

VALE Maurice Potter

On 3rd January 2025, Maurice Potter passed away. He was, and remains, a much-loved and respected member of our community – friend to many and a valued contributor to a number of community groups. He leaves a substantial legacy.

Maurice spent most of his life in this place, from birth in 1932 until his move to Queensland to be with family in late 2020. He worked on the local farms and then moved into the building trade which saw many local houses built, repaired and/or renovated by him.

Maurice joined the South Arm RSL Sub-Branch in 1962 and was an active committee member for over 6 years. He was instrumental in the planning and building of the original Club rooms (now the cafe, salon, gym and pharmacy) and its move from Calverton Hall. He collated and published a history of the Sub-Branch and also set up a website. For many years the light and sound for both Anzac Day services were his work.

In 2004 Maurice was awarded a Certificate of Merit by the National President of the RSLA for his services to the Sub-Branch and community.

In 1967, Maurice volunteered with the Fire Brigade, remaining a member for many years, including 1982-86 as Brigade Captain. He spent 10 years on the SAPRA Committee and has been involved with St Barnabas and other groups.

But it is local history that was his passion for which his most visible legacy remains.

Maurice saw many changes over the decades, including the setting up of Fort Direction for WWII where his father went to work. In 1985, he was working at the Fort and was asked to write its history - this was the catalyst for his interest for local history. With the help of fellow historians, he built a significant collection of research material, photos and stories.

What began as an offer to hang some photos in the Community Centre has transformed into a fascinating insight into South Arm's history and characters thanks to Maurice's generous sharing of his collection and recollections, most of which features in the Maurice Potter History Room at the Community Centre, opened in 2019

Our thoughts and hearts go out to the Potter family and Maurice's many friends. A memorial service will be held at St Barnabas in coming months, date to be advised by the family.

Welcome to 2025 - we hope an enjoyable festive season was had by all in the best place to spend summer, or any season really!



We're saddened by the passing of Maurice Potter, a much-loved and respected community member. His legacy lives on through our History Room and in many other organisations he was part of during his long life.

Rafts. SAPRA has not been able to source insurance so the South Arm and Opossum Bay rafts are now grounded - literally. Two brokers have worked hard to find marine insurance but it seems easier to get cover for a jetty or wharf than a pontoon. We have therefore written to Council asking them to take ownership of the South Arm raft and mooring. The Opossum Bay raft is the property of a group of local residents and, at the time of writing, its future was undecided

SAPRA advocacy. In partnership with SA Primary, we'll continue to push for Harmony Lane works to be completed this year. Our committee is very disappointed this project does not seem to have the focus it deserves as the entrance to our local school. Student safety is surely paramount.


Behind the numbers of our 2024 rainfall


South Arm Peninsula Rainfall 2024


The "poor cousin" is South Arm...again!

Nature Notes

Local wildlife rescue services



You hit a native animal, or see an injured animal on the roadside – what can you do?

Don't drive on as it could be rescued, rehabilitated and released.

These steps will increase the chances of successful release:

- Pull over safely, check the animal, then:
 - Call BONORONG WILDLIFE RESCUE: 0447 264 625 (24/7)
 - Or AHVEC Animal Emergency Service: <u>1300 302 912</u>, (24/7)
- 2. Keep handling to an absolute minimum. (Always keep an old towel, thick gloves and cardboard box in your car).
- 3. Gently place a towel over the animal, place it in a warm, well-ventilated box with a lid, and transport it carefully to the nearest rescue centre/vet, or wait for the rescuer to arrive.
- 4. Do not give it food or water (this can do more harm than good).
- 5. Keep it away from people and domestic animals.
- 6. When reporting rescues, confirm the EXACT location where the animal was found (especially echidnas).
- 7. If the animal is deceased, move it a few metres away from the road so other animals feeding on it (such as raptors) aren't hit.
