Cremorne Bowls & Community Club - Clarence Organisation of the year

Congratulations to the Cremorne Bowls & Community Club (CBCC) for winning this award as recognition of the multifaceted community services it provides to Cremorne, the South Arm Peninsula and wider Eastern Shore.

In 2013 the CBCC included the word 'community' in its name to reflect the vital public and social role it wished to foster and this award not only recognises the last year's work but the continuing growth of the Club over the last decade or more.

The CBCC is also Clarence's only member-owned club, making its community services, driven by a dedicated crew of volunteers, even more outstanding. Sustainable finances, a strong committee backed by a crew of enthusiastic and willing volunteers working countless hours together enabled a combination of sport, social activities, community events and support for local organisations to flourish. The Club has become a place where people can meet friends, make new connections, support local initiatives and feel part of their community.

An increase of membership from 159 to 293 over the last year is a reflection of how a welcoming and inclusive approach can work. Some of the Club's activities include:

Bowls. Premier League side reached finals for the first time in Club history, strong participation in the Women's Div 1 and Barefoot Bowls introducing new faces.

Social activities. Final stop for Halloween festivities, Christmas Market and Cremorne Christmas Party, Friday night food trucks.

Supporting local. Coastcare advocates, fundraising for junior surfers to attend the Nationals, offering young people employment and training and supporting local brews.

This award is testament to the volunteers, the quiet achievers (perhaps not so much when they win the bowls comps!) who show, through their dedication and actions, what it means to have *community* in Cremorne and the wider peninsula.

Help us help you

Bunnies Begone - "We thought it would never be possible."



So said the property owners alongside the Iron Pot Golf Course (IPGC) when 190+ acres from South Arm Neck was deemed a Zero Density Rabbit Area.

In October 2024, two local hunters, concerned about environmental damage, initiated the South Arm Rabbit Project, aiming to provide a critical buffer zone for future community, state or federal projects towards a Rabbit Free South Arm Peninsula.

They successfully cleared the IPGC a number of times but the bunnies from neighbouring properties had other ideas. The neighbours then granted land access and the area from the Parks Reserve boundary on the Neck to the western boundary of the IPGC is now Zero Density and being maintained.

Further land-owner support expanded the control area to 600+ acres, from the initial area across to the Fort Direction boundary.

Over 3,700 rabbits have been removed to date, with the project's success and methodology shared with Government agencies at all levels. With this control replacing baiting from the start, large quantities of frozen rabbits have been provided to Raptor Refuge to feed their rehabilitating raptors. (raptorrefuge.com.au)

The entire project has been voluntary, self-funded for two years and using their own modern, high-end equipment.

Donations are now being sought to help keep the project progressing by adding a thermal drone to the arsenal – more details here www.gofundme.com/f/south-arm-rabbit-project-fwpvt

Fort Direction. Local invasive species expert, Simon Pahor, has begun working with Defence, in three nights removing 358 rabbits. Due to prohibited access areas, suppression/control work is the priority, rather than complete removal.

SEEKING FACILITATOR to increase the impact of this project. This role will be supported by the existing control team (includes a local invasive species expert and the Centre for Invasive Species Solutions) plus a local peer group and SAPRA.

Main tasks include:

- Working with agencies at all levels of government and other relevant organisations - contacts already in place and offering strong support, and
- Community engagement. For more details on this role, contact Kerry in the first instance.

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Handfish Conservation Project You can help



There are only around 200 Red Handfish living in the wild, confined to a small rocky reef area near Dodges Ferry, and nowhere else. In the course of evolution this small fish no longer swims - it has no swim-bladders - it walks, and occasionally jumps, instead. And, uncommon for fish, it looks after its eggs until hatched.

Loss of habitat is a factor in a population decline, and excess numbers of sea urchins is one cause of this. Sea urchins are grazers, eating weed, kelp and sea grass, sometimes forming underwater deserts called 'barrens'. They are the rabbits of the sea. This increase in urchin numbers probably has many causes including reduced crayfish numbers (they eat urchins), warming water temperatures (climate change), and increased nutrient levels (agriculture runoff, septic tank effluent, and salmon aquaculture).

A dedicated group of scientists at IMAS (Institute for Marine and Antarctic Studies) have established a captive breeding program, and have been restoring habitat, including sea grass. **But local communities can help too - taking care with what goes into the sea, fixing up the old septic, giving crayfish living off Dodges Ferry a pardon, taking salmon off the menu.**

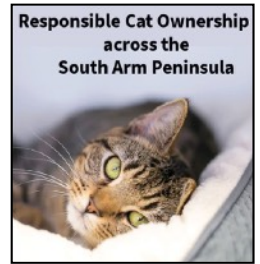
Cat Management Program Update

The first two weeks of the three week **Sandford Cat Management Group** trapping program have now been completed; with three cats safely trapped and transferred to Ten Lives for assessment and appropriate care. One cat was trapped during the first week, followed by two cats in the second week.

While these numbers are relatively low, we are also noticing fewer cats being detected on our camera traps. We are hopeful this is a positive sign that community members are engaging with the program and supporting responsible cat ownership by keeping their cats safely indoors, particularly at night.

This is a fantastic outcome for both cats and wildlife. Keeping cats contained helps protect them from injury, illness and other risks including Bird Flu, while also reducing their impact on native wildlife.

Once this trapping program is over, we plan to continue to engage with our community to promote responsible cat ownership across the South Arm Peninsula. *Working towards a safer environment for our people, pets and our precious wildlife.*



Bird Flu - looking out for birds, animals, pets - and us

We knew this was coming but it still hits like a rock when it does, especially when you live on a peninsula like ours, surrounded by coastline and home to so many birds and native animals. But, here we are.

The Department of Natural Resources and Environment has plenty of information (see link below) but in a nutshell:

- **AVOID** contact with sick or dead birds or other wildlife.
- **RECORD** the location and if safe, take photos.
- **REPORT** immediately to the **Emergency Animal Disease Hotline** on **1800 675 888** (Put this number in your phone NOW) or make an online report.
- **DO NOT TOUCH** sick or dead birds or other animals.
- **For pet owners:**
 - **Cats appear to be more susceptible to bird flu than dogs.** Keeping cats inside or confined to an outdoor enclosure reduces the risk.
 - **Keep your dog on a lead when walking**, especially where birds gather. Don't let your dog go near sick or dead birds or other wildlife.

And importantly for us humans... This situation may distress many of us so please reach out for help. Tasmanian Lifeline number is **1800 98 44 34** and Beyond Blue **1300 22 4636**.

BECOMING CLARENCE
In the early 1800s the Hobart settlement was expanding along the River Derwent. The arrival of over 500 Norfolk Island former convicts, free settlers and their families then further increased the population significantly.
The colony clearly had to become self-supporting.
Land grants and farm allocations in Clarence extended from Richmond to Seven Mile Beach and from Kangaroo Point (Bellevue) to Cambridge, Rokey and the South Arm Peninsula.
Our Peninsula soon began playing a major role in providing food and export opportunities for the colony.

A GROWING REGION
Farming was challenging with variable weather and unfamiliar conditions but persistence and hard work gradually brought stability and prosperity. By 1810, a small settlement was established at Ralphs Bay and by 1814 wheat was being grown at Muddy Plains (now Sandford).
From 1820-1860, the scattered farmland evolved with more intensive farms, an increased population, two towns (Bellevue and Richmond) and some industries.
The population grew from 245 to 1612 and establishments (farms, blocks of land, houses, inns etc) went from 82 to 266.

TWO PATHS TO THE PENINSULA
the GELLIBRAND influence
William Gellibrand's land extended from Arm End to the end of South Arm Neck, later expanding to Collins Springs (near Calveys Legion).
He farmed the 'rich alluvial soil' producing fruit, vegetables and running stock, proving the area's fertility.
Ten convicts were assigned to him, and he gained a reputation as a caring master, supporting many to settle locally. They farmed, had families and made their own contribution, their names carried on through their descendants and place names.
Christopher and Hannah Calvert (nee Watson) leased Seacroft from George Gellibrand in 1851, buying it outright in 1856. The Calvert family then built a legacy, connecting through marriages into other local families - the Morrisseys, Airmen and Potters to name a few.

the NORFOLK ISLAND influence
Many of the 500+ islanders arriving in the early 1800s had farming experience and transferred their holdings to Van Diemen's Land.
19 received land grants in Clarence Plains and Muddy Plains (Sandford) and the area's agricultural potential and crucial role in the colony's food supply were soon clear.
James Morrissey and his wife Ann, farmed their land grant at Belmont Lawn at Clarence Plains (Rokeby).
James' son, John, owned 'Rose Hill' in Sandford and James' grandson, John Robert (J.R.), bought 'Waterloo' in Cremorne in 1898, successfully growing crops and fruit trees, and one of the first to export apples to London.
Two of J.R.'s sons shared 'Waterloo' and his eldest owned an adjoining property. A surname embedded in local history.

Storm Bay - Magnetic Anomalies?

With the 200th anniversary of the wreck of the Hope on South Arm's Hope Beach it is worth a brief mention of the cause.

Although the court of enquiry assigned the cause to a visual mistake a possible alternate explanation may be of interest to those more technically minded.

Magnetic anomalies affecting compass bearings were reported by early explorers, including Matthew Flinders particularly in relation to the approach to the mouth of the Derwent.

Could a reliance on map compass bearings without visual clues in poor weather or at night have been an invisible navigation threat?

For those of you with a technical maritime bent, look up a paper by David Leaman entitled "Magnetic Rocks - Their Effect on Compass Use and Navigation In Tasmania".
