should have been covered under a marine policy from the start.

Whilst we've been lucky to be covered to date, it's now impossible to find a new policy. We've requested Council's assistance and awaiting a hopefully positive reply. It won't be summer without these much loved rafts on the water.

Solar panels. By the time you read this, there should be sun-loving panels on the Centre's roof, a battery gobbling up the power and a committee excited about directing funds from power bills into other worthwhile activities!

Emergency Recovery Centre. Our community needs to be ready for an emergency and we need to plan now. Council will update the existing Centre Response Plan to include other facilities and we'll review it from a community action perspective.

Offcuts from the Shed

Stevenson Screens Refurbishment

Around the state there are small white louvred boxes, property of the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM). These boxes, called Stevenson Screens, house various weather instruments. The boxes must be identical so as to standardise measurements while allowing air to circulate (via the louvres) around the internal thermometer and protect the instruments from rain and direct sunlight.

Stevenson Screens were first designed by Thomas Stevenson, a Scottish lighthouse designer, and father of Robert Louis Stevenson who wrote *The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde*.

The Men's Shed has been assigned by the BoM to expertly restore and repaint the boxes as part of an ongoing refurbishment program after which they return to duty.







Friends of the Bays

Friends of the Bays is a community group formed after news of a planned expansion of fish farming into northern Storm Bay. Petuna, a company first founded by members of the Rockliff family but now owned by Japanese and NZ companies has approval for a lease in the centre of Storm Bay, and are now seeking approval for another lease near Sloping Main.





Friends of the Bays (FotB) is concerned about adverse effects upon coastal communities and waterways, e.g. recreational fishing, water quality, wildlife, navigation, debris, and coastal views.

This region has many places that are great for seeing the aurora or the Milky Way, especially Goats Bluff. Fish farms are often brightly lit at night and will detract from the whole experience for everyone on the Peninsula who looks forward to our skies lighting up with dancing colours.

If you share our concerns about salmon-farming in Storm Bay, consider becoming a member, or following our Facebook page. We are keen to alert coastal communities, from South Arm right round to White Beach, about the risk this region faces.

South Arm Fire Brigade

Coming out of winter and heading into spring our focus turns to becoming aware of and preparing for the upcoming bushfire season. There are some basic steps that the Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) recommend for us to be Bushfire-Ready.

Complete your bushfire plan - Prepare your property - Keep your family safe Protect what you value this bushfire season - Bushfire, why risk it? Prepare your home - create a defendable space around your home.

- Always check weather forecasts before proceeding with a burn off.
- Register any burn with the TFS at <u>1800 000 699</u> it's easy.
- In October, look for an announcement regarding permits required for burn offs over 1 cubic metre.
- Download the TasALERT (https://alert.tas.gov.au/about-app) to receive emergency alerts and important information from across TFS, TasPol and SES.

Iron Pot Golf Club (IPGC) Update

Over recent months considerable work has been done to secure the future of our golf club and to improve the standard of the course.

Long term tenure secured. A lease with the South Arm RSL and Community Club, (land owner) ensures the course will continue to be operated by Golf Club members for the next 20 years and beyond. The future development, improvements, finances and membership will all continue to be the responsibility of a committee elected by the Iron Pot Golf Club members.



Water. A Memorandum of Understanding with South Arm Irrigation Scheme Pty Ltd has also been signed to connect IPGC to the Class A water being brought across the Derwent to the South Arm Peninsula. This water will significantly transform our golf course and its surrounding landscape, enhancing the attractive coastal location.

Completion of the cross-river pipeline is scheduled in the next few months to be followed by pipework north to Arm End and south to us. Water to our site should arrive by winter 2025 making IPGC and Arm End the only two courses in Tasmania connected to Class A water.

Preparing for water. Our course volunteers have been working with Dan Brown and his Arm End greenkeeping team on improving our greens. This work will continue in coming months, making improvements to our soil, greens and tees, irrigation system, and other areas of the course so we can take swift advantage of the water when it arrives.

Arm End has provided, at no cost, all of the equipment, fertiliser, gypsum, seed etc. Dan has given his time and expertise to oversee and carry out the maintenance program and we extend our hearty thanks to him and his team for their support. Thanks also to our loyal club volunteers who answered calls to help. (See below for a link to more details on the maintenance program.)



Rabbit control. The Club has a 5 year permit for a rabbit control program and has been joined by some adjoining properties for more impact. Stage 1 is now complete and we hope to see a reduction in numbers.

Membership. With a very positive future ahead, it's the perfect time to become an Iron Pot Golf Club member. We expect an influx of new members once the benefits of water become clear and moving forward we'll impose a ceiling on membership. So, join now and beat the rush!

Nature Notes

The elephant in the room garden: garden-escapee weeds!

Weeds! Plants that don't originate here, and which have few predators or diseases to control their spread, have the potential to be highly invasive in our bushland and along beaches on the Peninsula.

Agapanthus (Agapanthus praecox subsp. orientalis), 'Lily of the Nile', is native to Southern Africa. It is often seen in large clumps, lining residential driveways ... but that's not the only place it is appearing. It



is invading forest edges and open forest, tolerating a wide range of conditions from damp to very dry, and sun to semi-shade. Its dense, clumping roots (rhizomes) displace all other vegetation and smother native ground-covers, preventing the regeneration of shrubs and trees, and eliminating habitats for native fauna.

The first 'in the bush' collection (in 1973, on the edge of a suburban Adelaide conservation park) most likely 'escaped' from local gardens. Agapanthus is now emerging as a potential weed threat in parts of NSW, Victoria and WA; in Tasmania it is considered to be worryingly 'naturalising'. The leaves and roots are poisonous and can cause ulceration of the mouth in humans. Agapanthus is also toxic to dogs (particularly puppies), goats and cows; common symptoms of toxicity include mouth ulcers, vomiting and diarrhoea.



The blue, blue/purple or white flowers (November to February) produce leathery fruit containing up to 100 tiny black seeds. The seed is transported by soil movement, wind and waterways. Agapanthus can also spread by underground rhizome, and from the dumping of garden waste in bushland.

Agapanthus is controllable by removing flower heads before seed matures; physically removing the plants,

and not dumping them in bushland; planting sterile/low-fertility varieties, such as *A*. 'Snow Storm' or *A*. 'Black Pantha'; and by planting endemic species, such as 'Blue Flax Lily' (*Dianella* ssp.) or 'Spiny Mat-rush' (*Lomandra longifolia*), instead.
