RSL Sub Branch Nurses Memorial Unveiled



In a moving ceremony on 15 February, the latest addition to the Memorial Park, created to honour and acknowledge the service of all nurses across the Navy, Army and Airforce from WW1 onwards, was unveiled. Four Tasmanian-born nurses are honoured with plaques: Sr Clare Deacon MM (Pipers River, WWI), Sr Maysie Young (Rokeby, WWII), Colonel Nell Espie (Oatlands, Vietnam War) and Wing Commander (Ret'd) Sharon Bown AM (Hobart, Afghanistan).

WC Sharon Bown, the only surviving member of those honoured, addressed attendees on behalf of all Australian Service Nurses, leaving us all with much to think about.

"The stories shared here today... provide us with meaningful insight into the Tasmanian experience of war and the lived experience of these three women, their families, friends, and communities."...

"I am proud to have served in the fine traditions set by them, and I recognise that their contribution not only paved the way for today's Australian service nurses but for all women who now serve at all levels and capabilities of the Australian Defence Force."



... "If we truly wish to honour the legacy of these women and those who serve our nation in peace and in war, may we each pledge to make a difference in the lives of others. May we read the stories of these women honoured here today and carry them with us. May we greet each other with compassion, see each other as humans, and strive to accept or resolve our differences in peace."

Our local Shed has developed into one of the best in the state, not just for the amazing range of equipment but in the ethos, initiatives, special spaces like their garden and BBQ, and its inclusive vibe. It's a great credit to Ian Glover's leadership with his involvement from day one being a key reason it's become what it has. Thank you Ian, and to your team over the journey, for creating such a wonderful community facility.

Join our Peninsula Beekeepers to Fight the Varroa Mite



The BigT (Bee Improvement Group, Tasmania) is a group of beekeepers in Southern Tasmania who have a shared goal of breeding queen bees with some resistance or tolerance to varroa mite, a bee pest that entered Australia via the Port of Newcastle in 2022 and is currently wreaking havoc on mainland Australia, wiping out bee colonies. Tasmania is currently free of this pest, but it will arrive on our shores soon.

The group, led by Project Chair, Ross Gordon (Grumpy Bee Honey and Vice President of the Southern Tasmanian Beekeepers Association) has been working with Dr. Jody Gerdts, of Bee Scientifics in Victoria. Jody has provided the BigT program with drone semen and has artificially inseminated virgin queens to assist us in achieving our goals.

This year, the South Arm Peninsula was identified as geographically isolated enough for the program to control the drone population (essential in managing good bee genetics) and with the help of the South Arm Farm, we have established a queen mating yard. You might have seen more beekeepers than usual getting around town, and this is the reason why!

In January, we put a call out and held a community meeting at Touch of the Mo to meet local beekeepers and to offer these special queens free of charge. Then in February, we started the process with 24 community hives requeened with these new queens.

For this project to succeed, we need to reach as many beekeepers south of Lauderdale as possible. We have free queens for your hives. If you are interested, please reach out to Ross Gordon rossgordon9@gmail.com

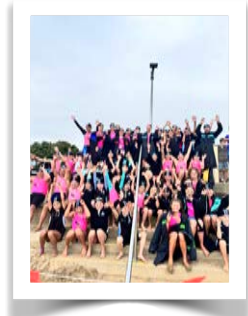

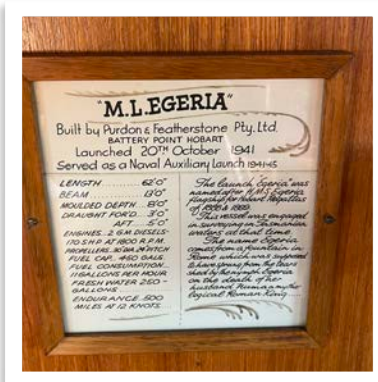

Peninsula Memories - A shackie's summer in the sixties!

Summers at Opossum Bay as a shackie in the sixties were among the most blissful times of my life.

With my three older siblings and our five cousins over the road we moved as a pack to the beach as soon as we were allowed each morning with strict instructions not to go in the water till an adult was present.

Wooden dinghies, wooden chunky paddle boards on which we practiced the art of balancing by stand up paddling (yes, we invented it!), inflatable canoes and hand held fishing lines. Fresh flathead for breakfast, lightly fried in butter, did not cost \$63/kg.

We would lie in a long row tickling each other's backs with feathers and twigs whilst we lay there baking in the hot sun. Skin cancer specialists would have been horrified especially when we added coconut oil. The first intense sunburn was a badge of courage and the subsequent peeling was funmore horror for skin specialists.

On hot days, it was tea on the rocks with more sandwiches. I can't remember that we drank any water at all those days. We hadn't heard of carry around water bottles.

There was no running water in the shack. A basin filled with water for our feet was at the entrance so our feet had a cursory wash, however, as we were in the sea every day that sufficed till we went home a month later. Washing up was done in a basin, NOT the same basin that the feet had been in. We did draw the line on that one.

My cousin and I went across the back paddock swinging the billy can to collect the milk from the farm. Mum's voice could be heard behind instructing us not to swing the can on the way home and lose the milk. We particularly enjoyed visiting Blake Gellibrand at his farm when it was milking time. He let us try our hand and pretended to us that he had a talking tummy. In fact he had his radio in the top part of his overalls but, hey, believing in a 'talking tummy' is way more fun.

Mr Chatterton filled our lolly bags with four and two a penny lollies and made us milkshakes in the days when milk came to the very top of the container. And there were spiders with only two choices - Fanta or Coke.

Time to return to town. Dad headed into the back paddock to deal with the 'doings' of the outside dunny. I imagine there to be a very fertile patch of land out there if it hasn't been built on. We packed up the car to return to town, school and routine, with an ice cream stop at Ralph's Bay. Three flavours to choose from! I wondered if the good life for the year had come to an end.

South Arm Volunteer Fire Brigade

Busier than we need to be: When the TFS declares "Hot Day Response" periods brigades prepare to respond to the needs of adjacent brigades to provide more resources to quickly minimise any spread. Sadly, with neighbouring brigades we have attended to

- Quite a few fires in the Sandford area including a string of fires along the roadsides one night in early Feb from Calvert's Lagoon to Lauderdale, pretty obviously deliberately lit. The fire at Calvert's Lagoon ended up having multiple crews from Rokeby, Lauderdale, Sandford and South Arm attending until well after dawn with multiple PWS crews then patrolling.
- Call outs resulting from land holders lighting fires without being sufficiently prepared and the fire has spread, giving neighbours concerns. **These fires weren't registered with TFS.** This is disappointing as we've had a good period of planned fires being registered and burns successfully done during appropriate calm weather, without incident.

Can I light a fire outside to burn off grass, weeds, stubble, raked leaves, cleared tree branches or other vegetation? If there are no fire bans then what you need to do depends on the size of the fire.



< 1m³

- **Register** the fire.
- **Clear** the area around and above the fire to **3m**.
- The fire must always be **supervised**.
- Ensure the fire is **put out completely** by **soaking** it with water, **stirring** it, and **soaking** it with water after use.



> 1m³

- **Permit required!**
- Must **comply** with the permit conditions.

To register a fire or apply for a permit visit the [myServiceTas Portal](#) or call 1800 000 699. It is easy to register a fire by phone - the TFS call taker will ask if certain precautions and fire extinguishing steps will be undertaken, so this acts as a reminder of the fire lighter's responsibilities.

Registered burns are shown on the **TasAlert** app which helps reduce unnecessary callouts for our brigades and lets us and the wider community know when and where these will be happening.
