South Arm Primary School

Launching into Learning

At South Arm Primary School we value every opportunity we have to connect with local families and community members. These relationships can start before children even commence kindergarten and are often made via our fantastic **Launching into Learning (LiL) program** which is so wonderfully coordinated by Jenny Gardner.

LiL is a free program for young children (birth – 4 years old) and their families which can help parents/carers and their children get to know their local school and meet other families. LiL supports children with their development in an atmosphere of fun and creativity and helps children transition into kindergarten.

Whether you live in South Arm or Opossum Bay, or further afield, our LiL program is a fantastic chance to get a feel for the school and, in particular, the kindergarten space which is the entry point for most of our students.

Our 2025 LiL year has started with fantastic engagement from many new and existing families who value the opportunity to connect in our school library and the wonderful kindergarten playground and classroom.

Sessions commence at 9.30am every Friday morning in the school library with dancing, sharing nursery rhymes and singing songs. From there, the group heads towards the kinder space where parents often take the chance to enjoy a few minutes with a hot drink and conversation with other adults.

Children are free to engage in imaginative or active play in the classroom or playground, and can also participate in activities which often include art and craft as part of their LiL experience. The schedule for each term will also include a number of additional afternoon LiL sessions, the next being in our school gym on Friday, April 4 targeting gross motor skill development.

Water Update

Drought aside, the course is holding up well mainly due to the efforts of Craig Knibbs & Graeme Hodgman.

We continue to seek State and Commonwealth government funding to upgrade the course irrigation systems for connection to the South Arm Irrigation Scheme. A Golf Australia consultant is assisting with preparation of funding proposals. The water is over the river and a North-South pipe is to be installed next.

Thank you to the Arm End Golf Course for supplying, at no cost, 1,000 metres of replacement piping for the existing pipe run from the spare water supply tank to the dam.

Rabbit Control

The rabbit population is currently under control thanks to volunteers Dan, Ollie & Jim who have, thus far, relocated 2,000 bunnies with carcasses being donated to the Raptor Refuge.



Firelighting Risk Awareness Program

TasFire has a program designed to help families with children exhibiting fire lighting behaviour known as FireRAP – Firelighting Risk Awareness Program. FireRAP is a free and confidential service delivered in the family home by trained Fire Education Officers using social learning and behavioural principles such as positive reinforcement.
