It was a busy day for the South Arm Peninsula Men's Shed at the end of September when they partnered with the Bee Queens for a day of making.




The Bee Queens is a group of women beekeepers based in the south of Tasmania who wanted to make bee frame wire jigs - and the Men's Shed was more than happy to assist.

The project started weeks in advance with members of the shed making templates in many parts, for the women to assemble.

Every frame in a beehive is wired for stability and strength, especially for when honey is extracted from the frame. The jig makes life a lot easier and guicker for the beekeeper to put frames together.

The event sold out in hours which is encouraging for future collaborations, with plans in the pipeline for at least 2 more workshops on different topics in the coming months.

Thank you to everyone involved, with a special shout out to shed members Wayne (also a Southern Tasmanian Beekeepers Association member) and Fred who were key to making the day so successful, and to all the members who assisted on the day. South Arm RSL and Community Club Update



You may have noticed the Community Club has recently installed a large bank of solar panels - 78 in total which are estimated to produce over 48,000 kWh per year. These will significantly reduce our power bill and our carbon footprint over the next 25 years, allowing the Club to make an ongoing contribution to carbon reduction.

Community Club Scholarship: Each year the Club offers a \$3,000 Scholarship to a student under 21 starting a University, TasTAFE, Skills Institute or similar course to help with costs in their first year of study.

South Arm Primary School

We're racing towards the end of another school year and already well underway with planning for the 2026.

As I mentioned during the recent SAPRA General Meeting, we're projecting a slight reduction in overall student numbers for next year but remain committed to offering a broad range of subjects and opportunities for all our young people. For families further up the South Arm peninsula who might still be considering options for 2026 and beyond, I'd encourage you to get in touch to find out how our close-knit, connected school community might be the right fit for you.

We currently have capacity to accept enrolments in any grade. It's always a pleasure showing new families around or answering questions about our education program and the range of academic and wellbeing supports we offer.

Wellbeing Expo: A highlight of Term 4 has been our annual Wellbeing Expo, co-ordinated by our school health nurse, Bec Lamberton, and supported by a host of other nurses and community organisations. The focus for our expo is always on educating students around various aspects of wellbeing – ranging from nutrition and hygiene through to online safety and featuring positive messages supporting environment, inclusion and participation for all.

Thanks to nurse Bec and her colleagues for providing the education, and to Uniting OSHC, Clarence City Council, Tas Police, Cricklewood Farm, Hill Street Lauderdale, Clarence Plains Child & Family Health Centre and 26TEN for providing a range of activities and information to help make up a fantastic program of learning and fun for students to engage with.

Recent Student Wellbeing & Engagement Survey data indicates that students at South Arm Primary School feel increasingly connected with their school and community and also reports high wellbeing related to their sense of safety at school.

Community Art Exhibition: Thanks to Miss E for her inspiration and direction in the art room this year and for her efforts in taking student work into the public space again this month.

Following on from our Wellbeing Expo, we launched a student art exhibit in the South Arm Community Centre with a great turnout from students, families and community members. This exhibition continues the recent trend of collaboration on matters of art that we've shared with SAPRA and the Community Centre and is a wonderful way to let students enjoy an authentic celebration of their artistic expression and prowess.

Peninsula Memories - Michael's Story

Weekends and holidays at Clifton Beach

When I think back on my childhood, some of my fondest memories are of the time we spent at the family farm 'Neethoba' on the hill above Clifton Beach, belonging to my grandparents Ted and Ethel Watson.

Life on the farm had its own rhythm and we quickly fell into it. We helped in the vegetable paddocks, gathering beans, cabbages and onions, digging potatoes and pulling carrots from the soil. The animals were always part of our days.

While Grandfather kept busy with the farm and animals, Grandmother's world centred on

the farmhouse kitchen, the garden and her community. She always seemed to have something cooking, baking, or preserving. She was also deeply involved in the wider district, an active member of the CWA and the Cremorne Bowls Club. Her energy seemed endless, and somehow, she managed to balance it all while still making time for us.



Summers brought extra work and extra fun. We picked apricots, carefully filling baskets with the ripest fruit to be sold at the Apricot Fair, held each year at the Sandford Hall.

And then there was the fishing. Some days, when the tide and weather were right, we'd join in with the seining. Wading out past the breaking surf, the net stretched wide between us, then slowly, carefully, we would bring it back in toward the shore. Soon, the beach would be dotted with fish flapping in the sand, enough to feed many families.

Other days we would set crayfish pots from a dinghy, not far from the beach. The pots would be lowered carefully, marked by floats, and checked later with great anticipation. Hauling them up to find the glistening shapes of crayfish inside was a thrill and a real treat for the table.

At night, when the conditions were right, we'd go flounder fishing in Pipe Clay Lagoon. A small craft carried a car battery powering a bright light, casting its beam down through

the shallow water. Moving quietly, we'd spot the flounder lying flat against the sandy bottom, its shape suddenly revealed in the glow. Spearing them in the stillness of the night was both exciting and eerie.

Of course, the beach itself was always the great reward. After chores, we'd take the track through the front paddocks down to Clifton. The surf was bracingly cold, but we never minded.

It wasn't just weekends either. During the long school holidays, while our parents worked in their city jobs, we stayed at the farm. Those weeks felt endless and wonderful - whole summers where the farm and beach were our world and a mix of hard work and play, of the steady rhythm of the farm and the wild freedom of the sea.

Looking back, those times shaped my life and gave us a childhood richer than we could ever have realised at the time. I realise how lucky I was to grow up with activities on the farm, the surf below, the lagoon at night, the cray pots bobbing offshore and the love and dedication of two very special grandparents.

Offcuts from the Shed

At the recent SAPRA Annual General Meeting, our President, Ian Glover spoke of the achievements our shed had made over the past year. They have been considerable, and the shed is now on a much stronger footing.

The most obvious change has been the development of our garden with paths, fences, and raised beds in place. Unfortunately the evil empire of couch grass that lives in that neighbourhood has struck back, but our response has been strong and pitiless, and despite this setback some good vegetable yields have been obtained. Some of our fresh produce has found its way onto the menu of the Touch of the Mo.

Less obvious, and incomplete, a storage unit behind the shed has been developed from two containers. Within the shed there is something close to nirvana for the chippies. And wifi, a computer and a smart TV have brought us into the information age.

Over the past year we have run a number of workshops open to the community, and we plan to continue. Expect further opportunities for jewellery-making, joinery, laser-cutting, bee hives and bird boxes. If you have ideas for workshops let us know, perhaps at the market where we are now one of the regulars.

Iron Pot Golf Club News - The water is on its way!

You may have seen the installation of piping for South Arm Irrigation Scheme is underway between Algona St and Arm End and the Iron Pot Golf Course. Here's an update on progress:

- Western shore work is well underway in the construction of the Reticulated Water Treatment Plant (RWTP), installation of the machinery and connection to the Taswater sewerage plant. Commissioning to commence in December.
- 2. The 7km underwater pipeline has been laid from the Western Shore to Algona Street in Half Moon Bay with the water flow successfully tested.
- 3. All directional drilling has been completed.
- 4. All council planning permits approved.
- 5. All private easements with eastern shore landowners are in place for the 7km between the RSL and Arm End.
- 6. The eastern shore pipeline construction has commenced with 3km of pipe having been laid.
- 7. The water supply is expected to be at the Iron Pot Golf Club in February 2026.

The golf club has applied for funding to Tasmanian Active Infrastructure Grants Program 2024-25 to expand the existing dam to allow storage of 12 Megalitres of water. We have also received a permit from the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania for the works. The decision on the above grant has been delayed due to the caretaker period of government but a decision is expected in December.


We will be submitting further funding proposals during 2026 for the irrigation of the whole course.

Our aim next year is to apply for grants for letterbox stickers, gate NHW signs, Cuppa with a Cop (next Lauderdale) and other ways of bringing our community closer and promoting our area as a community focused safe place to live and raise our families. And not forgetting, to make sure that the older community members feel safe and included.

Friends of the Bays update

In an illustration of how connected the world is today, Friends of the Bays received information about salmon farming from people in the Falkland Islands (9217 km away) and in the Faroe Islands (14,834 km away). The Falklands and Faroes are 13500 km apart. The British government seems keen to develop aquaculture in the Falklands, but the locals are opposed. It was suggested to them that salmon farming was well run in the Faroes, a good

example of what can be achieved. So, some of them went there (at their own expense), and found that there were problems, with some fjords so polluted that farms were removed.

We have been in touch with the Faroes too, trying to arrange a translation of a Faroese documentary, *Undir Laksin*. If there are any Faroese speakers out there, please be in touch.

Along with a number of other Tasmanian groups, Friends of the Bays joined the GSFR, Global Salmon Farming Resistance, which is based in Argentina where open net aquaculture is banned. Through them and social media we have also had contact with people in Scotland, Iceland, Ireland, and Nova Scotia. It is fair to say that salmon companies are controversial the world over.
