

The Ocean Awakens at Clifton to celebrate big surf

Becoming a professional surfer and chronicling 20 years of Tasmania's big-wave surfing history wasn't on Marti Paradisis' teenage mind as he moved to Clifton Beach from the northern suburbs.

But, like so many before him, Marti fell into the deep thrall of Clifton's waves and was instantly set on a path to adventure and achievement, with the odd wipeout along the way as part of the journey.

It was packed at Clifton Beach Surf Club on 15 November with surfers of all ages, families and friends creating a visceral community vibe for the launch of **When the Ocean Awakens**.

It's a big book, not just in size but in stories and photos that are combined perfectly by designer Katie Roberts, capturing the drama, adventure and raw energy of big surf on our coastlines

Big-waver surfers, photographers and fishermen relate stories of their relentless pursuit of some of the most remote and treacherous waves on the planet, in a typically authentic Tasmanian style of course.




Offcuts from the Shed




Cremorne Bowls & Community Club

Nature Notes

"Shear" Beauty

Each September Tasmania welcomes around 18 million visitors. It may seem like that at Salamanca market, but there is another visitor, the Short-tailed Shearwater (aka Muttonbird). There are more than 200 colonies around the Tasmanian coast, with Cape Deslacs being a large rookery in our own neighbourhood. Shearwaters are named for their gliding close to the surface of the sea. They derive an aerodynamic benefit from this, which is handy as they have come from places as far away as Alaska.

They nest in burrows, often sharing rookery real estate with Little Penguins and, less comfortably, snakes. Each year, in late November, each breeding pair has a single egg, and share incubation tasks. Chicks hatch in late January.

Harvesting of shearwater chicks for their feathers, flesh and oil is an important part of Aboriginal culture in Tasmania where the birds are also known as yolla or moonbirds. (Harvesting is strictly controlled within a limited season).







By April, shearwater adults are packing their bags for a return to the northern hemisphere. Chicks remain here for 3 weeks or so by which time they have acquired their adult plumage. And then they set off too across the Pacific, several thousand kilometres - an average of 840 km per day. Although numerous our shearwaters face an uncertain future due to climate change, industrial fishing practices, feral cats, and bird flu.

During their time in our waters it is not unusual for them to participate in 'feeding frenzies', often accompanied by other opportunists such as seals and dolphins. It was on such an occasion I was fortunate enough to be in a small boat off Eaglehawk Neck when engulfed by hundreds of foraging birds (bottom photo).
