Whilst seeing and hearing our South Arm Songsters at the market and other events brings joy to an audience's ears and hearts, the impact of our community choir goes much deeper. Jo Dillon's tribute to retiring choir leader Betsy Hanson explains.

I have a pretty ordinary singing voice, finding it challenging to hold a note, but I love singing. Ten years ago, when well-known opera singer, Sharon Prero, put a callout in this newsletter inviting people to become part of a community choir, I was excited!

The choir first gathered at St Barnabas then moved to the Community Centre when the vivacious Betsy Hanson took over as our choir leader almost 8 years ago. I can't claim that after ten years of singing my heart out every week I can individually hold a note, but what we have learnt is that we can indeed sing in harmony with others. To me this revelation seems to be a metaphor for life in general and in particular for life in our South Arm community.

Our choir has all sorts of singers - some spectacularly good voices, some professionally trained, others have sung in bands or are already accomplished musicians, but most of us consider our voices as 'ordinary'. Yes, we've all learned techniques making us better individual singers but the beauty of our community choir is that somehow, under Betsy's mentoring, when this diverse range of voices comes together we actually sound pretty darned good!

Sadly Betsy is leaving our choir. We all pay tribute to her efforts and skill as both teacher and musician. Choir members have spoken of the simple joy that singing with Betsy has brought to their lives; of going home after choir feeling uplifted and positive; of opportunities to shine; of laughter, fun, support during difficult times or bereavement and of inspiration and increased confidence to keep singing. We have lost people, new and forever friendships have been made at choir. The camaraderie also led to the emergence, particularly during Covid, of small bands and singing groups which continue to thrive. The larger group will continue to meet for informal singalongs and social gatherings while we consider the next step.

We thank you Betsy for your easy and effortless teaching style, (we know it wasn't!) for creating an atmosphere where we all felt that we had something to contribute, for your infectious and spontaneous humour, for the fabulous music and most of all for helping us find voice.

Harmony Lane. In late April, Clarence Mayor Brendan Blomeley and Council's Head of Infrastructure & Natural Assets, Ross Graham, met with SA Primary Acting Principal, Jenny Gardner and I at the school. The informative briefing helped us better understand the process and timeline.

- The aim is to make the road safer by improving drainage, footpaths and crossings and looking after significant trees.
- There are complexities but work is underway on concept designs for further consultation with local residents, the school and the community for input and feedback.
- It's anticipated design work will be completed this year with works included in Council's 2026-27 budget to start in the second half of 2026. The school will be consulted on timing.

We hope to have a further update from Council in early July.

The Club will be offering another scholarship in 2026.






Another great season on the green

Peninsula Memories - K's Story

See if you can recognise this well known South Arm resident by her photo! Here is a selection of K's very fond memories.

I now live in the shack constructed by my Dad in 1950. We visited the shack most weekends, driving down on the Friday afternoon after buying fish and chips in Bellerive for tea. The road from the Cremorne turn off was dirt - Dad would wash down the dust with a beer at the old RSL.

Originally the shack had only two rooms. One a bedroom and the second was used as a kitchen with a Warmray wood heater for warmth. As time passed more rooms were added.



When the Cartela sailed in with people on a company annual picnic my sister and I would blend in with the kids to get sweets and ice cream. (Naughty but fun!)

I had a great childhood, grabbing the dinghy to catch Cocky Salmon when we saw them working. We were always home for meals even after walking to Roaring Beach across the rocks or overland catching rabbits or rowing the dinghy when my Dad was setting or pulling in nets. Of course there was plenty of



swimming. I loved sailing my Moth yacht. Dad would have crays hanging on the fence and we often enjoyed fresh flounder for breakfast. I remember Mum putting cold tea on my sunburn.

The family eventually moved to the shack, which meant travelling a long way by bus to finish High School. Many years later after marrying and raising a family I returned to the shack to make it my home.

I am blessed to be living in the same spot my Mum and Dad purchased in the early 1950s. Scenery, community - wow! Unbelievable!"

Voting Salmon Out - 'missed it by that much' (Maxwell Smart)

coastal suburbs too. Howrah, Bellerive, Lindisfarne - here we come.

The last few weeks have been a roller coaster ride for our group. In late April we participated in the 'Vote Salmon Out' rally on the parliamentary lawns. Our accidental president Steve Sanders was one of several speakers and, as we have come to expect, his address was passionate and moving. Successful as the rally was, its aim to vote salmon friendly politicians out of office was not. Nonetheless, around the south east, coastal communities voted in force for independent and green candidates. We now need to spread the word to

Meanwhile, in Storm Bay, concern is developing about what appears to be excessive sea grass growth. Sea grass is generally welcome, but if excessive tends to be followed by epiphytic algal growth. This seems to have occurred in Pipeclay Lagoon, and may have contributed to declining oyster production.

The most likely cause is an increase in nutrients in the water, particularly nitrogen and phosphate. and the biggest source of these nutrients is the fish farms sitting out there off

the east coast of Bruny Island. There are around 48 pens there now - and this is expected to double. Thousands of fish = one helluva lot of fish poo = three times as much nitrogen than what comes from treated sewage from the human population.

Relay for Life - South Arm participation: past, present and pink

This team based fund-raising event for the Cancer Council is held in communities around Australia each year at different times.

South Arm community members have played a part and still do. In the 2000's a group of locals under the team name South Arm Pink-Eyes were regular participants. Our Apr-May 2006 newsletter reports their achievement of raising over \$9000. Two years later in our Mar-Apr 2008 newsletter they pop up again after receiving an Achievement Award for raising a total of over \$24,000 in three years.



Fast forward to 2025. Mary Holten (pink T-shirt) has just clocked up 20 years as a Relay for Lifer. Marv was not a South Arm resident in the Pink-Eyes days but remembers them as one of many sharing this celebration of survivors, remembrance of loved ones and the fight back against cancer...

"In 2004 a staff member at Lauderdale Primary asked for people to participate in a Relay for Life team for the Sorell Lions Club. I had no idea what that entailed except it was a 24 hr relay raising funds for the Tasmanian Cancer Council. I remember when I first started, seeing the South Arm Pink Eyes team in action.





Home fire safety advice for winter



Have you replaced the battery in your smoke alarms?

Fires are fast!





After 30 seconds smoke alarms should have detected the fire and alerted your family.

Without warning, **by the 60 second mark** the fire will have taken hold, be growing quickly and poisonous smoke will start to develop.

By the 3 minute mark the fire will have reached in excess of 800 deg. C, all room contents will be on fire as will other rooms in the house.

In the case of a fire, acting quickly is vital - Fires are FAST
